CAPTAIN'S ASSESSMENT 2012 USS COLE (DDG 67)

Homeport: Norfolk, VA Commissioned: 08 June 1996

COLE's change of command ceremony took place on 06JAN 12 when I, CDR Peter K. Nilsen, relieved CDR Andrew C. Ehlers as Commanding Officer. Shortly after taking command, the ship conducted an ammo on-load at Naval Station Norfolk prior to getting underway as part of the Enterprise Strike Group for the Composite Training Unit Exercise (COMPTUEX). Following the successful completion of COMPTUEX, ZCOLE had the opportunity to participate in Operation Bold Alligator, the largest amphibious exercise in more than a decade. Once again in home port, COLE continued to prep for her extended 9 month deployment and upcoming 3M (Maintenance, Material, and Management) inspection. Upon completion of the final ammunition on-load at Naval Station Yorktown in March, COLE conducted a Tiger Cruise for families and friends as the returned to NAVSTA Norfolk. Shortly thereafter, COLE had the honor to host a visit by French Chief of Naval Operations (CNO), Admiral Bernard Rogel. COLE left homeport for her deployment on 23 APR 12.

During COLE's nine month deployment to the Mediterranean Sea, my crew met every mission assigned. COLE has a lot of history and pride behind her, but she's not a museum; she's an active warship. Cole is the fourth BMD-capable ship to deploy to the European theater as part of the Phased Adaptive Approach, the purpose of which is to protect European allies, partners, U.S. forces in the region, and the U.S. homeland against current and emerging ballistic threats. We participated in three joint exercises with the Israeli Navy, practicing small boat defense tactics. The crew raised the bar in the 6th Fleet Area of Responsibility for material readiness, maintaining 100% operational success. COLE's SPY radar and technicians also set records by maintaining 100% operability throughout the deployment. Additionally, COLE managed to save roughly \$600,000 by conducting shipboard repairs in lieu of contracting work out, showing that sailors who care about their ship and their equipment can move mountains. Not only has the ship performed magnificently, but our crew's personal successes have been astronomical. Over 102 sailors earn their Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist pins, 88 sailors advance in rate, and we promoted eight new chief petty officers.

COLE's crew not only worked to maintain the ship, but also took part in a community relations program in Haifa, where we repaired homes of local residents, ninety of whom were Holocaust survivors. During the deployment COLE conducted successful port visits to Spain, Greece, Turkey, Israel, and Italy.

We're very blessed to have an outstanding crew, they love what they do, and they understand the commitment they've made. They have done an outstanding job over the past nine months. Our success is directly indicative of the hard work, the training, the ownership, and the pride in what they do. We're part of something special onboard

COLE. The crew understands the legacy of the ship, they understand we have to honor their memories, and we do that by doing our jobs the best we can.

APRIL MARKED THE COLE'S LAST MONTH IN PORT BEFORE HER NINE MONTH DEPLOYMENT TO THE MEDITERRANEAN. FOLLOWING A 3M INSPECTION, COLE HAD TWO JUNIOR OFFICERS, ENS AND ENS AND ENS PROMOTED TO THE RANK OF LIEUTENANT JUNIOR GRADE, AND MR2 RE-ENLISTED. COLE, ON THE 23RD OF APRIL BEGAN HER DEPLOYMENT. HER FIRST FEW DAYS AT SEA INCLUDED AN UNREP WITH USNS KANAWHA AND NUMEROUS GO DRILLS, GUN SHOOTS, AND OTHER EVENTS TO FURTHER PREPARE THE CREW FOR THEIR NEW MISSION. JOHN BALDWIN; HOSPITAL CORPSMAN 2ND CLASS CHARLES CHRIST, COMMISSARYMAN (SHIP'S COOK) 3RD CLASS ROGER GEDNEY, DISBURSING CLERK 1ST CLASS JOHN HURREY, CHIEF CONTROL TECHNICIAN (GUN FIRE CONTROL) GARY MCKAY, ELECTRICIAN'S MATE 2ND CLASS ELBRIDGE RATHBONE AND HONORED NAVY WIFE MRS. ONCE UNDERWAY AGAIN, COLE PARTICIPATED IN AN ASW EXERCISE BEFORE INITIATING A FORCE PROTECTION STAND DOWN. WITH THE END OF HER DEPLOYMENT NEARING, AND PREPARATIONS FOR TURN OVER WITH HER REPLACEMENT IN PROGRESS, COLE ENDED THE YEAR ON AN HIGH NOTE. COLE AND HER CREW HAVE SUCCESSFULLY ACCOMPLISHED HER MISSION FOR EIGHT MONTHS STRAIGHT, AND ARE LOOKING TO FINISH STRONG AS THE NEW YEAR APPROACHES.
