#### 2. Commander's Assessment

USS CHINOOK performed a variety of tasking in support of Partnership-Strength-Presence operations in the 5<sup>th</sup> Fleet AOR. The two most common missions for CHINOOK were Martime Security Operations, primarily Approach and Assist visits conducted while working for the Coalition Task Force 152 within the Arabian Gulf. CHINOOK also performed several Special Mission Ship escort and overwatch operations, which took her out into the Gulf of Oman.

In addition to these primary missions, CHINOOK took part in several exercises designed to strengthen ties with allied nations and expand and exercise naval capacity, including Falcon Defender, JADEX, Eagle Trident II, and IMCMEX. CHINOOK also took part in several less formal interoperability training exercises at sea, designed to prove and practice basic supporting procedures between platforms, incuding towing and refueling with a variety of small craft from Coastal Riverine and Special Warfare units.

During 2014, CHINOOK also transitioned from rotating crews to a permanent crew, homeported in Manama, Bahrain. Patrol Coastal Crew Juliet formally transitioned to USS CHINOOK in the spring, with all new reports receiving permanent change of station orders to the ship homeported in Manama, Bahrain vice the rotational crew homeported in Little Creek, VA. EN2 John Bell will be the final remaining member of PCCJ to depart in September of 2015. Although the elimination of crew rotation and hull swapping allow for increased ownership and greater continuity for maintenance and upkeep, one year tour length based on Department of Defense limitations for the Central Command AOR posed new challenges for training and proficiency with limited time for the new crewmembers to learn the unique idiosyncrasies of the Coastal Patrol ship.

Throughout 2014, CHINOOK met every challenge and task, sailing per schedule and completing every assigned mission, accruing in the process more underway time than any other Coastal Patrol ship in theater. CHINOOK achieved scores averaging above 90% during Basic Phase Training, with similar success during Advanced Phase Training Exercise.

### **Narrative**

USS CHINOOK (PC 9) has had a busy and successful year. Having completed and excelled during both a Certification Validation as well as Basic Phase training events, in the first half of the year, CHINOOK conducted multiple underways in support of CTF152 tasking as well as participating in Joint Air Defense Exercises, Falcon Defender 14, and Eagle Trident II.

Following the change of command in July, CHINOOK conducted a continuous maintenance availability while pierside at NSA Bahrain. Upon completion of maintenance, CHINOOK was underway for 152 Operations, Advanced Phase Training Exercise, and Special Mission Ship overwatch duties.

The remainder of the year was spent in a combination of 152 Operations and Interoperability Training, along with participation in November's International Mine Countermeasures Exercise. These operations afforded CHINOOK port visit opportunities in Fujairah and Jebel Ali in the United Arab Emirates.

Returning to Bahrain on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of December, CHINOOK ended out the year returning to a continuous maintenance availability.
