Narrative:

KEARSARGE (LHD 3) began the reporting period by entering Norfolk Naval Shipyard January 10 for Selected Restrictive Availability. KEARSARGE ended the SRA May 3 after sea trials May 1-2. During the yard period KEARSARGE had many distinguished visitors highlighted by a visit by RADM Rempt, Director of Theater Air Defense.

After a visit to the Magnetic Silencing Facility, Norfolk May 6-9, preparation began for deployment workups. Captain Michael T. Wittkamp, USN, assumed command of KEARSARGE May 23, 1996.

KEARSARGE's first operation after leaving the shipyards was SEDRE-96 (Sea Lift Emergency Deployment Readiness Exercise) during which time the ship embarked over 500 U.S. Army personnel.

Throughout the rest of the year, KEARSARGE continued its inspections and qualifications for departments throughout the ship. KEARSARGE was underway for several levels of damage control certifications. KEARSARGE also went to NWS Earle, NJ for ammunition onload July 8-11.

KEARSARGE participated in the Joint Warrior Interoperability Demonstration from July 22 - August 30. During the demonstration for VIP's the week of August 26-30, KEARSARGE had more than 200 visitors tour communication spaces to view new C4I equipment and programs.

At the end of the reporting period, KEARSARGE onloaded 22 Marine Expeditionary Unit for PHIBRON/MEU Integration training in preparation of the scheduled 1998 deployment.
