1. (U) In compliance with reference (a), the history of USS DUBUQUE (LPD-8) for period 1 January 1977 to 31 December 1977 is hereby submitted.

2. (C) Basic History.

a. (U) Command Organization.

(1) During this period, USS DUBUQUE (LPD-8) served as a unit of Amphibious Squadron ONE. The following officers commanded the ship:

- (a) 1 January 1977 to 4 March 1977 Captain Andrew C. FERGUSON, USN,
- (b) 4 March 1977 to 31 December 1977 Captain David E. SIGSWORTH, USN,

(3) Commanding Officer, USS DUBUQUE was assigned additional duties as CTG 76.5, 1 JAN 77 - 30 APR 77.

b. (C) <u>Summary of Operations</u>. On 1 January 1977 DUBUQUE was moored at U. S. Naval Station, Yokosuka, Japan for the Holiday Season and an upkeep period. On 8 January she got underway for Hong Kong via Buckner Bay, Okinawa, Japan.

Upon departing Okinawa CO DUBUQUE assumed OTC of a transit group composed of USS DUBUQUE and USS BLUE RIDGE (LCC-19) and both ships entered Hong Kong on 14 January for a 5 day visit. On 17 January 1977, during the port visit, SN Joseph Lee BURTON died on board from an apparent overdose of drugs. Rear Admiral James MORRIS, CTF 76/COMPHIBFORWESTPAC, came on board following this incident and addressed the entire crew to express his concern for the well being of personnel assigned to his forces and to emphasize the drug problem.

Departing Hong Kong on 19 January, DUBUQUE was OTC for a silent transit with the USS BLUE RIDGE (LCC-19) and USS RACINE (LST-1191) to Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines, arriving on 21 January. During the next few days DUBUQUE enjoyed a brief upkeep period before proceeding to White Beach, Okinawa on 29 January.

On 30 January, in transit from Subic Bay to Okinawa, Japan, DUBUQUE lost propulsive power while steaming on one boiler due to loss of a main feed pump. Soon after becoming dead in the water she began taking heavy rolls due to high winds and moderate to heavy seas. LCU-1629 and LARK 965 were secured in the well deck. Due to the heavy rolling action of DUBUQUE these craft broke their lashings and began to shift from side to side. As a result of this action the LARK was severely damaged causing it to be surveyed. LCU-1629 was damaged and subsequently repaired by DUBUQUE's HT's. A fuel tank on DUBUQUE's port side was ruptured and there was a loss of some 50 thousand gallons of ND fuel. Propulsion power was regained after about 90 minutes and the transit was resumed.

BLT 2/9, on board since 24 November 1976, debarked on 1 February and BLT 1/9 embarked for transportation to Subic Bay. On 5 February BLT 1/9 was offloaded in Subic Bay. BLT 2/4 immediately embarked and DUBUQUE departed Subic Bay on the 7th, arriving in Okinawa on 10 February. This time, instead of loading marines, DUBUQUE picked up a damaged CH-53 for transportation to NAS Cubi Point arriving on 14 February for a one week upkeep period.



For BLTEX 2-77 CO DUBUQUE was again designated OTC. In preparation for this exercise, BLT 1/9 embarked DUBUQUE on 18 February. The morning following CTF 76's arrival, DUBUQUE got underway in company with the USS DURHAM (LKA-114) and USS RACINE (LST-1191) for Botolan Point, R.P.. Arriving in the exercise area these units rendezvoused with units of the Philippine Navy at sea. During this exercise DUBUQUE had many visitors including COMSEVENTHFLT, CG 3rd Marine Amphibious Force, and the CNO of the Philippine Navy who observed the exercise assault. The exercise consisted of a variety of combined US/ Philippine seamanship exercises, combined amphibious assault and operations ashore with joint air support. On 27 February, DUBUQUE proceeded to Manila for a well deserved rest.

After four days in Manila an underway Change of Command ceremony was conducted just off Corrigador Island. CAPT David E. SIGSWORTH, USN relieved CAPT FERGUSON as Commanding Officer of the ship. COMPHIBRON ONE, Captain R.N. CONGDON, USN officiated the ceremony and together with Captain FERGUSON departed by helicopter at its conclusion. The ship arrived in Subic Bay later that afternoon and BLT 1/9 offboaded.

The period 5-16 March was spent conducting Airborne Mine Countermeasures (AMCM) workup exercises with AMCM Unit Alpha, consisting of MCMU Alpha and HMM-11 Det ONE. The exercises were conducted at anchor and underway in the vicinity of Subic Bay, R.P. At the conclusion of the AMCM workup DUBUQUE departed on 19 March for Pusan, South Korea. The crew enjoyed a two day port visit and then continued to Pohang, South Korea for joint mine countermeasures operations with the Korean Navy. Because of difficulties experienced by the USS OKINAWA (LPH-3), DUBUQUE, in company with the USS VANCOUVER (LPD-2), steamed to Sasebo, Japan on 29 March. There DUBUQUE embarked CTG 76.4 (COMPHIBRON ONE) and units of 31st MAU and their equipment and returned to Pohang on 31 March to participate as flagship for the amphibious assault in TEAM SPIRIT 77. Commander, U.S. Forces Korea and COMSEVENTHFLT visited on 2 April to observe the amphibious operations and remained overnight. After the arrival of USS OKINAWA on 3 April, CTG 76.4 and staff debarked and DUBUQUE departed for Subic Bay. Twenty five continuous hours of flight deck operations were conducted during the landing exercise and DUBUQUE conducted her 8000th landing since commissioning. The AMCM unit departed upon arrival in Subic Bay on 4 April.

8-18 April was spent in upkeep in Subic Bay. BLT 1/9 embarked 18 April and the ship departed for Numazu, Japan, arriving on 23 April. BLT 1/9 was offloaded and the ship departed in the early evening of the same day for Chin Wan Bay, Okinawa, Japan. Upon arrival at Chin Wan Bay on 26 April, the

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loading of USMC tanks scheduled for opportune lift to CONUS commenced. The ship sailed for Subic Bay, R.P. early that evening. DUBUQUE arrived in Subic Bay on the morning of 29 April. After anchoring to offload the oplift tanks for cleanup DUBUQUE shifted to Leyte Pier where 13 aircraft of CVW-5 were loaded on the flight deck for opportune lift to CONUS. USS JUNEAU (LPD-10) relieved DUBUQUE of duties as CTG 76.5 on 30 April and the oplift tanks were reembarked. COMPHIBRON ONE shifted his flag to DUBUQUE on 1 May.

DUBUQUE sailed from Subic Bay enroute to Pearl Harbor, Hawaii via the San Bernardino Straits on 2 May. Sailing in company were other units of TF 76.1.4, USS DURHAM (LKA-114) and USS RACINE (LST-1191) under the tactical command of COMPHIBRON ONE. The ship arrived in Pearl Harbor on 14 May to refuel and embark 68 male guests (8 to 80 years old) of crew members for the "TIGER CRUISE". DUBUQUE departed Pearl Harbor on 15 May under the tactical command of CTG 36.9.6 (COMPHIBRON ONE) in company with USS VANCOUVER (LPD-2), USS DURHAM (LKA-114), USS MONTICELLO (LSD-35), USS RACINE (LST-1191), and USS SAN BERNARDINO (LST-1189). Various demonstration exercises were conducted for embarked guests while enroute to San Diego.

DUBUQUE arrived in San Diego, California on 21 May 1977 and commenced an upkeep period which was completed 19 June. COMPHIB-RON ONE debarked 18 June 1977. On 20 June the ship got underway to participate in COMBATSYSEX 1-77 in Coronado Roads off San Diego. Due to an engineering casualty, the ship returned to San Diego for repairs on 21 June. Repairs completed, the ship sailed again on 24 June to participate in READIEX 4-77. Upon returning to San Diego on 1 July COMPHIBRON ONE reembarked. During July 1977 USS DUBUQUE was in upkeep and tender availability with DATC and USS PRAIRIE (AD-15) respectively and assigned to Task Group 36.2. On 27 July COMPHIBRON ONE debarked and on 31 July COMPHIBRON THREE embarked. After one day of local ops on 1 August, the USS DUBUQUE participated in PHIBLEX EASTPAC E1-77 named PALMTREE 6-77 for two days. Completing his assignment, COMPHIBRON THREE debarked on 3 August. Later in the month (15-17 August) DUBUQUE participated in PHIBLEX E2-77.

On 18 August ammunition was offloaded at Seal Beach, California in preparation for regular overhaul in Portland, Oregon. She returned to San Diego on 19 August, remaining there until departing for Bremerton, Washington on 6 September. During this inport period the Change of Command Ceremony for COMPHIBRON ONE was held onboard on 20 August and the Pacific Fleet Propulsion Examining Board (PEB) conducted a three day OPPE Monitor Visit. On 31 August the Master Chief of the Command for SURFPAC made a visit to the ship. In Bremerton, on 10 September, the DUBUQUE debarked her SOAP team and proceeded to Portland where she arrived for overhaul on 13 September. Homeport was shifted to Portland,

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Oregon effective 14 September. DUBUQUE remained in Portland through the 31st of December 1977, entering drydock on 2 October and leaving drydock on 22 October. On 16 December Captain SIGSWORTH presented the fifth consecutive Air "E" award to the Air Department for the period of 1 July 1976 through 30 June 1977.
