### USS GARY (FFG 51) COMMAND HISTORY 1987 HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

USS GARY is the forty-fifth ship of the Oliver Hazard Perry class of guided missile frigates. Currently programmed for over fifty ships, this will be the NAVY's largest destroyer class since World War II as well as the newest. Her mission is to provide anti-air, anti-submarine, and anti-surface protection for military and merchant shipping, amphibious task forces, underway logistics groups, and carrier battle groups.

The Commanding Officer has the ultimate authority, responsibility, and accountability for the performance of the ship and the crew. The Executive Officer, as second in command, is responsible for the implementation of Navy policies and regulations as applicable to the ship. Each Department Head reports to the Commanding Officer via the Executive Officer.

USS GARY is commanded by William D. Bethea of Los Angeles, California. The Executive Officer is CDR Robert L. Moon. The ship's organization is divided into five departments: Combat Systems, Engineering, Ship Control, Supply, and Air (Helicopter Detachment). The department head administers and oversees the basic operation of his department's function on achieving the overall command mission.

In keeping with her motto as "Freedom's Foremost Guardian" USS GARY participated in various fleet exercises, independent operations and completed a deployment to the western Pacific and Persian Gulf which tested the capabilities of the ship and the crew.

At the beginning of 1987, GARY was in the closing months of her first operational deployment. Transiting from Bunbury, Western Australia, via Subic Bay, RP, Pearl Harbor, HI, to homeport at Long Beach, CA, the ship began it's preparations for the upcoming inspections, repair availabilities and other challenges which would be met in preparation for her next operational employment.

Subsequent to a joyous welcome home celebration at her return, and after a short stand down period, GARY was again busy with the tasks of training and refitting. During this period GARY crewmembers attended many service schools and involved themselves in numerous projects within the local community.

Continuing her relationship with the Los Coyotes Elementary School in La Palma, GARY crewmembers participated in several school sponsored activities and provided individual leadership to the school's children through a pen pal

exchange program. The ship's interest in the community was further expressed through frequent involvement in guest ship visitations and youth programs ship tours.

An unexpected opportunity presented itself when GARY was approached to provide cast support for the American Broadcasting Company's production of "War and Remembrance". Approximately thirty officers, chief petty officers and crew acted as extras for the World War II drama which will be aired sometime in the fall of 1988. During filming GARY's Commanding Officer, CDR William D. Bethea even received a "spot" promotion by the film company's producer's to the rank of Rear Admiral for the purpose of the scene.

During the month of May GARY received yet another distinction by her participation in the Torrance, CA Armed Forces Day Parade, where the ship's drill team won first prize for best military drill team. The Torrance Parade is the biggest military observance in the country.

Predeployment inspections and regularly scheduled maintenance and readiness availabilities were compressed into a seven month period. During this period GARY completed each with impressive results. During 1987, GARY completed the following evolutions with results as listed:

USS GARY's Air Department is staffed by detachments from Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron Light Forty Three (HSL 43), homebased at NAS North Island, California. HSL 43 flys the SH-60B "SEAHAWK" LAMPS MK III helicopter.

USS GARY is homeported in Long Beach, California.

#### HELO OPERATIONS FOR 1987:
