## LAKE CHAMPLAIN 1995 COMMAND NARRATIVE

The year began with USS LAKE CHAMPLAIN (CG 57) moored Pier 8, Naval Station San Diego under the command of Captain Dennis J. Van Buskirk. The year included a very successful Arabian Gulf deployment from 26 January to 26 July in support of United Nations sanctions against the government of Iraq, 2 multinational naval exercises, a successful Tomahawk shot and 21 successful Underway Replenishments during the course of the year. LAKE CHAMPLAIN departed Naval Station, San Diego the morning of 26 January enroute Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. During the transit LAKE CHAMPLAIN conducted MEFEX 95-1, Phase III and participated in Operation TEXAS THUNDER, a Third Fleet tomahawk exercise.

LAKE CHAMPLAIN saw several quality of life port visits enroute to the Arabian Gulf. The first port visit, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, was originally scheduled as a brief stop overnight. The visit lasted from 1 to 3 February, a result of a cracked fuel tank. The crew and SIMA Pearl Harbor worked around the clock to effect repairs. On 4 February, LAKE CHAMPLAIN left Pearl Harbor bound for Hong Kong. LAKE CHAMPLAIN moored at HMS Tamar on the morning of 16 February, the last U.S. Naval ship to do so. The facility had been sold to a private contractor who was completing his demolition of the base during LAKE CHAMPLAIN's visit. LAKE CHAMPLAIN hosted several local dignitaries and members of the Hong Kong American's Club for tours and lunches. LAKE CHAMPLAIN also hosted a visit and tour by Admiral Zlatoper, CINCPACFLT, who stopped in Hong Kong during a tour of Pacific Rim nations.

LAKE CHAMPLAIN sailed from Hong Kong 21 February bound for Singapore. LAKE CHAMPLAIN moored at Sembawang Repair Facility, Singapore the morning of 25 February for a port visit and voyage repair availability. During this visit, LAKE CHAMPLAIN hosted a very successful reception for Cathy Buka of the U.S Treasury Department who entertained several Foreign Treasury representatives to gain support for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia. To express thanks for the occasion the Treasury Department reissued a commemorative medallion of the Battle of Lake Champlain and provided a copy to each member of the crew. LAKE CHAMPLAIN got underway from Sembawang enroute the Arabian Gulf on 2 March.

LAKE CHAMPLAIN transited the Straits of Hormuz on the evening of 10 March and anchored off of Manama, Bahrain the morning of 11 March to receive in briefs by COMUSNAVCENT, CTF 159 and COMDESRON FIFTY staffs. After the briefings were complete LAKE CHAMPLAIN set sail enroute the Northern Arabian Gulf (NAG). Upon arrival in the NAG, LAKE CHAMPLAIN assumed plane guard for USS CONSTELLATION and assumed Anti-Air Warfare Commander Duties from the USS CHOSIN. LAKE CHAMPLAIN's assumption of warfare commander duties within 24 hours of entering the Arabian gulf set the tone for her time in the NAVCENT Area of Operations (AOR). LAKE CHAMPLAIN spent 102 days in theater of which 82 were underway. LAKE CHAMPLAIN held the duties of Anti-Air Warfare Commander 92 percent of her time underway and provided support to the CONSTELLATION, THEODORE ROOSEVELT and LINCOLN Battle Groups. LAKE CHAMPLAIN also held Maritime Interception Operations (MIO) Commander duties 66 percent of the time underway and participated as a MIO asset 91 percent of the time underway. During the

course of MIO duties, LAKE CHAMPLAIN conducted a total of six boardings, one of which (the MV Mai) resulted in the discovery of 20,000 barrels of contraband crude oil. That vessel was subsequently seized by LAKE CHAMPLAIN in support of United Nations sanctions and turned over to the government of Kuwait.

LAKE CHAMPLAIN also served as the Strike Warfare Commander 75 percent of her time underway while in the NACENT AOR. While serving as a strike asset LAKE CHAMPLAIN participated in several operational exercises including: 4 Tomahawk exercises and Operation NEMEAN LION which was conducted from 24 to 26 April. During NEMEAN LION, LAKE CHAMPLAIN served as NAG Launch Area Coordinator and assumed tactical control of USS KEY WEST, the first time tactical control of a submarine was passed to a surface asset in theater. LAKE CHAMPLAIN conducted 4 port visits while in the Arabian Gulf, 1 to Jebel Ali and 3 to Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

LAKE CHAMPLAIN departed Dubai on 14 June enroute Phuket Thailand. On 23 June LAKE CHAMPLAIN anchored off of Phuket, Thailand for a 5 day port visit. On 27 June, LAKE CHAMPLAIN weighed anchor enroute a brief stop for fuel at the Man of War anchorage in Singapore. During the transit of the Straits of Malacca, LAKE CHAMPLAIN conducted maneuvering drills and an ASW prosecution with the Royal Thai Navy. The exercise culminated with the Thai ship controlling LAKE CHAMPLAIN's embarked helo for simulated torpedo attacks. On 28 June, LAKE CHAMPLAIN anchored for 5 hours to take on fuel before proceeding to Cebu, Republic of the Philippines. Arriving on the 2nd of July, LAKE CHAMPLAIN spent 3 days in the Philippines hosting general ship tours, a diplomatic reception for Commander of the Visayas Command, the Mayor of Cebu City and others. After Cebu, LAKE CHAMPLAIN stopped in Guam to transfer Standard Missiles and receive Tomahawk missiles for further transport to the United States. LAKE CHAMPLAIN arrived at her next port of call, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii on 17 July. During the 3 day stop LAKE CHAMPLAIN was able to offload more missiles and onload 42 dependents for the Tiger Cruise home. LAKE CHAMPLAIN arrived in San Diego, California on 26 July completing Middle East Force Deployment 95-1.

LAKE CHAMPLAIN was inport or conducting local training operations in the Southern California Operating Areas until 26 September when she conducted a Tomahawk missile firing for OTL After This firing was a joint military service exercise. 166. the missile was launched, fin mounted cameras on the missile, the chase plane and Pioneer UAV's monitored the missiles flight from launch to impact. After the missile shot was complete LAKE CHAMPLAIN joined JTFX 95-3 as a member of the opposition force. JTFX 95-3 was an joint integrated naval exercise for the NIMITZ Battle Group and the PELELIU Amphibious Readiness Group. During that exercise LAKE CHAMPLAIN served as the boarding platform for members of the Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) of the Peleliu ARG obtaining their Special Operations Capability (SOC) certification. This boarding consisted of an after dark helo fast rope insertion without landing lights or control from the ship's flight deck. This was the first time a boarding under those conditions was conducted during the MEU/SOC qualification After the completion of JTFX 95-3 LAKE CHAMPLAIN process. returned to port on 2 October. After a brief visit in home port

LAKE CHAMPLAIN got underway 5 October to conduct Fleet Week in San Francisco. LAKE CHAMPLAIN lead the Parade of Ships underneath the Golden Gate Bridge and conducted a gun salute for the Chief of Naval Operations. During the Fleet Week visit, LAKE CHAMPLAIN hosted over 2000 visitors. On 10 October LAKE CHAMPLAIN proceeded north towards Esquimalt, British Columbia to participate in MARCOT 2-95, a multinational naval exercise hosted by the Canadian Navy. During MARCOT, LAKE CHAMPLAIN served as Anti-Air Warfare Commander for Chilean, Canadian, U.S. Coast Guard and U.S. Naval forces. Upon conclusion of the exercise LAKE CHAMPLAIN returned home 3 November.

On 22 November, Captain Frank J. Dobrydny relieved Captain Dennis J. Van Buskirk of command. Rear Admiral Lyle G. Bien, Commander, Carrier Group Seven was the guest speaker. On 27 November, LAKE CHAMPLAIN crewmembers were guests at a luncheon hosted by HMCS ALGONQUIN. On 7 December LAKE CHAMPLAIN provided an extensive tour of the ship to several Congressional Representatives. On 11 December, Captain Dobrydny took his ship to sea for the first time. During this week underway, the ship conducted numerous exercises in the SOCAL OPAREAS and conducted a naval gunfire support firing exercise, scoring 93 percent out of a possible 100. LAKE CHAMPLAIN also provided spotter training services for several U.S. Marine students. After a successful week of training at sea LAKE CHAMPLAIN returned to Naval Station, San Diego on 15 December and finished 1995 at Pier 8 outboard of USS PRINCETON.
