
- 1. As per reference (a), the annual command history for USS CARTER HALL (LSD 50) for calendar year 1997 is hereby forwarded.
- a. <u>Command Mission</u>. The mission of CARTER HALL is to transport and launch amphibious craft and vehicles with their crews and embarked personnel in an amphibious assault, to act as Primary Control Ship during amphibious assaults and render limited docking and repair service to small ships and craft.

### b. Command composition and organization.

- (1) CARTER HALL is homeported in Little Creek, Virginia and is assigned to Amphibious Group Two, commanded by RADM Gordon S. Holder, U.S. Navy.
- (2) The ship's crew consists of 22 officers and 300 enlisted personnel. The ship's organization is outlined in enclosure (1).
- c. <u>Chronology</u>. Enclosure (2) is a chronology of the events and milestones reached during 1997.
- d. <u>Narrative</u>. Enclosure (3) is a historical narrative of significant events in 1997.

## USS CARTER HALL (LSD 50) Historical Narrative for 1997

USS CARTER HALL (LSD 50) began her second full year since commissioning making preparations for her maiden deployment to the Mediterranean in April. Several pre-deployment exercises had to be completed before becoming a deploying member of the ARG, or Amphibious Ready Group, with the USS Kearsarge and the USS Ponce.

The first exercise was COMPTUEX. It was conducted from February 4-13 with the JFK Battlegroup in Onslow Bay, North Carolina. It was the second exercise with embarked members of the Marine Support Service Group 22 and Battalion Landing Team 1/2. On February 8, an alongside replenishment was conducted with the USS VICKSBURG, Carter Hall's first dry hook-up. COMPTUEX culminated in the first full scale amphibious assault of 1997 on February 12. At the conclusion of the exercise, CARTER HALL debarked the Marines in Morehead City, NC, and returned to Little Creek, VA. She later conducted an ammunition onload on February 19.

On March 9, CARTER HALL (LSD 50) returned to Morehead City and embarked the Marines and their vehicles and equipment for JTFEX/SOCEX, which was conducted from March 11-22 in Onslow Bay, NC. On March 18, COMPHIBGRU2, RADM Wirt Fladd toured the ship, speaking to various crewmembers along his tour route. The second major amphibious assault of 1997 occurred on March 21, near New River Inlet, NC. At the conclusion of the exercise, CARTER HALL moored pierside in Morehead City on March 22 to offload remaining Marines and their gear. Enroute from Morehead City to Little Creek the following day, the ship completed a successful alongside replenishment with USS ARCTIC. CARTER HALL moored at Little Creek on March 24.

In April, the ship entered a Pre-Overseas Movement period to make the final preparations for her maiden six month Mediterranean deployment. While the crew rotated through four different leave periods, the ship was painted and stocked with necessary supplies for the deployment. On April 23, CARTER HALL got underway and headed to the VACAPES OPAREA for one day of sea trials and general operational checks.

Finally, on April 29, families and friends lined the quay wall as CARTER HALL departed Little Creek NAB to begin her deployment. She first traveled to Morehead City before heading across the Atlantic Ocean in order to onload the Marines and their equipment and vehicles. At this time, MSSG 22 and BLT 1/2 became permanently embarked members of the crew. These were the same Marines with which CARTER HALL had performed all of her work-ups. Just offshore of Morehead City, in Onslow Bay, the ship onloaded a full complement of 15 Amphibious Assault Vehicles (AAV's) and four M1A1 Tanks.

The month of May began as the USS CARTER HALL (LSD 50) turned her bow east for the Mediterranean Sea. After a 12 day transit, she arrived in Rota, Spain, on May 12, one day after her at-sea turnover.

On May 13, the ship embarked 142 members of the Spanish Marine Corps as part of Exercise Linked Seas. Linked Seas brought together a multinational Maritime Force consisting of NATO representatives from Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain, Turkey and the United Kingdom. On May 14, the ship got underway from Rota with the embarked Spanish Marines. The ship took her place in formation and proceeded south to Ensenada de Zahara, or Bay of Zahara, located near the Straits of Gibraltar.

During Linked Seas, CARTER HALL conducted both flight operations and wet well operations. The exercise provided the officers and crew with valuable training in both amphibious assault operations and Non-Combatant Evacuation Operations (NEO). CARTER HALL served as primary control ship for the NEO on the evening of May 16, processing 79 Spanish Marines for evacuation. Onboard, they were given food and shelter overnight before departing the ship the following afternoon via CH-46 helicopters. LINKED SEAS 97 was deemed a safe and successful exercise. It strengthened ties between the allied Navies involved as well. Thus far, it was the largest and most complex logistical exercise in CARTER HALL's history.

On May 19, CARTER HALL weighed anchor and departed the Bay of Zahara. She traveled northward to the Tagus River, which runs through Lisbon, the capital of Portugal. For the next 6 days, CARTER HALL's Sailors and Marines

rode the 50 meter utility boat from the ship to the Fleet Landing Area of Lisbon, enjoying what the exciting city had to offer. Lisbon was the first of many ports at which liberty boats were run to and from the ship while anchored.

On May 24, a Change of Command ceremony in Lisbon, Portugal, marked a page in CARTER HALL 's history as her first Commanding Officer, CDR Rand D. LeBouvier, turned over command of the ship he commissioned. With the crew mustered in the Vehicle Turning Area, both Commanders read their orders aloud and CDR Stanley V. DeGeus assumed command of CARTER HALL.

On May 26, CARTER HALL left Lisbon enroute to Almeria, Spain. She transited the Straits of Gibraltar for the first time on May 27 and entered the Mediterranean Sea.

Almeria, Spain, was the backdrop for Exercise BETACOM and a pierside availability with the USS Simon Lake (AS 33). Before pulling into port on May 28, Carter Hall offloaded the LCU, AAV's, tanks, and trucks onto the beach. The Marines needed each piece of gear for their ten days of crosstraining with the Spanish Marines. In Almeria, the days were spent maintaining and preserving the ship while nights were spent at clubs and restaurants. May 28 also marked the arrival of the first of three groups of midshipmen that would spend their summer cruises onboard.

The morning of June 6, CARTER HALL left Almeria. Friends made during the week could be seen scattered on the pier waving good-bye. As hard as it was to leave, another exercise awaited CARTER HALL in Volos, Greece.

After spending a few days transiting the Mediterranean, CARTER HALL arrived in Volos Bay, Greece, on June 13 for the planning stage of Exercise Alexander the Great. The crew was treated to two nights of liberty in Volos before being immersed in amphibious operations. The amphibious assault itself took place in Skyros Bay, Greece. Consisting of more than seven boat waves and coordinated between the Greek and U.S. Navies, the assault was timed perfectly and worked in a textbook fashion. After the initial assault, the USS Cyclone (PC 1) pulled alongside for fuel in what was CARTER HALL's first alongside replenishment operation.

The conclusion of the exercise saw the CARTER HALL onloading the Marines and offloading the first group of midshipmen on June 19. Highly successful, Exercise Alexander the Great again displayed the teamwork and coordination that the Navy and the Marines built up during their predeployment workups.

Cassis, France, was the next destination for CARTER HALL. On the morning of June 25, CARTER HALL anchored in Cassis. Later that morning, Sailors and Marines participated in the Day of Hope. An event celebrating life, happiness, and human strength, the Day of Hope highlighted children who were victims of cancer. In less than 24 hours, the crew pulled together to give each of the eighty children who visited the ship a ballcap filled with candy and a tour of the ship with various demonstrations along the way. The crew received nothing short of hugs and smiles of thanks from each child involved. After the conclusion of the Day of Hope, CARTER HALL embarked the second group of midshipmen.

From the small resort town of Cassis, CARTER HALL moved on to moor in Toulon, France on July 1. Amidst several other French warships, CARTER HALL celebrated the Fourth of July. A picnic was held on the beach for the crew, complete with music, food, and ballgames. Away from the fun and the sun, a small group of Sailors paid homage to Americans who gave their life during World War II at Rhone National Cemetery outside of Toulon. Both the fun and the sober side of the holiday were observed. Toulon was CARTER HALL's last breather before her next two exercises.

Enroute to her next exercise, CARTER HALL's Engineering Department underwent the Mid-Cycle Assessment. MCA was a major inspection that looked at training, programs, and PQS.

During Exercise INVITEX, which occurred from July 10 through July 17, ships from all over Europe participated in amphibious operations and carrier battle group operations. Off the coast of Italy, CARTER HALL rigged her deceptive lighting, streamed Nixie, and stood undefeated in numerous publication exercises. Combat readiness inside the lifelines of the ship was flexed and toned. Working closely with other countries and

overcoming the language barrier was challenging but all operations went smoothly and CARTER HALL left with another success under her belt. The second group of midshipmen debarked on July 18, shortly after INVITEX concluded.

Shifting from one exercise to another, CARTER HALL joined the Tunisian Navy and Marines during Exercise Atlas Hinge off the coast of North Africa on July 21. Atlas Hinge began with the CARTER HALL stealthily infiltrating the territorial seas of Tunisia. After the Marines later stormed the beach in a massive amphibious assault, CARTER HALL remained anchored in the area to provide logistical support and to conduct training. CARTER HALL embarked its final group of midshipmen on July 23.

With temperatures soaring well past the 112 degree mark in the shade, the sun seemed to be waging a sort of solar warfare. Fighting back in the best way possible, CARTER HALL sent over three-quarters of her crew in three shifts to the beach via LCU 1644 for an amphibious assault consisting of a swim call and an afternoon of fun.

With four exercises behind her, CARTER HALL headed north to Ibiza, Spain, an island synonymous with vacation and relaxation. Anchoring just outside the mouth of the harbor on July 27, CARTER HALL enjoyed a week of liberty on the beaches, in the nightclubs, and at the restaurants.

The good life had to end at some point in time though. CARTER HALL left the Mediterranean Sea for another stop in Rota, Spain. Rota proved to be a working port with the USS Simon Lake and the USS Kearsarge from August 11 through August 19. An additional Intermediate Maintenance Availability during the deployment aided CARTER HALL in wrapping up a number of unfinished jobs. Rota also gave the Marines the opportunity to washdown all of their vehicles and equipment.

Beginning in Rota and extending through the transit to Palma, CARTER HALL's Engineering Department was visited by ETG for a Special Assist Visit. Once again, programs, training, and PQS were evaluated.

On August 29, CARTER HALL moored pierside in Palma, Spain, an island east of Ibiza. Like Ibiza, Palma was host to a festive nightlife and great

beaches. Being there for over a week, Sailors and Marines were able to participate in a community relations project, helping to rebuild and refurbish a local orphanage. They were also able to take advantage of tours sponsored by Morale, Welfare, and Recreation.

With the last port visit for the deployment, CARTER HALL set her sights toward Barcelona, Spain, where she moored on September 6. A city enriched by its past, Barcelona gave the Sailors and Marines an education in history, architecture, and Spanish culture, including dishes like paella.

Before beginning the last exercise of the deployment, CARTER HALL hosted the CNO, Admiral Jay Johnson, COMSIXTHFLT, Vice Admiral Steve Abbot, and MCPON, ETCM(SW) John Hagan on September 15. The CNO took a brief tour of the ship and then held an Admiral's Call for the crew on the flight deck. Talking about his vision of the Navy and the importance of its people, the CNO fielded questions from the crew before meeting with the junior officers in the wardroom. The CNO was thoroughly impressed with the crew, the ship, and the warm welcome he received. Before he left, the CNO and his entourage were presented with some of CARTER HALL's 'Core Value' coins. Each coin has the ship's crest, the adage '5-OH, The New Standard', 'Honor, Courage, and Commitment', and the Command-at-Sea pin engraved on it.

September 23 saw the start of CARTER HALL's final exercise of the deployment. Operating with the JFK Battlegroup and Navies from different European countries, CARTER HALL launched an amphibious assault in Kiriprissia Bay, Greece. Acting as PCO and PCS, CARTER HALL orchestrated the assault and coordinated assets from four different countries. CARTER HALL anchored off the beach during the exercise to continue to coordinate communications, backloads, air operations, and replenishment operations.

With the conclusion of Dynamic Mix on October 7, CARTER HALL had one stop in Rota, Spain, for a major washdown and agricultural certification before returning to the states. While transiting the Straits of Gibraltar enroute to Rota for the fourth and final time on her way out of the

Mediterranean, CARTER HALL was personally escorted on both her port and starboard beams by over one hundred dolphins.

On October 16, CARTER HALL departed Rota, Spain, for an eleven day transit across the Atlantic Ocean. Along the way, CARTER HALL continued training the crew, practicing shipboard evolutions, and made last minute preparations for entering port on October 29.

The offload in Morehead City, NC, began on October 27. Two days were used to disembark the Marines, their equipment, and their vehicles.

With the offload complete, CARTER HALL embarked the Tigers for her Tiger Cruise on October 28. The Tigers sailed with the ship up to Little Creek for the CARTER HALL's official return to the United States. October 29 saw friends and families lining the quay wall as CARTER HALL moored. Every sailor manned the rails with roses in hand for their loved ones.

Upon pulling into Little Creek, CARTER HALL began her post-deployment standown. For one month, sailors took leave, visiting friends and family after six months of being away.

On December 9, CARTER HALL once again got underway from Little Creek for TCAT, an amphibious exercise. Anchored in Onslow Bay, NC, CARTER HALL conducted flight operations, small boat operations, and wet well operations in support of the Marines embarked. TCAT ended on December 16, when CARTER HALL moored pierside in Little Creek.

ETG again visited CARTER HALL on December 17 through December 19 for PLOT I. Engineering Department began another rigorous inspection of its training, its programs, and its PQS. With the conclusion of PLOT I, CARTER HALL commenced her holiday standown period.
