

USS JOHN C. STENNIS (CVN 74) 2002 COMMAND HISTORY

1. Part I - Command Composition and Organization

a. Mission of USS JOHN C. STENNIS (CVN 74). The mission of USS JOHN C. STENNIS (CVN 74) and her embarked Air Wing is to conduct sustained combat air operations while forward deployed in the global arena.

b. Organizational Structure

(1) Immediate Senior in Command is Commander, Carrier Group SEVEN.

(2) The Commanding Officer is Captain James A. McDonell. He assumed command of USS JOHN C. STENNIS (CVN 74) on 16 November 2001.

(3) The Executive Officer is Captain Mark Sickert, USN. He assumed duties as Executive Officer in July 2001.

(4) The Command Master Chief is CMDCM(SW) Terry Etherton, USN. He assumed duties as Command Master Chief in March 2002.

c. On 1 January 2002, 3,479 JCS personnel were on board: 215 Officers and 3,264 enlisted personnel. Since we were deployed until 28 May 2002, the following numbers are provided for Carrier Group SEVEN, Carrier Air Wing NINE and Destroyer Squadron TWO ONE which was embarked on board USS JOHN C. STENNIS (CVN 74): Total of 1,846 personnel; 319 Officers and 1,527 enlisted personnel. Total personnel deployed in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM were 5,325.

3. Part III - Narrative Summary of Events/Accomplishments

JANUARY

Operation ENDURING FREEDOM - AIMD maintained all 334 complex avionics test benches at an availability rate of 99%. AIMD's RADAR shop troubleshot and repaired an F-14 RADAR antenna. The entire dismantling and reassembling process took 3 days. This depot level repair SAVED \$42,410 in depot repairable charges and kept the critical asset in theater.

In January, the Nuclear Propulsion Mobile Training Team (NPMTT) conducted their first visit, in a series of three, in preparation for the Operational Reactor Safeguards Examination (ORSE).

Operation ENDURING FREEDOM - Ground Support Equipment (GSE) division maintained a noteworthy 97.4% support equipment ready for issue (RFI) rate for all support equipment. The also maintained a record 100% availability for all mission essential support equipment. SE maintained 1,242 pieces of support equipment (aircraft) with an availability of 99%. The Micro-miniature 2M Work center performed 5,065 cable and circuit board repairs during deployment. Of note, they fabricated a cable for a weapons elevator.

MARCH

Operation ENDURING FREEDOM - The outstanding performance of the Ship's Calibration Lab resulted in JOHN C STENNIS winning the Measure Outstanding Activity Award. An overdue rate of less than 2% is required to qualify for this award. Our rate is under 1%. Best rate in the fleet. During combat operations, AIMD's Infra-red (FLIR) shop repaired 23 FLIR Pod Aft Sections. The rapid turnaround times ensured maximum flexibility in combat mission assignment between all three Air Wing F/A-18 squadrons.

The Educational Services Office held March exams totaling 1,062 Navy-Wide examinations for the following paygrades: 298 for E-4 paygrade (180 advanced = 60.73%); 574 for E-5 paygrade (123 advanced = 21.42%); and 190 for E-6 paygrade (44 advanced = 22.63%).

During March, the COMNAVAIRPAC NPMTT returned for their second visit to assess the department's progress in preparing for ORSE. The inspection included casualty control drills, level of knowledge testing and interviews, and a thorough administrative review. The NPMTT determined the department was progressing in the right direction.

Public Affairs - Encouraged by the tremendous success of the documentary, "The Real West Wing," NBC came onboard USS John C. Stennis to follow this up with an even bigger and better production tentatively called "Inside an Aircraft Carrier." The show, which aired in prime time on 17 Apr 02 was hosted by Tom Brokaw. The premise of the program was an intense, never before seen look at 24 hours in the life of an aircraft carrier at war. NBC's plan was to conduct two survey visits to JCS (20-24 Feb & Week of 4 Mar) and to shoot the documentary on 25 Mar. Brokaw arrived on the ship on 24 Mar and departed 26 Mar. Other unit production members arrived on 17 Mar to facilitate streaming the rest of the NBC crew to the ship. Total number of NBC personnel reached to 35 made this production a success.

APRIL

Operation ENDURING FREEDOM - The ship's Calibration Lab completed 2668 IMRL calibrations and repaired 426 Avionic items. The Jet Engine Repair shop repaired and issued 65 engine assemblies in support of Carrier Air Wing NINE. AIMD's Avionics modular repair shop performed depot level maintenance on two Control Indicators. SAVED \$115,500. AIMD-BFIMA completed 15 line item repairs and calibration support for 657 items with over 3,000 man-hours expended. 99.6% of jobs submitted were completed.

In April, the Chaplain's department coordinated community relations (COMREL) projects at the Children's Ward and the Painted Sea Faring Center in Perth, Australia.

Reactor department made significant improvements in casualty control response, level of knowledge, and cleanliness in preparation for ORSE. NPMTT completed the third of three visits. This visit served as a dress rehearsal for the upcoming ORSE.

AIMD's Non-Destructive Inspection (NDI) shop repaired, completed, tested and checked 10,000 components/assets during deployment and maintained a 78% Ready-for-Issue rate.

In May, Reactor Department successfully completed another Operational Reactor Safeguards Examination, continuing a high standard set during three previous examinations.
