USS CROMMELIN (FFG-37) COMMAND HISTORY 1997

COMMAND COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION

a. Mission. USS CROMMELIN's mission is to provide air, surface and undersea protection for underway replenishment groups, convoys, amphibious forces and other military and merchant shipping. 1997 NARRATIVE

TRAINING. That one word best describes CROMMELIN in 1997. It began early in the year with PRAV-2, and continued through to December as CROMMELIN readied herself for deployment. What started with PRAV-2, ended in late November when LMA was completed. The ship then welcomed a much appreciated leave and upkeep period.

The year started with a change-of-command in January with CDR Charles ("Chuck") J. Pierce relieving CDR Andrew G. Sevald as the Commanding Officer of USS CROMMELIN.

February was busy for Operations Department as Aviation Certification (AVCERT) and Aviation Readiness Evaluation (ARE) were completed. CROMMELIN was certified to land, launch and service helicopters and the flight deck was once again available for flight operations.

March saw CROMMELIN pass her Light Off Assessment with flying colors and then it was time for a little rest and social functions. A reception was held for the visiting Colombian training ship ARC GLORIA.

INSURV's Board of Inspectors arrived in April. They left four days later with smiles on their faces as they thoroughly inspected the ship and concluded that CROMMELIN was fit for further service.

CROMMELIN then hosted her second Change-of-Command. Destroyer Squadron Three One, CAPT Donald Prather, USN, who was a previous Executive Officer in CROMMELIN, chose to have his Change-of-Command on his old ship. The flight deck was decorated once again, and over 100 people enjoyed the festivities.

As the ship was undergoing TSTA I, a distress call was received. CROMMELIN steamed north at flank speed for over 15 hours, launched a Coast Guard helicopter flown in for the mission, and MEDEVACED the patient to Tripler Army Medical Center in under 36 hours. Three hours after being admitted to Tripler, he underwent surgery for appendicitis.

As CROMMELIN was getting underway for PCOSS HOLLYWOOD, a breasting camel got stuck in between CROMMELIN and the pier. The incident opened a 1'X5' gouge in the starboard quarter of her hull. The damaged area was repaired in only three days. CROMMELIN got underway and still met the commitment for which she was intended.

August also saw the first UNREP of the year for the ship with USS WILLAMETTE providing the fuel. As the month came to a close, CDR(Sel) Rene R. Del Rosario, USN, relieved CDR(Sel) James K. Kuhn, USN, as Executive Officer.

CROMMELIN stared at a bear for two months and the bear stared back. In the end, CROMMELIN came out on top as the Engineering Certification (ECERT) was conquered by all hands. Concurrent with ECERT, the Cruise Missile Tactical Qualification Team (CMTQ) was praised to be the best on the waterfront by ATG observers.

On the surface, the year may seem to be rather uneventful. However, the exact opposite was true. The crew helped to save at least one life, and prepared itself in fine fashion for its deployment in February of 1998. The training received throughout the year will ensure that all CROMMELIN Sailors return home from deployment safe - the bottom line in this command's mind.
