

CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS

1 January - 31 December	Drydocked for engineering refueling overhaul at drydock two, Mare Island Naval Shipyard.
2 March	Change of command; CDR John S. Boulden, III relieved CDR Michael S. Myers as Commanding Officer USS LOS ANGELES.
21 October	Reactor Refueling completed.

### COMMAND NARRATIVE

USS LOS ANGELES remained on the keel blocks in Dry dock #2, Mare Island Naval Shipyard for the entire year. Disassembly and refurbishment of ship's systems continued throughout the year of engineered refueling overhaul.

One of the major highlights was the change of command on 2 March. Rear Admiral George W. Emery (Commander, Submarine Group Five) addressed the distinguished guests and observed CDR John Searles Boulden, III relieve CDR Michael Stephen Myers as Commanding Officer, USS LOS ANGELES on a bright and sunny day at Alden Park on Mare Island, California.
