
4. NARRATIVE:

GETTYSBURG got underway from Toulon France on the 4th of January after celebrating Christmas and the New Year in port. GETTYSBURG then transited to the Adriatic Sea and patrolled in support of Operation "Provide Promise" off the coast of former Yugoslavia. While there, GETTYSBURG tracked all air traffic over the former Yugoslavia including the United Nations relief flights.

In the early morning hours of 17 January, GETTYSBURG was ordered to proceed to the Eastern Med at "best speed". Our mission was to support US forces following the Tomahawk missile attack on Iraq for their refusal to comply with United Nations nuclear material inspection requirements. GETTYSBURG operated in the Eastern Med from 21 - 28 January. After Iraq agreed to comply GETTYSBURG returned to the Adriatic Sea with a stop in Souda Bay Crete for upkeep and liberty from 29 January - 02 February. Enclosure (1) lists the costs of services in Souda Bay and enclosure (2) is the port visit post action report giving general information on the port visit.

From 4 - 19 February GETTYSBURG continued operations in the Adriatic Sea in support of Operation "Provide Promise". On 20 February GETTYSBURG left the Adriatic enroute to Augusta Bay, Sicily for an Intermediate Maintenance Availability (IMAV) with the USS PUGET SOUND. The IMAV was from 22 February to 5 March and during this time GETTYSBURG made use of the repair facilities on the PUGET SOUND to carry out repairs. Enclosure (3) is the supplemental SOPA instructions on the manner in which the port






visit would be conducted. Enclosure (4) is the Augusta Bay, Sicily Port Visit Post Action Report for Augusta Bay Sicily giving general information on the port visit.

Shortly after entering port GETTYSBURG received enclosure (5), the 1992 Battle Efficiency Results, announcing that GETTYSBURG had won the "Battle E". Enclosure (6) is a congratulatory message from COMCARGRU TWO for winning the "Battle E".

GETTYSBURG was underway on the 5th of March enroute for Antalya Turkey for a port visit and the Exercise Distant Thunder prebrief. GETTYSBURG embarked COMDESRON 36 on the 6th while underway in the Ionian Sea, and arrived 10 March in Antalya, Turkey. Enclosure (7) is the Port Visit After Action Report for Antalya, Turkey. Enclosure (8) is a list of costs incurred by GETTYSBURG in Antalyia. After getting underway on the 13th, GETTYSBURG was enroute to the Aegean Sea for "Exercise Distant Thunder". Enclosure (9) is the SHAREM 103 Draft Test Plan and contains the overall plan for the way the Anti Submarine Warfare exercises in "Distant Thunder" were conducted. Enclosures (10), (11), and (12) are First Impression Reports from the Turkish ship TCG GAYRET, COMDESRON 36, and GETTYSBURG. Enclosure (13) is a detailed chronology of events of "Distant Thunder-93". On the 19th of March GETTYSBURG and GAYRET conducted a Naval Gunfire Support exercise off of the coast of Turkey. Enclosures (14) and (15) are farewell messages from GETTYSBURG and GAYRET.

Upon completion of "Distant Thunder", GETTYSBURG was again enroute to Augusta Bay, Sicily for a port visit from 21 - 24 March 1993 for liberty and upkeep and to prepare for turnover with the THEODORE ROOSEVELT battlegroup. Enclosure (16) is the turnover information GETTYSBURG sent to USS HUE CITY to prepare them to assume duties in the Med. This message provides an excellent overview of all facets of our deployment to the Med. On 25 March GETTYSBURG was underway and conducted a turnover with USS HUE CITY in the Ionian Sea.

GETTYSBURG outchopped to the Sixth Fleet at 0500Z on the 28th of March and began her transit back to homeport with the JOHN F. KENNEDY Battlegroup. Enclosure (17) is the OPGEN for the Atlantic transit and gives general instructions on how the transit would be conducted. Enclosure (18) is a farewell message from Commander Sixth Fleet. GETTYSBURG arrived at homeport on the 7th of April.





GETTYSBURG conducted a Post Deployment Leave/Upkeep period from 8 April - 2 May. Enclosures (19) and (20) are public affairs releases which summarizes the deployment and provides interesting facts about the deployment for the press.

GETTYSBURG conducted operations in the Jacksonville Operations Area on 4-5 May with the Prospective Commanding Officer, Captain Peter R. Smith, to demonstrate the condition of the ship and her capabilities and operating characteristics. On 7 May Captain Peter R. Smith relieved Captain John M. Langknecht of command of USS GETTYSBURG. Enclosure (21) is the message announcing the change of command. Enclosure (22) is a change of command program book.


GETTYSBURG was underway from 10 - 14 May to Charleston, SC Weapons Station for post deployment weapons offload. GETTYSBURG was underway again for one day on the 17th of May for Deck Landing Qualifications services in the Jacksonville Operations Area. From 1-18 June GETTYSBURG was in an Intermediate Maintenance Availability with the USS YOSEMITE.

On the 20th of June GETTYSBURG was enroute to Norfolk to embark 2nd Class Midshipmen on the 22nd for CORTRAMID summer training exercises. GETTYSBURG conducted these training operations in the Virginia Capes Operations Area from the 23-24 June. Enclosure (23) is the schedule of events for CORTRAMID 93 and gives a detailed description of the training conducted for the midshipmen. GETTYSBURG disembarked the midshipmen in Norfolk and proceeded to Mayport, arriving on the 27th of June.

On the 3rd of July GETTYSBURG was underway enroute to the Maine operating area to embark the CRUDESGRU 8 staff and conduct exercises with the Russian ships MARSHAL USTINOV, ADMIRAL KHARLAMOV and DNESTR. These historic exercises were the most complex naval exercises conducted with the Russians since WWII and were the first since WWII that allowed US ships to be placed under the tactical command of a Russian commander. Enclosures (24) through (27) are operational situation reports from COMCRUDESGRU EIGHT describing the successful completion of Anti Submarine Warfare exercises, AAW exercise surface gunnery exercise, and helicopter operations including a Russian helix helo landing on the deck of GETTYSBURG. Enclosures (28) through (32) are congratulatory messages for the performance of GETTYSBURG's crew during the historic exercise.

GETTYSBURG was inport Boston from 8 - 10 July for a port visit with the Russian ships. There were several events designed to provide opportunities for the Russian and United States





sailors to interact. Each country hosted tours of their ships. GETTYSBURG was the location of a special dinner hosted by the Commander in Chief, Atlantic Fleet, Admiral Mauz for the Russian VIPs. American quests included:

Enclosure (33) lists some of the activities for the port visit and gives biographies for some of the Russian Admirals that were guests on GETTYSBURG. Upon leaving Boston, on 10 July, GETTYSBURG conducted more exercises as described in enclosure (34) and then said farewell to our Russian counterparts and continued on to a port visit in Newport, RI. On the 15th GETTYSBURG was enroute to homeport Mayport to arrive on the 16th. From the 17-25 of July GETTYSBURG was inport for leave and upkeep.

On the 20th of July the annual Ney contest's award winners were announced for which GETTYSBURG finished first in the Atlantic Fleet. The Ney Award is to recognize those ships with outstanding food service programs. Enclosure (35) is the message announcing the results of the competition.

Over the next few months GETTYSBURG got underway several times for Engineering Training Group (ETG) assist visits in which





the ship was preparing for the Operational Propulsion Plant Examination (OPPE). These underway periods were times of intense training in the engineering plants and for our damage control organization on how to fight main space fires. From the 26-30 July GETTYSBURG conducted the Mid Cycle Engineering Training Group Assist Visit with underway operations and drills in the Jacksonville Operations Area from 28-30 July.

GETTYSBURG was inport from 31 July - 8 August. GETTYSBURG was again underway from 9-12 August for Engineering Training for OPPE in the Jacksonville Operations Area. GETTYSBURG conducted a dependents cruise on 12 August and hosted over 350 family members and friends for a day's cruise. All enjoyed seeing the ship in action and seeing their loved ones at work. The festivities included a steel deck picnic and an air show provided by some of the local air squadrons.

GETTYSBURG was underway from 16-20 of August for the Mid Cycle ETG Assist Visit and again underway from 31 August - 2 September in the Jacksonville Operations Area for OPPE preparations and training.

After many hours of intense training and preparations GETTYSBURG conducted the OPPE from 8-10 September with the underway portion in the Jacksonville Operations Area from 9-10 September. Enclosure (36) are the results of the OPPE in which GETTYSBURG received a satisfactory with an adjective grade of GOOD. Enclosure (37) is a congratulatory message from COMCARGRU TWO for the outstanding performance of the crew of GETTYSBURG.

GETTYSBURG was inport from the 18 September - 6 October. During this time final preparations were made for a two month deployment to the Caribbean for Counter Narcotics Operations. GETTYSBURG was underway with HSL 48 Detachment Three embarked on the 7th enroute to the Puerto Rican Operations Area. GETTYSBURG conducted Combat System Operational Sequencing System (CSOSS) Training enroute to train the Combat Information Center watchteams on different battle scenarios. GETTYSBURG successfully conducted Naval Gunfire Support (NGFS) exercise at the NGFS range at Vieques to qualify the NGFS teams on the 12-13 October. Enclosure (38) is the specific results of the NGFS qualification shoot.

GETTYSBURG then entered port at Roosevelt Roads Puerto Rico to Embark the Legal Detachment 8-B and COMCARIBRON staff. The legal detachment were Coast Guard personnel who would be used to board vessels in the Caribbean to search for contraband. COMCARIBRON was the embarked Coast Guard staff that was responsible to JOINT TASK FORCE FOUR for coordinating the counter





responsible to JOINT TASK FORCE FOUR for coordinating the counter narcotics efforts of USN units in the Caribbean.

Before leaving port on 15 October in Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico, GETTYSBURG was diverted from her assigned Narcotics Operations mission to support Haitian Presence Operations that would eventually be called Operation "Support Democracy". GETTYSBURG was assigned as COMMANDER TASK GROUP 28.1 to coordinate the initial Naval Presence Operation until additional ships could be deployed to relieve them. Other ships involved in the initial presence operations were the USS CARON, USS STERETT, USS KLAKRING, USS VICKSBURG, AND USS JACK WILLIAMS. The initial mission was to take station four nautical miles off the coast of the major cities of Haiti, Cap Haitien, Port au Prince, and Jeremie in order to be visible and show the United States' interest in the return to power of the democratically elected President of Haiti, Jean Aristede. Enclosures (39) and (40) are the authorizations to close Haiti to within four nautical miles. Enclosure (41) lists the ships that were nominated to replace the ships initially tasked with the Haitian Operations. Enclosure (42) is a situation report from CINCLANTFLT reporting the status and location of forces initially assigned to the Haitian Presence Operations. Enclosure (43) is the daily intentions message from CTG 28.1 (GETTYSBURG) giving area of patrol and instructions for the ships in the Haitian Presence Operations.

United Nations Security Resolution 841 and 873 imposed a follow-on embargo on Haiti. Enclosure (44) is a Navarea warning to vessels in the region of Haiti of the embargo. Enclosure (45) is the OPORDER and gives a concept of operations and procedures for the way the Haitian embargo would be carried out. Enclosure (46) is the OPTASK Maritime Interception Operations and gives more specific directions on the execution of embargo operation.

GETTYSBURG was released from Operation "Support Democracy" on the morning of the 23rd of October as indicated in Enclosure (47). She was then ordered to begin counter narcotics operations as indicated in the initial patrol orders, enclosure (48). Enclosure (49) is a farewell and thank you for the outstanding performance of GETTYSBURG as the first ship on the scene for the Haitian Presence Operations.

GETTYSBURG stopped briefly in Guantanamo Bay Cuba from 23-24 October for fuel and supplies and was again underway on the 24th to conduct Counter Narcotics Operations. After patrolling the Western Caribbean with negative results GETTYSBURG began the transit to the East for a port visit in Barbados. While enroute, GETTYSBURG detected a small wooden boat about 180 nautical miles off the coast of Santa Marta, Columbia. Suspecting illegal





narcotics activities, GETTYSBURG requested a statement of No objection from Columbia to conduct a boarding and search of the MV CHANO. However, while awaiting the reply from Columbia, the USS AUBREY FITCH relieve GETTYSBURG on station in order to allow GETTYSBURG to keep a scheduled underway replenishment and port visit in Barbados. Enclosures (50) and (51) give the account of the subsequent seizure of over 12000 lbs of marijuana.

GETTYSBURG conducted a port visit in Bridgetown, Barbados from 4-8 November. Enclosure (52) is the after action report. Enclosure (53) is the message of appreciation for the manner in which the port visit was conducted form the American embassy in Barbados.

Upon leaving Barbados GETTYSBURG patrolled along a route that took her to a position off the south coast of Jamaica. On the 20th of November a maritime patrol aircraft detected a small speed boat on a northerly course. Upon questioning the boat it turned south and took off at a high speed. GETTYSBURG took up the chase and finally caught the small boat SHADOW after a 360 NM chase which took place over a 12 hour period at a sustained speed of 30 plus knots. The boat was found to be carrying an estimated two metric tons of cocaine. Enclosures (54) through (69) are situation reports on the chase and capture of the Columbian vessel "SHADOW". Enclosure (70) is an intelligence report stating information learned upon boarding SHADOW and talking to the owners. Enclosures (71) and (72) are congratulations for the outstanding performance demonstrated during the chase of SHADOW.

After towing the vessel SHADOW to Isla De San Andres, Columbia and transferring custody of the boat, seized contraband and three prisoners to Columbian military authorities, GETTYSBURG then proceeded Roosevelt Roads, PR for turnover and preparations for a vandalex the first week of December. GETTYSBURG was inport from 28 November through 1 December where the Legal Detachment 8-B disembarked.

GETTYSBURG was underway on 1 December enroute to the VACAPES for a missile firing exercise with the USS VELLA GULF. VELLA GULF made the transit to the VACAPES from the Puerto Rican operations areas with GETTYSBURG to maximize the training opportunities. On the 6th GETTYSBURG conducted the Vandalex off the VACAPES. Enclosure (73) is the results of the shoot and explains the sequence of events for the exercise.

GETTYSBURG returned to homeport on the 8th of December after conducting helicopter deck landing qualifications for helicopter pilots based in Mayport on the 7th of December. Enclosure (74)





is GETTYSBURG's post deployment report and contains lessons from the deployment. Enclosure (75) is the PAO release giving a summary of the deployment for the press. GETTYSBURG closed out the year with Christmas leave and upkeep.
