COMMAND COMPOSITON AND ORGANIZATION

MISSION: To operate with aircraft carrier battle groups in extreme threat environments, providing primary anti-air protection for the Fleet. To detect, classify and track hundreds of potential targets simultaneously in the air, on the surface and under the sea. To destroy hostile targets using a variety of weapons: surface-to-air and surface-to-surface missiles, shipand air-launched torpedoes and deck guns, rapid-fire close-inweapons, and electronic jammers and decoys.

NARRATIVE

I. Final Contract Trials (FCT)

A. Objective: To present the Combat System/Weapon System to the INSURV Board to identify deficiencies in material readiness, design, and training.

B. Contents: All aspects of the Combat/Weapons Systems were presented to INSURV via the maintenance program and detection, track and engagement scenerios.

C. Lessons Learned

1. Mode of operation of close-in-weapon system should be modified to better counter-act the threat. Key design deficiencies in power distribution were identified and will be corrected via engineering changes.

D. Evaluation

1. A successful assessment of the material condition, readiness and training of LEYTE GULF's combat/weapon system.
