### 2. Commander's Assessment

In 2015, CHAFEE achieved excellence in both material readiness and combat readiness, meeting the high standards of the Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV) as well as safely and successfully completing a 7 month deployment across 3 areas of responsibilities (AOR).

Fielding a well-trained crew straight out of the Basic Phase, CHAFEE transitioned to the Advanced Phase seamlessly as she passed Independent Certification Exercise (IDCERTEX) and prepared for TYCOM Material Inspection (TMI) and INSURV. CHAFEE's material readiness was tested and validated through with both inspections. CHAFEE then deployed to C7F, first

independently to support the U.S. Coast Guard District Fourteen Ocean Maritime Security Initiative, then joining the GEORGE WASHINGTON Strike Group (GWASG).

As an escort to GEORGE WASHINGTON (GW), CHAFEE participated in Talisman Saber, Peru Bi-LATEX, UNITAS PAC, and UNITAS LANT. In C7F and C4F CHAFEE conducted a port visits to Brisbane, Australia; Callao, Peru; Valparaiso, Chile; Rio Grande, Brazil; Suape, Brazil, and Willemstad, Curacao. Each exercise and each port visit provided an opportunity to strengthen our own tactics while working with other foreign navies to strengthen relationships with partner navies.

#### **Narrative**

Closing out the Basic Phase in early 2015, CHAFEE certified in 3M 1.4, USW 2.3-2.4, SW 2.4, AW 2.4, EW 2.4, and STW 2.3. It demanded intense, coordinated, and disciplined training, which CHAFEE met fearlessly and proved her proficiency with first-pass yields across with every mission area.

In February, CHAFEE officially shifted to the Advanced Phase and was assigned the MIDPAC Ready Duty Ship from 14 February 2015 - 05 March 2015. Throughout Sustainment Phase, CHAFEE participated in TGEX, FST-J, SLAMEX, and ISATT, while balancing pre-deployment planning and certifications with INSURV preparations.

With CMAV 5A2 strategically planned in March, CHAFEE focused on material readiness throughout TSRA 1 - TSRA5 in preparation for INSURV. Planned maintenance and an aggressive approach to casualty correction prevented CHAFEE from having to work weekends while preparing for INSURV. CHAFEE scored 87% overall, well above average.

On May 18, CHAFEE was underway for a multi-mission deployment. The first tasking was to support the United States Coast Guard's (USCG) Oceanic Maritime Security Initiative (OMSI). While sailing West towards Guam, CHAFEE boarded 19 fishing vessels in which the USCG settled 4 violations; simultaneously crossed the Equator and International Dateline (IDL), adding 197 Golden Shellbacks to the Navy's roster; conducted an All Hands Swim Call; and sustained steadfast operations at sea.

In June, CHAFEE joined CTF 70, in company with USS ANTIETAM (CG 54) and USS MUSTIN (DDG 89), escorting USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (CVN 73) on her last C7F deployment. While attached to CTF 70, CHAFEE escorted GWA through the Indonesian Straits, conducted a port visit to Brisbane, Australia, and participated in Talisman Sabre with Australian and New Zealand forces. Seamlessly integrating into the GWASG, CHAFEE completed Plane Guard/Horizon Reference Unit (PG/HRU) duties, stood ready as the Alternate Warfare Commander for multiple warfare areas, and practiced dynamic tactics.

The deployment had several challenges throughout the summer months, to include fuel percentages and refueling challenges, personnel movements, ISIC shifts, and parts support. With an erratic schedule, CHAFEE was underway 103 days for the first 108 days of deployment.

The next phase of deployment was higher tempo, marked with several port visits and multi-ship exercises. CHAFEE participated in Peru Bi-LAT, UNITAS PAC, and UNITAS LANT as well as a transit passage through the Strait of Magellan and the Panama Canal.

CHAFEE was disciplined in her pursuit of excellence, fearless in leaning forward, and lethal in the execution of exercise tactics. Overall, a very successful year for CHAFEE.
