





22 DEC-04 JAN - PORT VISIT TOULON, FRANCE

NARRATIVE:

USS GETTYSBURG (CG 64) departed Mayport the day following New Year's Day enroute to Portland, Maine for Post Shakedown Availability one day earlier than expected due to heavy seas and inclement weather along the proposed track. Constant liaison between NAVEASTOCEANCEN Norfolk, VA and GETTYSBURG via satellite communications resulted in a safe transit after several track changes. Arriving in Portland on a sunny Monday morning, GETTYSBURG was inundated by Bath Iron Works supervisors and laborers. A challenging and comprehensive work package was aggressively tackled by BIW and continually monitored by the ship's force quality assurance team. During this time the crew concentrated on pre-deployment training, cross-decking with other MED 1-93 aviation squadrons and commands, and preparing for sea trials. Bath Iron works continued work on the ship, putting the finishing touches on it and correcting any discrepancies found by the crew. During this entire period the crew worked closely with the shipyard with the goal of sailing away in the highest state of readiness. The shipyard was very impressed by the extra effort and cooperation exhibited by the crew. After moving aboard a floating barge (YRBM), the crew manned up for the 10 January dry docking, an evolution which started at 0030 on an uncommonly cold winter's The undocking occurred on 15 February and the crew once night. again moved aboard the ship. Α formidable painting and preservation plan was developed and successfully achieved by the Deck Division Paint Team. Most BIW jobs were completed early, and after a successful sea trial, GETTYSBURG stood out from Portland on 17 March enroute Mayport to complete the well-developed interior and topside decking plan in a more agreeable climate for the duration of the PSA period.

During the 4 day transit to Mayport, GETTYSBURG hosted a Judge Advocate General Corps Officer on his two week at sea indoctrination cruise and conducted GETTYSBURG's first frocking of a JAG Lieutenant.

On 6 April, when Post-Shakedown Availability ended, only 17 work items remained open due to material procurement lead times. The team effort demonstrated by PMS 400, SUPSHIP Bath, the contractor, and ship's force provided the impetus to complete the significant availability on time and with high quality results. Enclosure (1) is the final PSA Sitrep and gives additional information the PSA.

On 13 April, GETTYSBURG once again stood out from Mayport enroute to the Norfolk, VA deperming facility crib for an urgently needed deperming, and then to Yorktown, VA for a weapons onload. On 16 April, GETTYSBURG conducted VANDALEX 1-92 missile firing exercise in the Virginia Capes Operating Area against a supersonic low-altitude, MQM-86(ER) (VANDAL) which resulted in a successful skin-to-skin direct intercept in less than 21 seconds after Standard Missile launch. Enclosure (2) is the Missilex Letter of Instruction which provided guidance for the conduct of the exercise. Enclosure (3) is the preliminary missile firing analysis and gives the results of the exercise based on telemetry data. GETTYSBURG's first Tiger Cruise went without a hitch on the return voyage from Yorktown to Mayport on 17-20 April.

During a well deserved rest in homeport, GETTYSBURG upgraded an Aviation Assist Visit (AAV) to an Aviation Readiness Evaluation (ARE) through the dedicated efforts of First Division and the entire Engineering Department. Following that significant event came another GETTYSBURG first - the dependent's cruise in which over 300 guests participated. A well orchestrated demonstration by LAMPS MK III, F/A-18, and S-3 aircraft during a flight deck cookout culminated the sunny day.

The first General Courts-Martial saga in GETTYSBURG's legal history came to a close on 8 May with the conviction of PC3 Larson, the last of three GCM's for mail fraud and theft. Previously, PNSA Lee and SMSR Bryson were both found guilty at GCM. Awarded a Dishonorable Discharge, confinement at hard labor for 6 years, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and reduction to E-1, Larson received the stiffest sentence Mayport NLSO had handed out in a long period.

GETTYSBURG then settled down to serious preparations for an eventful 10 day underway period. Embarking HSL 48 DET 7 for a CNO ASW Combat Systems Integration project, GETTYSBURG conducted week one workups in a remarkable 2 days of intense flight operations. On the transit to Roosevelt Roads Puerto Rico, GETTYSBURG joined up with USS FLYING FISH to conduct 48 hours of round-the-clock submarine prosecution using shipboard sensors and LAMPS, evaluated by COMOPTEVFOR. After the OPEVAL, GETTYSBURG proceeded at a high speed of advance to arrive at Naval Station Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico the evening of 18 May.

Embarking a staff for the first time, GETTYSBURG was flagship for RADM J. S. Redd, USN, Commander, Cruiser-Destroyer Group Twelve on 19 May. That morning, GETTYSBURG was host to two foreign flag


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


officers, RADM Van de Sande COMMANDER, NETHERLANDS TASK GROUP, RADM Laudien, COMMANDER, GERMAN DESTROYER FLOTILLA, and the Commanding Officer's of fourteen ships from three nations for the MAYFLY missile firing exercise pre-brief. Participating ships were: USS RICHMOND K. TURNER, USS HARRY E. YARNELL, USS TAYLOR, USS SAMUEL B. ROBERTS, USS BRISCOE, HNLMS TROMP, HNLMS KORTENAER, HNLMS WITTE DE WITH, HNLMS VAN KINSBERGEN, HNLMS ZUIDERKRUIS, FGS HAMBURG, FGS ROMMEL, FGS AUGSBURG, and FGS LUEBECK. Following the briefing, all ships sortied to the North Puerto Rican Oparea for practice firing runs and live firings. GETTYSBURG launched 5 Standard Missiles and fired 26, 5 inch rounds against extremely low altitude presentations during the day and a half event. RADM Laudien flew aboard from FGS HAMBURG to observe one firing exercise from the flagship Additionally, GETTYSBURG participated in an air GETTYSBURG. gunnery exercise on 20 May. Commander, Netherlands Task Group was OCE, and participating ships were: KORTENAER, BRISCOE, the ZUIDERKRUIS, VAN KINSBERGEN, TAYLOR, SAMUEL B. ROBERTS, and TROMP. The ships in screen kilo formation fired against two Northrop Bentura target drones, with GETTYSBURG firing 51, 5 inch rounds from Mounts 51 and 52. Operating for the first time with other naval combatants in close proximity, the bridge and CIC watch teams performed superbly maintaining station in column formation with 500 After the last night of firing, GETTYSBURG yard separation. independently steamed to the vicinity of Naval Station Roosevelt Roads and disembarked COMCRUDESGRU TWELVE the morning of 21 May.

GETTYSBURG then proceeded north to rendezvous with USS MILWAUKEE for underway refueling and personnel highline transfer, receiving F-76 and conducting highline transfer of Ensign Wiedenbach. Conducting hurricane awareness training, GETTYSBURG prepared herself for the CINCLANTFLT hurricane readiness exercise prior to returning to port, and also conducted a satisfactory Detect-to-Engage with a lear jet in Preparation for Combat Systems Assessment (Basic). Arriving late Saturday afternoon in Mayport, GETTYSBURG crew members enjoyed the Memorial Day Holiday.

With only a moments respite, the Combat System Department geared up for the 27-28 May Nuclear Weapons Technical Assistance Visit. Conducting an in-depth admin review and two shipwide security alert drills, GETTYSBURG passed with only one discrepancy and was able to upgrade the TAV to a Nuclear Weapons Acceptance Inspection (NWAI), becoming certified for the first time for Tomahawk nuclear weapons capabilities. Enclosure (4) is the message announcing the results of the inspection. Enclosures (5) and (6) are congratulatory messages for GETTYSBURG's outstanding performance. After two weeks in homeport preparing for Combat





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Systems Assessment (CSA) Basic GETTYSBURG got underway for the one day practice event. From 15-30 June GETTYSBURG was in an Intermediate Maintenance Availability with USS YOSEMITE. On 24 June 93 GETTYSBURG bade farewell to the commissioning XO, CDR Victor Guillory who was relieved by LCDR Albert Trotter. LCDR Trotter reported aboard after attending the numerous schools in the XO training pipeline.

The crew was then focused on the next major milestone, Cruise Missile Tactical Qualification Certification (CMTQT). The CMTQT is a comprehensive review of the ship's Tomahawk and Harpoon Cruise missile systems and the training, qualification and proficiency of the operating teams. The three day examination was successfully completed on 15 July 1992 and GETTYSBURG was declared qualified to operate these missile systems.

The next day GETTYSBURG was underway again to participate in a number of evolutions including Combat Systems Assessment (CSA), Tailship Proficiency Training (TPT) and COMPTUEX. The CSA is a comprehensive inspection of the Condition III watchteam's training programs, qualifications and performance and included a material assessment of GETTYSBURG's Combat Systems equipment. GETTYSBURG scored an overall OUTSTANDING and received the third highest score ever achieved. Enclosure (7) is the results of GETTYSBURG's CSA. Upon completion of CSA, GETTYSBURG moved ahead sharply to participate in TPT from 21-25 July 92. Enclosure (8) gives a summary of the exercise and the preliminary results and lessons learned.

Upon completion of TPT, GETTYSBURG took part in COMPTUEX for Med 1-93. COMPTUEX was a new training concept in which the battlegroup trains as a team prior to the major deployment. Then in response to national tasking the KENNEDY BATTLEGROUP began transiting the Atlantic enroute to the Mediterranean Sea. This no notice tasking was in response to Iraq's failure to meet the requirements of UN resolutions. They refused to permit inspections by UN teams searching for information on Iraq's nuclear weapons program. In an excellent example of the carrier battlegroup's flexibility, the battlegroup began the transit at 2000 local on 26 July 92. After subsequent compliance by Iraq the KENNEDY BATTLEGROUP was recalled from this tasking on 28 July 92 to return to the Puerto Rican OPAREA in order to complete COMPTUEX.

On 26 July 92 GETTYSBURG conducted a missilex. GETTYSBURG organized, and was in charge of, the conduct of the exercise. Enclosure (9) is the Missilex Letter of Instruction and gives the planning information used to prepare for the exercise. Enclosure



(10) is the Missilex Quicklook Report and gives a short summary of the overall results and lessons learned from the exercise. Enclosure (11) is a congratulatory message for the way the missile exercise was conducted. Due to the large amount of fuel used in responding to the contingency tasking the battlegroup had to return to port early and GETTYSBURG arrived in Mayport on 10 August 92. She was then inport from 11 August - 02 September preparing for the Battlegroup Fleetex 1-93. During this time three important events were conducted in preparation for deployment. The Auxiliary Systems Readiness Review, Combat Systems Readiness Review and the Gas Turbine Readiness Review. These evolutions were designed to assess the material condition of the Auxiliary Systems, Gas Turbines, and the Combat Systems. In each case GETTYSBURG's equipment was determined to be in peak condition and GETTYSBURG's maintenance personnel were determined to be highly qualified to Enclosure (12) is the CSRR perform the required maintenance. Lessons Learned.

On 21 August 92 the crew and their families enjoyed a beautiful summers day on the beach in Mayport at the ship's picnic. The theme of the picnic was a Hawaiian luau and there was a Hawaiian style band, luau dancers, roast pig, bar-b-que, clowns, a dunking booth and plenty of fun for all.

GETTYSBURG was again underway on 3-4 September in order to ensure all equipment was operational prior to Fleetex 1-93 which was conducted from 9-18 September in the VACAPES OPAREA. Enclosure (13) is the Fleetex 1-93 Letter of Instruction and gives guidance on how the exercise would be conducted. Enclosure (14) is the Fleetex 1-93 OPORDER and gives the scenario and tasking for participants in the exercise. Enclosure (15) is the Fleetex 1-93 Concept of Operations and gives an overview of the exercise and how units would participate. Enclosure (16) is the Fleetex 1-93 OPGEN providing more info on the scenario for the exercise. On 14 September 92 CINCLANTFLT, ADM H. H. Mauz, Jr., USN, visited GETTYSBURG. He toured the ship and talked with many of the crew members, and addressed the CPO mess and the Wardroom.

Upon completion of Fleetex the preoverseas movement leave period began and ran from 19 September - 05 October 92. In this period up to 50% of the crew at one time was allowed to take leave prior to GETTYSBURG's deployment. During the period 19 September -6 October GETTYSBURG was in an Intermediate Maintenance Availability (IMAV). Enclosure (17) is the IMAV quicklook and gives a short summary of the IMAV.





On 7 October 92 GETTYSBURG departed for her maiden deployment and transited the Atlantic from 8 - 19 October. Enclosures (18) is the MED 1-93 Standing OPGEN and provides the and (19)warfighting guidance for the KENNEDY Battlegroup during the deployment. Enclosure (20) is the INCHOP Casrep Summary and gives GETTYSBURG's reporting а Summary of CASREPs upon to the Mediterranean for duty. Enclosure (21) is GETTYSBURG'S OPSTAT UNIT from 14 October and gives the configuration of equipment in GETTYSBURG upon reporting for duty to Sixth Fleet. On 9 October 92 GETTYSBURG received word that she had been nominated for the 1993 Captain Edward Francis Ney Memorial Award for food service excel-Enclosure (22) is the message nomination. She INCHOPed lence. Sixth Fleet on 19 October 92 and continued transiting to the Ionian Sea for the turnover with the Saratoga Battlegroup. On 21 October 93 GETTYSBURG participated in an Italian/US Navy passive locating and tracking exercise with the ITS GARIBALDI. Enclosure (23) is a summary of the results of the exercise. GETTYSBURG conducted turnover with the USS THOMAS S GATES in the Adriatic Sea and conducted operations in the Adriatic Sea from 23-25 October as carrier escort for the USS JOHN F KENNEDY. They began transiting enroute to Naples on 29 October and arrived in Naples on 30 October 92.

GETTYSBURG was inport Naples from 31 October - 03 November during which the crew enjoyed well deserved liberty. The ships MWR committee arranged tours to many local areas including Rome, Enclosure (24) is a port visit report for Sorento and Pompei. Naples Italy giving costs for different services GETTYSBURG received inport. Enclosure (25) is a congratulatory message to JOHN F KENNEDY and GETTYSBURG for the excellent behavior of the crew while on liberty. Enclosure (26) is a Post Action Report for the Naples port visit giving a summary of events. On 04 November 92 GETTYSBURG began transiting south through the Straits of Sicily in company with the JOHN F KENNEDY enroute to Exercise MINOR MANAR 92-2 which was conduced on 8-9 November 92 with the Tunasian Air Force. On 9 November one of the Tunisian F-5 fighters crashed into GETTYSBURG raced to the scene and acted as the SAR on the sea. scene commander throughout the night until the Tunisian Air Force took over the SAR mission on the morning of the 10th. Enclosure (27) is the message tasking GETTYSBURG to assist in the search and rescue efforts. GETTYSBURG then proceeded to rejoin with the JOHN F KENNEDY who had already began the transit to Egypt for Exercise Seawind, which took place 13 - 21 November 92. Enclosures (28) and (29) give summaries of events conducted in the exercise. Enclosure (30) gives the lessons learned from Exercise Seawind. On 14 November JOHN F KENNEDY and GETTYSBURG anchored outside the harbor at Alexandria, Egypt for briefs on the exercise and meetings with officials from the Egyptian Navy.

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Upon completion of Exercise Seawind GETTYSBURG and JOHN F KENNEDY transited north to the Adriatic Sea and a port visit in Trieste, Italy. GETTYSBURG was inport with JOHN F KENNEDY from 26 - 29 November and sortied for operations in the Adriatic Sea on 30 November 92 -01 December where JOHN F KENNEDY conducted fight operations and GETTYSBURG acted as the Anti Air Warfare Commander for these operations. On 2 - 4 December 92, JOHN F KENNEDY and GETTYSBURG transited south for air operations in the Lybian Flight Information Region. These operations involved JOHN F KENNEDY's aircraft flying into air space which the Lybian government claims to exercise the right of control, but that the United States government does not recognize. On 5 December 92 GETTYSBURG was detached from JOHN F KENNEDY and returned to the Adriatic Sea to operate as the SAR/TRAP CG for operation provide promise from 5-17 December 92 with the USS GUAM. GETTYSBURG's mission was to track United Nations' relief flights into the former Yugoslavia and monitor for violations of the United Nations' declared no fly zone. On 14-17 December 92 an Engineering Training Group embarked GETTYSBURG to conduct an assist visit. On 18 - 20 December 92 GETTYSBURG transited in company with USS PUGET SOUND for a port visit in Toulon, France from 22 December - 03 January. During the transit, the pre-IMAV conference was held with the PUGET SOUND for the IMAV held in the TOULON port visit. The people of Toulon were extremely friendly and organized receptions, family get togethers, and sporting events to help GETTYSBURG's crew members have a Merry Christmas. GETTYSBURG's IMAV was very productive and many necessary repairs were completed prior to her departure on the morning of 4 January 1993.
