<u>Narrative</u>:

The New Year was spent in Newport making preparations for the transit to Charleston SC and GUARDIAN departed on 4 January. GUARDIAN arrived in Charleston on 6 January. The next two days were used preparing for the month long minehunting training and exercises. 09 through 11 January were spent in the Charleston Operating Area conducting minehunting operations. 11 through 14 January GUARDIAN was inport making preparations for the next underway. 14 January through 01 February GUARDIAN conducted minehunting and minesweeping operations as well as testing with the MNS vehicle. The operations were conducted with various mechanical, magnetic and acoustic sweeps. The magnetic sweeps were used in both open and closed loops. All weekends were spent inport conducting preventative and corrective maintenance.

On 03 February GUARDIAN departed Charleston, SC enroute to Newport, RI and arrived in Newport on 06 February. 06 February through 17 March were spent inport conducting maintenance with the exception of 28 February GUARDIAN left port for the day to conduct engine testing.

March was spent preparing for the trip to Port Everglades, FL and Charleston, SC. During this trip GUARDIAN was to conduct minehunting exercises before deploying to the Persian Gulf. USS GUARDIAN departed Newport on 18 March and arrived in Port Everglades late on 21 March. The next couple of days the crew had holiday routine and liberty in Port Everglades. On 27 March GUARDIAN departed for Charleston, SC.

30 March through 05 April were spent in Charleston, SC at Pier Y conducting tests on GUARDIAN's magnetic signature and preparations to conduct open degaussing ranging in the Charleston Operating Area. USS GUARDIAN ran the degaussing range from 06 April to the 11 April. 12 April through 16 April were spent at Pier Y continuing the testing on GUARDIAN's magnetic signature. The next couple of days were spent in the Charleston Operating Area completing the remaining runs on the degaussing range. On 20 April, USS GUARDIAN departed for Newport, RI, arriving on 22 April and spent the remainder of the month inport preparing for the Persian Gulf deployment.

May commenced USS GUARDIAN's nearly year long deployment to the Persian Gulf. Departing on the first of May for Naval Annex, Bermuda with USS HOIST (ARS-40). 3 - 4 May were spent inport Bermuda. 4 May GUARDIAN and USNS APACHE (T-ATF 172) departed for Malaga, Spain. The two ships arrived on 17 May in Malaga, Spain and spent the next two days refueling and making repairs. On 19 May USS GUARDIAN and USNS APACHE departed for Augusta, Italy. They arrived on 24 May and stayed for a day while they refueled and preparing for the next leg to Port Said, Egypt. The GUARDIAN departed on 25 May enroute to Port Said. **GUARDIAN** arrived Port Said three days later and anchored to refuel and load stores before continuing to Djibouti, DJ through the Suez Canal. GUARDIAN arrived in Djibouti on 04 June and stayed the day before she continued to Abu Dhabi, U.A.E. USS GUARDIAN arrived in Abu Dhabi on 12 June and stayed for two days.

13 through 17 June USS GUARDIAN conducted degaussing ranging. minehunting drills, and gunnery exercises in preparation for entering the various mine danger areas. On 18 June the GUARDIAN anchored to receive orders from COMUSMCMGRU as well as fuel and stores. Later that day GUARDIAN departed for two weeks to conduct minehunting operations in Mine Danger Area #7 Minefield *#5*. On 21 June USS GUARDIAN found her first mine and neutralized it with the MNS vehicle. After spending many grueling hours at General Quarters conducting minehunting operations, GUARDIAN spent 12 hours on 21 June at anchor outside of Minefield #5. The next twelve days saw much of the same. GUARDIAN would use her sonar to find mines then use the MNS vehicle to neutralize In all 29 mines were found and destroyed including: them. 15 LUGM-145s, 13 UDM Acoustic Influence Bottom Mines and 1 MO8.

02 July GUARDIAN transited back to Mina Sulman, Bahrain along with the USS ADROIT (MSO-509). GUARDIAN arrived late on the same day and remained inport until 06 July in Mina Sulman, Bahrain. On 06 July USS ADROIT (MSO-509), USS LEADER (MSO-490), and GUARDIAN departed for the North Arabian Gulf to Mine Danger Area *#*10. On 16 July GUARDIAN moored along side USS TEXAS (CGN-39) to refuel and receive stores. 17 July GUARDIAN transited back to Mine Danger Area #7 Minefield #5 for three days of operations. On 19 July GUARDIAN transited to Abu Dhabi, U.A.E. 22 through 26 July GUARDIAN moored in Abu Dhabi, U.A.E. 26 July through 10 August USS LEADER (MSO-490) and the GUARDIAN were underway to Mine Danger Area #10 to conduct minehunting operations. COMUSMCMGRU was onboard while conducting operations. On 12 August GUARDIAN was enroute to Kuwait City, Kuwait and stayed there for three days. 15 August GUARDIAN transited back to Mina Sulman, Bahrain. GUARDIAN remained inport for five days while making repairs, refueling, and replenishing stores. On 24 August GUARDIAN transited back to the North Arabian Gulf conducting helo recovery operations in Z Box 3, 5, 7 and 8 looking for a downed Saudi Arabian Helicopter. GUARDIAN conducted the search from 24 August to 02 September, however, the helicopter was never found and the search was called off by the Saudi Arabians.

On 02 September GUARDIAN departed for the Kuwaiti Coast to conduct minehunting operations. From 04 to 11 September GUARDIAN conducted minehunting operations in Box Hotel, Box Bravo Two and Sierra Two. On September 11 GUARDIAN exited the mine fields and conducted minehunting operations outside of Ash Shuwaikh, Kuwait. On 13 September GUARDIAN was underway to Al Jubayl, Saudi Arabia. GUARDIAN arrived in Al Jubayl on the 14th and left the next day for the USS PELELIU (LHA-5) anchorage to conduct Helo search operations. On 17 September USS MERRILL (DD-976), USS ADROIT (MSO-509), USS LEADER (MSO-490), and GUARDIAN were enroute to Mina Sulman, Bahrain. GUARDIAN remained in Bahrain until 19 September then departed for Abu Dahbi, U.A.E. GUARDIAN returned to Mina Sulman, Bahrain on 23 September and spent the next three weeks preparing for the crew change over with the USS DEVASTATOR'S Crew.

On 15 Oct, 1991 the crew formerly of USS DEVASTATOR (MCM 6) relieved the crew of USS GUARDIAN (MCM 5) deployed to the Persian Gulf. This was the "first ever" crew swap of a MCM vessel. On that day at Mina Sulman, Manama Bahrain, LCDR. Daine E. Eisold assumed the responsibilities of Commanding Officer USS GUARDIAN from CDR. George Smith.

After five days of upkeep in Bahrain, GUARDIAN was underway to conduct search operations in the North Persian Gulf. GUARDIAN was to locate and mark an AHIPS helicopter and an F/A-18 both downed during post-war operations. USNS SIOUX was in company to provide fuel and diver support to GUARDIAN and assist in the salvage effort. GUARDIAN departed Bahrain 20 OCT 1991 for the area of the F/A-18's with Captain William R. Grainer, Commander, US Mine Countermeasures Group embarked. On 21 Oct 1991, GUARDIAN located and marked the wreckage of the F/A-18. USS L. Y. SPEAR arrived on the scene 23 Oct 1991 to assist in the salvage effort. Later that same day SIOUX picked up the F/A-18 wreckage and placed to on the deck of L. Y. SPEAR. After salvage operations were completed, GUARDIAN departed for the AHIPS salvage site. The AHIPS wreckage was located on 24 Oct 1991 and marked. SIOUX made the recovery, GUARDIAN headed for Jubail, Saudi Arabia.


GUARDIAN arrived at Jubail, Saudi Arabia on 28 Oct 1991 for fuel and a brief on the upcoming minehunting operations in Mine Danger Area 10. The brief was followed by a wardroom luncheon with dignitaries from the King Abdul Aziz Naval Station. GUARDIAN departed Jubail on 29 Oct 1991 for Mine Danger Area 10 operations.

GUARDIAN was on station in Mine Danger Area 10 from 30 Oct 1991 to 19 Nov 1991. These operations involved extensive shallow water minehunting evolutions. GUARDIAN received fuel support from USNS SIOUX. SIOUX also carried an EOD detachment for diving operations. GUARDIAN and SIOUX received support against potential hostile forces from USS TRUXTON, USS ELLIOT and USS STARK. These 21 days of minehunting produced the location of one mine anchor that had already lost its mine and verified the assigned area safe for navigation.

On 20 Nov 1991, GUARDIAN transited to Kuwait City Harbor and anchored. The following day GUARDIAN conducted a lead through for USS SAIPAN, USS NASHVILLE and USS HARLAN COUNTY. GUARDIAN then transited back to Bahrain for two days of upkeep. Upon arriving in Bahrain, Commander, US Mine Countermeasures Group disembarked.

On 25 Nov 1991, GUARDIAN departed Bahrain for a Thanksgiving holiday in Dubai, U.A.E. After four days in Dubai, GUARDIAN made her way back to Bahrain for an availability with the USS YOSEMITE also inport Bahrain. The availability lasted from 03 Dec 1991 to 12 Dec 1991. On 13 Dec 1991 GUARDIAN departed Bahrain for Jubail, Saudi Arabia. GUARDIAN was to assist Saudi Naval Forces in their search for a downed Royal Saudi Naval Forces helicopter. Upon arrival in Jubail on 14 Dec 1991 the weather deteriorated preventing the Saudi search and salvage vessels from getting underway. GUARDIAN remained inport Jubail from 14 Dec 1991 to 17 Dec 1991 waiting for the weather to clear. The weather never cleared to the Saudi's satisfaction, thus GUARDIAN departed Jubail alone on 17 Dec 1991 to conduct a solo search. GUARDIAN searched until 20 Dec without locating the aircraft. On 21 Dec 1991 GUARDIAN broke off her search efforts and sailed for Abu Dhabi, U.A.E.

GUARDIAN arrived at Abu Dhabi on 23 Dec 1991 and spent five days, including Christmas, inport. GUARDIAN departed Abu Dhabi on 29 Dec for Bahrain. On 30 Dec 1991 GUARDIAN arrived in Bahrain for the start of a two week upkeep period.

2. Due to the crew swap between the crews of USS DEVASTATOR (MCM 6) and USS GUARDIAN (MCM 5) on 15 October 1991, the former crew of USS DEVASTATOR is now permanently assigned to USS GUARDIAN. As a result of this transition, I can only currently account for the command's history starting with 15 October 1991. That history covering the period of 15 October 1991 through 31 December 1991 is respectfully submitted. I regret the tardiness of this report and any inconvenience it may have caused. I am continuing efforts to reconstruct the command's history and account for the period of 1 January 1991 through 14 October 1991. I am pursuing this by contacting key personnel that were assigned to USS GUARDIAN during the period and also reviewing the ship's deck logs. I will forward the final results of that effort as soon possible.

<u>Narrative</u>:

On 15 Oct 1991, the crew formerly of USS DEVASTATOR (MCM 6) relieved the crew of USS GUARDIAN (MCM 5) deployed to the Persian Gulf. This was the "first ever" crew swap of an MCM vessel. On that day at Mina Sulman, Manama, Bahrain, LCDR Daine E. Eisold assumed the responsibilities of Commanding Officer USS GUARDIAN from CDR George Smith.

After five days of upkeep in Bahrain, GUARDIAN was underway to conduct search operations in the Northern Persian Gulf. GUARDIAN was to locate and mark an AHIPS helicopter and an F/A-18 both downed during post-war operations. USNS SIOUX was in company to provide fuel and diver support to GUARDIAN and assist in the salvage effort. GUARDIAN departed Bahrain 20 Oct 1991 for the area of the F/A-18's downing with Captain William R. Grainer, Commander, US Mine Countermeasures Group embarked. On 21 Oct 1991, GUARDIAN located and marked the wreckage of the F/A-18. USS L. Y. SPEAR arrived on the scene 23 Oct 1991 to assist in the salvage effort. Later that same day SIOUX picked up the F/A-18 wreckage and placed it on the deck of L. Y. SPEAR. After salvage operations were complete, GUARDIAN departed for the AHIPS salvage site. The AHIPS wreckage was located on 24 Oct 1991 and marked. SIOUX made recovery of wreckage 25 Oct 1991. After recovery, GUARDIAN headed for Jubail, Saudi Arabia.

GUARDIAN arrived at Jubail, Saudi Arabia on 28 Oct 1991 for fuel and a brief on the upcoming mine hunting operations in Mine Danger Area 10. The brief was followed by a wardroom luncheon with dignitaries from The King Abdul Aziz Naval Station. GUARDIAN departed Jubail on 29 Oct 1991 for Mine Danger Area 10 operations.

GUARDIAN was on station in Mine Danger Area 10 from 30 Oct 1991 to 19 Nov 1991. These operations involved extensive shallow water mine hunting evolutions. GUARDIAN received fuel support from USNS SIOUX. SIOUX also carried an EOD detachment for diving operations. GUARDIAN and SIOUX received support against potential hostile forces from USS TRUXTON, USS ELLIOT and USS STARK. These 21 days of mine hunting produced the location of one mine anchor that had already lost its mine and verified the assigned area safe for navigation.

On 20 Nov 1991, GUARDIAN transited to Kuwait City Harbor and anchored. The following day GUARDIAN conducted a lead through for USS SAIPAN, USS NASHVILLE and USS HARLAN COUNTY. GUARDIAN then transited back to Bahrain for two days of upkeep. Upon arriving in Bahrain, Commander, US Mine Countermeasures Group disembarked.

On 25 Nov 1991, GUARDIAN departed Bahrain for a Thanksgiving holiday in Dubai, U. A. E. After four days in Dubai, GUARDIAN made her way back to Bahrain for an availability with the USS YOSEMITE also inport Bahrain. The availability lasted from 03 Dec 1991 to 12 Dec 1991. On 13 Dec 1991 GUARDIAN departed Bahrain for Jubail, Saudi Arabia. GUARDIAN was to assist Saudi Naval Forces in their search for a downed Royal Saudi Naval Forces helicopter. Upon arrival in Jubail on 14 Dec 1991, the weather deteriorated preventing the Saudi search and salvage vessels from getting underway. GUARDIAN remained inport Jubail from 14 Dec 1991 to 17 Dec 1991 waiting for the weather to clear. The weather never cleared to the Saudi's satisfaction, thus GUARDIAN departed Jubail alone on 17 Dec 1991 to conduct a solo search. GUARDIAN searched until 20 Dec 1991 without locating the aircraft. On 21 Dec 1991 GUARDIAN broke off her search efforts and headed for Abu Dhabi, U. A. E.

GUARDIAN arrived at Abu Dhabi on 23 Dec 1991 and spent five days, including Christmas, inport. GUARDIAN departed Abu Dhabi on 29 Dec 1991 for Bahrain. On 30 Dec 1991 GUARDIAN arrived in Bahrain for the start of a two week upkeep period.

This command history only covers the period from 15 Oct 1991 to 31 Dec 1991 due to the crew swap between the crews of USS DEVASTATOR (MCM 6) and USS GUARDIAN (MCM5). This crew, formally the USS DEVASTATOR crew, has been on GUARDIAN since 15 Oct 1991.
