

## COMMAND HISTORY

USS KEY WEST (SSN 722) 2000

- 1. Command Composition for USS KEY WEST (SSN 722):
  - a. Commanding Officer:

## Narrative.

- a. This was a banner year for the USS KEY WEST (SSN 722). The year saw the successful completion of the Depot Modernization Period (DMP) and return to sea for Sea Trials and an Eastern Pacific Deployment. The KEY WEST welcomed aboard a new Commanding Officer in November. The year was wrapped up with a INSURV inspection and holiday stand-down.
- b. The crew of KEY WEST excelled in the DMP and set a new standard for those to follow in Pearl Harbor. The crew's first milestone for the year was preparing for and undocking from drydock early. This set the pace for the rest of the DMP. The Integrated Propulsion Plant Testing Program (IPPTP) was completed successfully in 18 days, nearly two weeks ahead of schedule. The Integrated Logistics Overhaul (ILO) wrapped up early and the entire ship's

repair parts were backloaded a month prior to the scheduled milestone. KEY WEST closed out the DMP with a record setting Fast Cruise and Sea Trials. The timely return of KEY WEST to the fleet saved millions of dollars and invaluable time.

- c. The KEY WEST returned to sea for a Tactical Weapons Certification and Acoustic Trials. Just one month out of DMP, KEY WEST sailors' scores were highly competitive with the fleet. KEY WEST then went to San Francisco and participated in Fleet Week 2000. In one weekend over 4,000 bay area residents toured the submarine. The KEY WEST finally returned to Pearl Harbor where CDR Charles K. Merkel relieved as Commanding Officer on 3 November 2000.
- d. The KEY WEST finished the year with an Inspection and Survey Board Examination (INSURV) in December, followed by a holiday stand-down period. The INSURV inspection covers the material condition and readiness of the submarine.
