COMMAND NARRATIVE

USS JOHN PAUL JONES (DDG 53)

01 JANUARY TO 31 DECEMBER 1998

- 14 Jan DSRA. JOHN PAUL JONES continued preparations for the upcoming Dry-Docking Selected Restrictive Availability (DSRA). This CNO availability, centered around the installation of a plastic waste processor, included machinery alterations and configuration changes to equipment belonging to all departments.
- 27 Mar Family Day Cruise. One day underway to show approximately 230 guests and family members the ship and sailors working at sea.
- 02 Apr Change of Command. Commander Bruce Hamilton was relieved by Commander Edward L. Brownlee. Captain David Ryan, COMDESRON SEVEN was the guest speaker.
- 03 Apr Rear Admiral Lafleur, COMCRUDESGRU ONE conducted an Admiral's call and visit onboard JOHN PAUL JONES.
- 02-04 Jun TBMD. Acted as host ship for a Multi-National conference on Theater Ballistic Missile Defense. Admiral Hutching, USN, and Lieutenant General Lyes, USAF Ballistic Missile Defense Office, were onboard. Tours were given for many foreign dignitaries and officials.
- 26-27 Jun Joint Civilian Orientation Conference. JOHN PAUL JONES hosted fifty nine guests of Secretary of Defense Cohen. Many of these influential people had very positive comments concerning the sailors they met, many were impressed by the 20 year old sailors that are manning our ships today. A Bravo Zulu message was received from the honorable Mr. John H. Dalton, Secretary of the Navy.
- 15-16 Jul MISSILEX 1998. Conducted two standard missile firing tests as part of TSTA I at Naval Air Warfare Center, Weapons Division, Point Mugu, California. USS CHANDLER (DDG 996) also participated. Stream raid target with 50ft presentation altitude. Lead target was hit, trail target was missed due to missile failure.
- 04-05 Aug Ballistic Missile Defense Conference. Ship conducted more tours for dignitaries and demonstration of the TBMD system.
- 06-07 Aug FIREX I. Completed FIREX I at San Clemente Island. Exercise was scored in accordance with FXP-5. Final exercise grade was 96.7%, "OUTSTANDING."

- 13-16 Aug Fleet Week. Ship moored to Broadway Pier San Diego, CA. Four days of tours, hosted nearly 7,000 visitors including the author Tom Clancy.
- $10-12\ \text{Nov}$ Conducted an underway replenishment with the USS CONSTELLATION.
- 13 Nov CMTQ. Ship was recommended for cruise missile qualification having completed the qualification and certification program. Three of three areas assessed as satisfactory.
- 16-19 Nov ECERT. Propulsion Examining Board assessed USS JOHN PAUL JONES, certified for unrestricted operations and integrated training, ready to operate. 9 of 11 programs were evaluated as effective.
- 20 Nov-02 Dec FEP. Completed FEP 02 Dec. All training and watch teams met FEP readiness standards except AW and STK, both were evaluated as TSTA III. Training teams determined to be capable of achieving and maintaining FEP levels of performance in all mission areas.
- 23-25 Nov FIREX II. Completed at San Clemente Island. Scored in accordance with FXP-5. Final overall grade was 91.2%. Final exercise grade assigned was "EXCELLENT." JOHN PAUL JONES received "Q" qualification.
- 08 Dec Ship was granted Cruise Missile Tactical Qualification certification.
- 15 Dec Family Day Cruise. One day underway to show approximately 230 guests and family members the ship and sailors working at sea.
- 28 Dec Battle of the Bands. USS JOHN PAUL JONES participated in the "Battle of the Bands" between the University of Arizona and University of Nebraska's marching bands. The two Holiday bowl bands played their fight songs back and forth from the flight decks of USS JOHN PAUL JONES and USS ELLIOT. During the festivities, Wilma Wildcat from the University of Arizona tripped on a cement barrier along the pier, and fell 20 feet to the water below. Fortunately she was quickly rescued from the water, suffering only minor bumps and bruises. Both ships provided tours and refreshments for the bands, and the band members further toured San Diego before participating in the Holiday Bowl game.
