### Narrative.

RICKOVER completed a multimillion dollar Depot Modernization Period (DMP) in February of 1993 which dramatically changed the configuration of the Sonar Systems by the addition of a TB 23 towed array and the BQQ-5D system upgrade. Many additional sound quieting modifications were also installed during the ten month shipyard period. In early February, Rickover returned to sea for Post DMP Sea Trials. Following a week of exercises with USS America in early March, the crew relaxed during a very rewarding port visit to Bermuda. A Weapons Systems Acceptance Test (WSAT) was conducted in Port Everglades Florida and the Autec range in late March prior to returning to Norfolk for an Underway Material Inspection in April.

On 12 April, RICKOVER entered drydock to begin preparations for a purification media discharge. During the upkeep period two new communications systems, ELF and DAMA were installed to support the upcoming Mediterranean deployment with the George Washington Battle Group. RICKOVER hosted officials from the General Accounting Office and Admirals of the Indian Navy before commencing Sonar training with USS Miami in early July. RICKOVER returned to Port Everglades in mid July for a port visit and orientation cruise for distinguished businessmen and educators from the Chicago area.

RICKOVER completed weapons certification and sound trials in the Tongue of the Ocean and Exuma Sound before returning to Norfolk for an upkeep. Hurricane Emily changed the pace of the upkeep which included major work to the ship's service motor generator rotors, repairs to the trim pump, and installation of automatic direction finding capability.

A Tiger Cruise was conducted in October during the transit to Port Everglades for the Broward County Navy Days. A small group of fathers and other relatives joined the ranks of Honorary Submariners and RICKOVER once again relaxed in Port Everglades. Congressional staff members received an orientation cruise upon Rickover's departure from Port Everglades.

Following exercises in the Gulf of Mexico and Autec, RICKOVER returned to Norfolk to begin the preparations for deployment. Training for the George Washington Battle Group, tactical installations, and a tour for the editor of Rolling Stones magazine highlighted this period.

The final days of 1993 were spent with friends and family awaiting the excitement of 1994.
