2. Commander's Assessment:

CARNEY began 2002 completing another Holiday Upkeep period. The first underway period of the year for CARNEY and her Sailors was Joint Task Force Exercise, Phase One. This event was conducted at the Cherry Point Operating Area.

After Phase One of Joint Task Force Exercise, CARNEY enjoyed a brief period in port. After the upkeep period, Joint Task Force Exercise Phase Two began, and would have CARNEY underway from February 12 to March 4, 2002. During this time period CARNEY participated in a visit to Surface Warfare Officer School in Newport as well as an Ammunitions Onload in Yorktown in preparation for the upcoming deployment.

Upon CARNEY's return to home port, the ship entered an availability period and prepared the crew for the upcoming deployment. After two separate Pre-Overseas Movement period of a month respectively, USS Carney set sail to cross the Atlantic on the way to the Mediterranean and Gulf for Deployment.

After transiting both the Atlantic and Mediterranean, CARNEY was able to have two port calls in the month of May. Sailors were able to enjoy time in both Valletta and Aksackaraagac. After leaving the later port, CARNEY prepared to transit the Suez Canal en route to the Gulf.

While en route to the Gulf, CARNEY was able to make another stop and pass interesting places. CARNEY sailed through the Red Sea, the Arabian Sea, The Straits of Hormuz, and finally had a port call in Bahrain in the middle of June. The half way point of the deployment was in July when CARNEY was in the Arabian Sea.

As CARNEY made her way back towards the Atlantic Ocean for the return to homeport, two additional stops were made. The crew was able to visit La Spezia and Souda Bay. In addition to being on the way home, CDR Boxall joined the crew as the new Commanding Officer, replacing CDR Jacobsen. The trans-Atlantic journey back to Mayport began October 24th.

CARNEY returned to Mayport after a successful deployment on October 31st. There were no underway periods the rest of the year as the crew and ship entered an availability period and also had some time to take leave.
