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USS COMSTOCK COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION

USS Comstock (LSD 45), UIC 21452, is the fifth ship of the Whidbey Island (LSD 41) class Dock Landing Ship and the fourth ship of the class to serve in the Pacific fleet. The mission of Comstock is to embark, deploy, land and support elements of a Marine Corps landing force in an assault by helicopters, a wide array of assault craft, and amphibious vehicles. To provide continuing support to the assault force, Comstock is equipped with a modern communication suite, state-of-the-art combat systems equipment, and an expertly trained crew.

CDR S. M. Harris commands *USS Comstock*, which is assigned to Amphibious Group Three and supports Marine Expeditionary Units (Special Operations Capable) based in Camp Pendleton, CA.

USS Comstock's immediate senior in command is Commander, Amphibious Group THREE.

Command Narrative

The crew of USS Comstock began 2001 with a well-deserved Holiday leave period concluding on 08 January. During the leave period the C4I program installation was completed, which significantly upgraded Comstock's communication capabilities for the 21st century. IT-21 was installed and many new computers were added to the ship's inventory. Comstock finished the month of January with commencement of Amphibious Specialty Training (AST) and Amphibious Readiness Group Certification (ARG CERT).

AST and ARG CERT concluded at the beginning of February, and during this month key Operations Department personnel participated in Rapid Response Planning Process (R2P2). As Spring approached, Comstock transited with several other amphibious ships North up the coast of California to participate in "Fleet Week" San Francisco, California. Immediately following a fantastic San Francisco port visit, Comstock prepared for Exercise Kernal Blitz, a major bi-annual West Coast Amphibious Exercise.

As the summer months approached, *Comstock's* preparations for the next upcoming deployment were accelerating. The ship was underway in early May for COMPTUEX with Peleliu ARG. Advanced training for the upcoming deployment continued in June with FLEETEX and ARG/SOC.

When the ship returned to Naval Station, San Diego at the end of June, Comstock was certified deployment ready. The crew's well-earned Pre-Overseas Movement (POM) leave periods began and final deployment preparations were made. During the POM period, a PBY Catalina was onloaded onto the flight deck for further transfer to Australia. The PBY was a gift that would be donated to the Australians for their support of the United States during World War II in the Pacific Theater. Many Australians and Americans alike flew in PBY Catalinas during WWII to survey and conduct reconnaissance missions in the Pacific Theater.

In early August, with the entire crew back onboard, Comstock conducted a pre-deployment Sea Trials Underway period to flex all

systems prior to deployment. The ship set sail for Hawaii on 13 August, for refueling and logistics load-out. After a quick port stop in Hawaii, *Comstock* headed in a southeasterly direction to cross the Equator and the International Date Line simultaneously for a "Crossing the Line" Ceremony.

As Comstock continued westward, she stopped in Darwin, Australia for five days of liberty and the offload of the PBY Catalina. During the final day inport Darwin, Australia, the terrorist attacks of September 11th occurred. Comstock immediately set FPCON "D" and was underway by 0600 the next morning. Initially, Comstock headed for East Timor, where she had prior engagements to participate in Operation Handclasp, a humanitarian operation in support of East Timor. While Comstock was sitting off the coast of East Timor, a number of VIPs from East Timor and the Middle East came onboard to tour the ship and enjoy a first-rate American lunch. They were very impressed with the crew's living conditions, as the living conditions in East Timor hardly meet even the most basic human needs. They took numerous pictures with Comstock crewmembers and took full advantage of the ship's store.

After Operation HANDCLASP, Comstock headed west once again. This time, she sailed directly for the Northern Arabian Sea in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, bypassing her original port visits of Singapore and Thailand. In early October, a number of the Marines were offloaded for insertion into Pakistan to secure the Pasni Airfield in support of the War on Terrorism.

Comstock remained on station in the Northern Arabian Gulf until she received orders to transit through the Strait of Hormuz and the Southern Arabian Gulf to offload the majority of the remaining Marines in Bahrain. Comstock departed the Arabian Gulf and transited once again through the Strait of Hormuz to return to the Northern Arabian Sea on 03 November for further support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

The year concluded with a visit by the Commandant of the United States Marine Corps on Christmas Eve. The crew celebrated the last

few hours of New Year's Eve onboard the ship and underway, but nonetheless enjoying the camaraderie and esprit de corps that built up during an arduous deployment, highlighted by the crew's active participation in the War on Terrorism.
