2. Command Composition and Organization

a. USS GREENEVILLE (SSN 772) is a multi-mission capable, nuclear powered, fast attack submarine. GREENEVILLE is certified to perform anti-submarine warfare, anti-surface warfare, special operations insertion and extraction, TOMAHAWK missile strikes and Mother Submarine (MOSUB) operations. She is the test platform for the Advanced SEAL Delivery System (ASDS), an innovative new special operations vehicle.

b. GREENEVILLE's immediate superior in command is Commander, Submarine Squadron ONE. She is commanded by Commander Scott D. Waddle, and is homeported at Naval Station, Pearl Harbor, HI.

#### 4. Narrative

a. GREENEVILLE began 1999 in Apra Harbor, Guam in a holiday stand-down period while on its maiden Western Pacific deployment. On 22 January, the ship returned to its homeport of Pearl Harbor, HI.

b. On 2 November, Greeneville conducted a deep submergence rescue vehicle exercise with the Japanese Maritime Self Defense Force. DSRV-2 AVALON made multiple transfers of personnel between the GREENEVILLE and the bottomed Japanese sub.

c. On 6 November, GREENEVILLE left Pearl Harbor for a two-month Eastern Pacific Deployment. During this period, the ship participated in a Joint Tactical Fleet Exercise for the JOHN C STENNIS CVBG, a number of developmental torpedo firing exercises, and conducted a port visit in Victoria, Canada. The ship returned to Pearl Harbor on 20 December and ended the year in a holiday stand-down period.
