#### 2. Commander's Assessment

USS CARNEY's seven months of underway operations in CY16 saw the ship operate for more than a month off the coast of Syria, two months in support Operation ODYSSEY LIGHTNING (OOL), and a week in the Black Sea. While operating in vicinity of Syria, the ship operated in close proximity to Russian naval units on a consistent basis with skill and professionalism.

During August and September, CARNEY was attached to the tactical control of COMPHIBRON SIX and the WASPARG in support of Operation ODYSSEY LIGHTNING. During this mission, CARNEY hosted aviation, sniper, intelligence, and communications elements from 22 MEU, and CARNEY's Naval Surface Fire Support (NSFS) team fired 285 Mk 91 illumination rounds over Sirte, Libya, in 28 separate actions, acting in direct support of combat operations conducted ashore by 22 Marine Expeditionary Unit, TF-111, and Libyan Forces of the Government of National Accord (GNA). During these fire missions, CARNEY disrupted ISIL-Libya's ability to re-supply and maneuver at night, while at the same time gathering important intelligence used to further the fight. Admiral Howard, Commander U.S. Naval Forces Europe/Africa said of CARNEY's work "The ground-breaking innovations in Amphibious Operations were crucial to the unparalled success of the ARG/MEU team and enabled the defeat of ISIL-L in Sirte, Libya."

Throughout the year, CARNEY directly supported Sixth Fleet lines of operation and strategic communications objectives. In February, CARNEY hosted the Israeli Defense Minister onboard in a joint visit with the U.S. Ambassador to Israel in order to demonstrate the ship's BMD capabilities and strengthen US national policy objectives. CARNEY also conducted focused collection operations off both Syria and the Crimean Peninsula and operated with NATO and international partners during SMARTEX 16-2 with the Spanish Navy, a WASEX with the Bulgarian Navy, Coordinated Collection Operations (CCO) with the Romanian Navy in the Black Sea, and Mavi Balina 2016, a Turkish led exercise comprised of 17 ships from seven nations.

In 2016, CARNEY completed 27 fleet level ballistic missile defense scenarios with an average score of 94% and participated in three RELENTLESS ARCHER exercises. CARNEY also completed 53 C6F/C5F TLAM scenarios with an average score of 96%.

CARNEY maintained a high level of material readiness throughout 2016. The ship's maintenance team executed a complex SRA, receiving major upgrades to the combat systems suite, including the installation of SLQ-32(V)6 and SeaRAM. Additionally, during Engineering Light-Off Assessment, the ship scored a 97% with all programs assessed as "Ready to Support Light Off." CARNEY's continued success throughout the year was directly attributable to the high level of self-sufficiency demonstrated by the crew correcting depot and IMA-level repairs to one of two Ship's Control Units, the sea water service system, high pressure air compressors, fuel oil service and storage systems, and the vacuum CHT system.

During CARNEY's post-SRA Combat System Ship Qualification Testing, CARNEY and NSMWDC tested and proved redefined integrated hard kill / soft kill tactics against advanced anti-ship cruise missile threats during a live-fire quick reaction assessment utilizing both SLQ-32(V)6 and the SeaRAM weapon system. Throughout 2016, CARNEY has qualitatively and quantitatively demonstrated that she excels in all phases of a ship's lifecycle.

3. CARNEY has performed superbly throughout 2016. The ship excelled through the course of two Sixth Fleet Ballistic Missile Defense patrols and a highly successful CNO Selected Restricted Availability (SRA). Despite the demands of two patrols, the crew executed Forward Deployed Naval Force Europe (FDNF-E) missions while maintaining all qualifications and certifying MOB-N 1.4, FSOM 1.4, and MOB-D 1.4B.

4. CARNEY's seven months of underway operations in CY16 saw the ship operate for more than a month off the coast of Syria, two months in support Operation ODYSSEY LIGHTNING (OOL), and a week in the Black Sea. While operating in vicinity of Syria, the ship operated in close proximity to Russian naval units on a consistent basis with skill and professionalism. During August and September, CARNEY was attached to the tactical control of COMPHIBRON SIX and the WASPARG in support of Operation ODYSSEY LIGHTNING. During this mission, CARNEY hosted aviation, sniper, intelligence, and communications elements from 22 MEU, and CARNEY's Naval Surface Fire Support team fired 285 Mk 91 illumination rounds over Sirte, Libya, in 28 separate actions, acting in direct support of combat operations conducted ashore by 22 Marine Expeditionary Unit, TF-111, and Libyan Forces of the Government of National Accord. During these fire missions, CARNEY disrupted ISIL-Libya's ability to resupply and maneuver at night, while at the same time gathering important intelligence used to further the fight. Admiral Howard, Commander U.S. Naval Forces Europe/Africa said of CARNEY's work "The ground-breaking innovations in Amphibious Operations were crucial to the unparalled success of the ARG/MEU team and enabled the defeat of ISIL-L in Sirte, Libya."

5. Throughout the year, CARNEY directly supported Sixth Fleet lines of operation and strategic communications objectives. In February, CARNEY hosted the Israeli Defense Minister onboard in a joint visit with the U.S. Ambassador to Israel in order to demonstrate the ship's BMD capabilities and strengthen US national policy objectives. CARNEY also conducted focused collection operations off both Syria and Crimean Peninsula and operated with NATO and international partners during SMARTEX 16-2 with the Spanish Navy, WASEX with the Bulgarian Navy and Coordinated Collection Operations with the Romanian Navy in the Black Sea, and Mavi Balina 2016, a Turkish led exercise comprised of 17 ships from seven nations.

6. In 2016, CARNEY completed 27 fleet level ballistic missile defense scenarios with an average score of 94% and participated in three RELENTLESS ARCHER exercises. CARNEY also completed 53 C6F/C5F TLAM scenarios with an average score of 96%.

7. CARNEY maintained a high level of material readiness throughout 2016. The ship's maintenance team executed a complex SRA, receiving major upgrades to the combat systems suite, including SLQ-32(V)6 and SeaRAM. Additionally, during Engineering Light-Off Assessment, the ship scored a 97% with all programs assessed as "Ready to Support Light Off." CARNEY's continued success throughout the year was directly attributable to the high level of self-sufficiency demonstrated by the crew correcting depot and IMA-level repairs to one of two Ship's Control Units, the sea water service system, high pressure air compressors, fuel oil service and storage systems, and vacuum CHT.

8. During CARNEY's post-SRA Combat System Ship Qualification Testing, CARNEY and NSMWDC tested and proved redefined integrated hard kill / soft kill tactics against advanced anti-ship cruise missile threats during a live-fire quick reaction assessment utilizing both SLQ-32(V)6 and the SeaRAM weapon system.

9. Throughout 2016, CARNEY has qualitatively and quantitatively demonstrated that she excels in all phases of a ship's lifecycle. She is truly deserving of the 2016 Battle Effectiveness Award.

Carney, an Arleigh Burke-class

guided-missile destroyer, forward deployed to Rota, Spain, is conducting a CNO's maintenance Availability as part of support of U.S. national security interests in Europe.

#### USS CARNEY Receives New SeaRam Weapon System

While the days of Theodore Roosevelt and the Great White Fleet may be over 100 years in the past, the former President's famous phrase "Speak softly and carry a big stick" still describes U.S. naval capabilities. Naval vessels continue to embody a flexible option for the President, Combatant Commander, and Fleet Commander to employ – able to rapidly flex from missions in support of U.S. diplomatic engagement, through missions of maritime security and theater security, all the way to combat operations.



The four U.S. Navy guided-missile destroyers (DDGs) based out of Rota, Spain, are perfect examples of this flexible and lethal combination, and they embody the concept of "distributed lethality" within the U.S. surface fleet. During the USS CARNEY's (DDG 64) first Forward Deployed Naval Forces Patrol (November 2015 – March 2016), she demonstrated success across the spectrum of naval operations, operating for weeks off the Syrian coast and the

Eastern Mediterranean, conducting joint operations with warships from several NATO nations, and supporting U.S. diplomacy in Israel.

But the march of technology continues, and so the Department of the Navy continues to upgrade the capabilities of forward deployed naval vessels in order to provide them with the most modern, technologically lethal, and advanced weapons systems.



With the installation of SeaRam, the CARNEY becomes the second of four destroyers based in Rota to be equipped with this new weapon. FC2 Steven Litalien stated, "It is very exciting to be one of the first DDGs to be outfitted with SeaRam. From a technician's point of view, it is a rare opportunity to be one of the first ships to maintain and help tweak such a recently developed system and to add our input for future ships and future FCs. It is an experience that all of us are looking forward to."

SeaRam combines the abilities of two existing naval systems: the superior accuracy, improved maneuverability, and increased range of the Rolling Airframe Missile (RAM) with the high resolution search-and-track radar and dependable quick-response ability of the Phalanx Close-In-Weapon-System (CIWS).

Another advantage of this particular upgrade is it's relatively low cost. Because SeaRam utilizes the same above-deck system and power source as CIWS, minimal ship alterations were required to install the system onboard CARNEY. The CARNEY, like the USS PORTER (DDG 78) before it, smoothly and cost effectively exchanged its aft CIWS mount for a new SeaRam mount.



Both the CARNEY's Commanding Officer, Commander Kenneth Pickard, and his crew are looking forward to operating with this new addition to CARNEY's weapons systems. "We are very excited about the increased lethality and capability that SEARAM provides. It allows us another layer of defense, increasing our already robust combat capability. Having this advanced weapon system allows CARNEY increased freedom to maneuver within the 6th Fleet AOR," said Commander Pickard.

As the Navy continues to increase war-fighting capability in a fiscally responsible way, CARNEY sailors can continue to take pride in the fact that they still "carry a big stick." Roosevelt would be proud!

#### USS CARNEY Conducts Successful Live Fire of New SeaRam Weapon System

In a constantly evolving and complex environment, the U.S. Navy is unwavering in its commitment to defend freedom and democracy around the world. The Chief of Naval Operations Admiral John Richardson is determined to achieve this through his three tenets: Warfighting First, Operate Forward, and Be Ready. As the second forward deployed destroyer in Rota, Spain, to receive a new SeaRam weapon system, the USS Carney is equipped to uphold the CNO's philosophy.



After a 109 day Chief of Naval Operations Availability in which she received a new SeaRam system, the USS Carney was ready to show first-hand how the US Navy intends to remain the world's premiere global fleet – through constant innovation and development of new systems. SeaRam, one such system, is a highly capable anti-ship missile defense system that is a hybrid of the Phalanx Close-In-Weapon-System (CIWS) and the Rolling Airframe Missile

(RAM). This new capability will allow the USS Carney to defend herself and others against the most complex missile threats existing in today's ever changing landscape.

The tactical capabilities of SeaRam were confirmed recently during a live fire exercise off the Southwest coast of Spain using a BQM-74 drone. The new weapon system located the incoming drone, launched against it, and destroyed the target with ease. As the USS Carney starts her second Sixth Fleet patrol, the United States and her NATO allies can be confident in her abilities to successfully carry out missions against any and all threats.

#### **CARNEY SCORES ANOTHER ENERGY CONSERVATION VICTORY**

(Rota, Spain) – Energy is a vital part of the world we live in. From everyday life to politics and economics, energy and the manner in which it is used affects us all. The United States Navy realizes the importance of energy and has dedicated itself to energy conservation efforts even as the Navy continues to maintain the safety and security of our shores and the support of our allies around the world. Among the most prestigious of the awards presented in recognition of the Navy's energy conservation goals is the Secretary of the Navy Energy Conservation Award. This award is given out based on criteria such as total energy saved, energy conservation training, and innovation in the use of energy.

Winner of the SECNAV Energy Conservation award in 2014, the USS Carney is once again among the top energy conservation ships in the first quarter of fiscal year 2016. Ranking third among all Atlantic Fleet ships in fuel efficiency, Carney has proven that her dedication to energy conservation is a lasting tradition.

While forward deployed for the entire first quarter of fiscal year 2016, the Carney embraced a conservation strategy that allowed her to surpass her peers in energy efficiency. The engineering department consistently created optimal plant alignments in every operating condition, and their dedication to thorough and meticulous maintenance allowed Carney to steam with incredible energy efficiency. Lieutenant Junior Grade Juan Cora, Carney's Main Propulsion Assistant, credits his junior sailors with Carney's success, saying, "Engineering department holds energy conservation to be an integral part of day to day operations. We operate in an environment where fiscal and environmental responsibility is always a top priority. From the deck plates, where our junior sailors are consistently coming up with innovative ideas

of how to conserve energy, to senior leadership allowing us to exercise these ideas, we continue to push the boundaries on how to save and conserve energy. Our engineering leadership enjoys empowering our junior sailors because they are the future of our Navy!"

While having an efficient plant is vital to overall energy usage, it is not the only thing necessary for a ship striving to conserve energy. Onboard Carney, the whole crew is involved in conservation. From the second a sailor steps on the ship, they are taught to conserve energy through simple strategies such as maintaining pressure and air conditioning boundaries through the proper use of air-locks, limiting use of water, and securing lighting in spaces when not in use. These practices may seem simple, but it is this thought process that leads to a greater overall efficiency onboard.

Along with established fuel efficiency strategies, Carney sailors are always on the lookout for new energy innovations to enhance energy usage. One example of this included the creation of a fuel tracking spreadsheet. Based off of established fuel consumption curve charts, these spreadsheets were created by oil lab personnel to fine tune recommendations by junior personnel to the Engineering Officer of the Watch and Officer of the Deck for optimal steaming efficiency. Another example of innovation includes the Navy-wide adoption of longer lasting LED lights around the ship to reduce future costs. Carney has instituted a phased replacement plan to replace all fluorescent lights with these energy efficient and environmentally friendly lights.

In the middle of it first Forward Deployed Naval Forces – Europe patrol, Carney has scored another energy conservation victory, demonstrating a fuel efficient attitude, and proving by her performance a commitment to energy conservation while staying at the forefront of the Navy's energy conservation goals.



#### Commander Ken S. Pickard, United States Navy Commanding Officer (May 2015 – Nov 2016) USS Carney

CDR Ken Pickard is a native of Pensacola, Florida. He enlisted in the Navy in September 1989 and was commissioned in May 1998 through the Seaman to Admiral program. He graduated from Jacksonville University in 2005 with Bachelor of Science degrees in Accounting, Finance and Management and a Masters in Business Administration.





















## **Submission Instructions**

Submit only one full version of the Report. NHHC does not need both electronic and hardcopy versions. Clearly label all submissions with the classification and any applicable caveats. Submit this report at the highest classification level necessary to completely describe your command's activities during the calendar year.

## **Unclassified CORs**

The preferred submission method for UNCLASSIFIED (UNCLAS) material is via email and AMRDEC to NHHC\_COR@navy.mil. Any UNCLAS attachments too large for transmission via one e-mail may be sent through AMRDEC (https://safe.amrdec.army.mil/safe/) or mailed on CD. Use the following format for Report file names: "Ship\_Name\_Year\_COR", like Navy\_Operational\_Support\_Center\_Tulsa\_2015\_COR.

After the commander writes the Commander's Assessment, they can either send the email themselves or be CCed on the submission email; this will count for their sign off. There is no need to print a born digital version, sign it, scan it, and then email it. The commander can also digitally sign the COR with PDF software.

If submitting via email, put the command name and UIC in the subject line. If submitting via AMRDEC, include the command name and UIC in the "Description of File(s)" section.

Prior to submitting via CD, review the CD(s). Check that all attachments are functional, uncorrupted, and NOT password protected. Clearly label the CD with the command name, UIC, and an UNCLAS label.

Do not forward CORs via US mail. All USPS mail addressed to NHHC is irradiated, which results in destruction of discs and damage to paper enclosures. Use a commercial mailer, like FedEx or UPS.

## **Classified CORs**

The preferred submission method for CLASSIFIED (CLAS) material that is CONFIDENTIAL or SECRET is via email to NHHC\_COR@navy.smil.mil. Submissions too large for one email may be sent in multiple emails or mailed on a CD. Use the following format for Report file names: "Ship Name Year COR", like Navy Operational Support Center Tulsa 2015 COR.

After the commander writes the Commander's Assessment, they can either send the email themselves or be CCed on the submission email; this will count as their sign off. There is no need to print a born digital version, sign it, scan it, and then email it. Per command preference, the commander can also digitally sign the COR with PDF software.

If submitting via email, put the command name and UIC in the subject line. Prior to submitting via CD, review the CD(s). Check that all attachments are functional, uncorrupted, and NOT password protected. Clearly label the CD with the command name, UIC, and the appropriate CLAS label.

Do not forward CORs via US mail. All USPS mail addressed to NHHC is irradiated, which results in destruction of discs and damage to paper enclosures. Use a commercial mailer, like FedEx or UPS. Ensure all classified packages are properly labelled and double wrapped.
