## COMMAND HISTORY OF 1986

1. In January 1986, USS JACKSONVILLE completed an inspection by the Naval Board of Inspection and Survey which determined that material condition of the ship was excellent. An Defense Nuclear Security Inspection was successfully completed during the last week of January.
2. February 1986 found the USS JACKSONVILLE participating in Fleet Exercise 1-86 and working up for a Tactical Readiness Examination (TRE). The TRE was completed successfully and the ship was six for six during the Torpedo Proficiency Firing.
3. During the first week of March, USS JACKSONVILLE made a port visit to its namesake city. The ship and crew were warmly welcomed and treated to a party and awards ceremony sponsored by the Navy League of Jacksonville, Florida.
4. USS JACKSONVILLE returned to Norfolk for a Pre-Overseas Movement (POM) upkeep during the first weeks of April. The ship successfully completed POM certification and deployed to the Western Atlantic to conduct Anti-Submarine Warfare Operations on 25 April.
5. May and June found USS JACKSONVILLE patrolling the waters of the North Atlantic. A port visit to Portsmouth, England on 13-16 June was conducted. The ship then transited back to Norfolk and returned on 29 June.
6. During the month of July USS JACKSONVILLE completed short post deployment stand down upkeep. On July 21-25, USS JACKSONVILLE supported Midshipmen training operations by conducting orientation cruises between Norfolk, VA and Charleston, SC.
7. On 1 August, USS JACKSONVILLE commenced the ship's second Selected Restricted Availability (SRA II) in the USS RESOLUTE AFDM-10 at Norfolk Naval Base. The SRA was completed by Norfolk Naval Shipyard on 3 October.
8. During the first weeks of October, USS JACKSONVILLE began workups for Operation Reactor Safeguards Examination (ORSE). A port visit was made to Port Canaveral, Florida during the period 23-24 October. USS JACKSONVILLE then transited to Norfolk, completing ORSE preparations. On 30-31 October the ORSE was completed with an evaluation of Above Average for the second consecutive year.
9. November commenced with an upkeep period for USS JACKSONVILLE. On 12-13 November the ship completed an a Naval Technical Proficiency Inspection (NTPI) in a outstanding fashion.
10. The first weeks of December found USS JACKSONVILLE preparing for TRE. On the transit to the weapons range a Communications Readiness Exercise (CRE) was conducted with the ship receiving a grade of Excellent. TRE was conducted on 16-17 December. The ship fired six torpedos and was evaluated as Above Average, and a TRE Top Performer. During the transit back to homeport a POM workup was accomplished. The last weeks of 1986 found USS JACKSONVILLE in a Holiday upkeep period.
