NARRATIVE:

In January, USS CHOSIN began preparations for Intermediate Maintenance availability (IMAV) and Ship's Restricted Availability (SRA) by off-loading weapons, defueling and moving the crew ashore to temporary barracks. During the availability and SRA period, which lasted until March, CHOSIN received AEGIS software upgrade 5.0.7.2. Additionally, the ship successfully completed an Aviation Assist Visit (AAV) and COMNAVSURFGRUMIDPAC Engineering and Administration inspection.

In March, preparations for the upcoming training cycle began with a Battle Force Team Trainer and CONSTELLATION Battle Group Initial Warfare Commanders Working Group which set the stage early for CHOSIN's preparation to assume duties as Air Warfare Commander. PRE-CART II engineering training visit was conducted by COMNAVSURFGRUMIDPAC. March closed with completion of the ship's SRA and the crew moving back aboard the ship.

INSURV was successfully completed in April and Afloat Training Group Middle Pacific provided valuable assistance in a review of CHOSIN's 3M maintenance system. Ammunition was once again on-loaded and CHOSIN completed CART II with the crew being assessed at the TSTA I/TSTA II level. CHOSIN'S strike capabilities were exercised with participation in SLAMEX 99-11.

In preparation for TSTA, on board training in May consisted of the TOPGUN AIC Mobile Team Trainer, surface/subsurface Anti-submarine Warfare Trainer and Combat System Training Team (CSTT) training. A Logistics, Administration and Training Review inspection was also conducted. Prospective Commanding Officer turnover was conducted and on 29 May, Captain T.J. Gregory Relieved Captain Mark J. Edwards as CHOSIN's Commanding Officer.

TSTA I began in June and continued into the TSTA II phase in July. Warfare training continued with the HARPOON and TOMAHAWK Team Trainer and the Cruise Missile Team Qualification.

At sea time increased in August with Engineering Certification and TSTA III which saw CHOSIN being declared ready for the Final Evaluation Problem (FEP) by Afloat Training Group. CHOSIN's ASW skills were challenged during Prospective Commanding Officer Submarine Service (PCOSS) HOLLYWOOD, during which, CHOSIN was pitted against prospective attack submarine commanders in coordinated ASW scripted attack scenarios. During these evolutions, CHOSIN utilized ASW attack and evasion tactics in a real-world operational environment. Final debrief at the conclusion of the operations confirmed the reliability of standing surface ASW tactics and CHOSIN's proficiency in their execution. CHOSIN also conducted live SM-2 firings, successfully engaging two subsonic missiles fired in stream raid from the Pacific Missile Range Facility, Barking Sands, Hawaii.

FEP was completed in September and CHOSIN transitioned to an extended in-port period. Weeks of preparation and evaluation culminated with the ship transitioning to eight in-port duty sections. Additionally, CHOSIN was selected as the winner of the Secretary of the Navy Energy Conservation Award for small/medium ships.

October saw the beginning of preparations for WESTPAC 99 with the first Air Defense Commander, Surface Combat Commander, and C2W Combat Commander's Conferences. In November, training continued with the Naval Surface Fire Support and Under Sea Warfare Team Trainers as well as Force Air Warfare Commander training. The year came to a close with Naval Surface Fire Support evaluation and a Friends and Family three day Port Visit to Lahaina, Maui, Hawaii in December.
