3. Historical Narrative.

MCINERNEY's initial employment of 1994 was in conducting Maritime Interdiction Operations as part of Operation Support Democracy off the coast of Haiti. Upon completion of that mission she transited to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, for two weeks of Damage Control Training by Fleet Training Group.

Upon returning to Mayport in late February, MCINERNEY began hosting the myriad of training and assist visits, availabilities and inspections to prepare her for the Unitas deployment in July. Between 22 February and 07 July, she received valuable training from the Combat Systems Training Group, Engineering Training Group, Food Service Management and Logistics Management Training Teams, and satisfactorily completed her Operational Propulsion Plant Examination, Medical Readiness Inspection, Final Examination Period - the first ever on an FFG-7 class ship - and Logistics Management Assessment.

During this phase of MCINERNEY's schedule, she also participated in Exercise Agile Provider off the coast of North Carolina, transited to the Caribbean and was the only FFG to get off two shots at one target in a missile shoot during Prospective Commanding Officer Operations in mid May. On 20 May, CDR R. Y. Heath relieved CDR R. D. Jenkins III as Commanding Officer.

July found MCINERNEY deploying on Unitas 35-94 with USCOMSOLANT RADM W. R. Fladd. She circumnavigated clockwise the continent of South America, conducting exercises with ships from Spain, Venezuela, Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Peru, Ecuador and Colombia at various points along the way. The ship was involved in a collision with the Brazilian Oiler Gastao Mato due to a casualty to the ship's gyro during completion of an underway replenishment on 04 September, sustaining minor damage to her hull and port bridge wing which were repaired during her port visit to Buenos Aires. On 10 November, MCINERNEY dispatched her Rescue and Assistance Detail to the Ecuadorian ship BAE GALAPAGOS to aid in combatting her main space fire. R & A Detail members were later recognized for their efforts by USCOMSOLANT.

The crew enjoyed 15 liberty ports during the cruise, including stays at Rio De Janeiro, Brazil, in August; Buenos Aires, and Ushuaia, Argentina, the southernmost city in the world, in September; Valparaiso, Chile, in the beginning of

October; and Cartagena, Colombia, in November. MCINERNEY transited the Panama Canal on 17 and 18 November and conducted a Tiger Cruise while returning to Mayport from Naval Station Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico.

Upon arrival in Mayport, MCINERNEY commenced a post deployment and holiday leave and upkeep period lasting 08 days into 1995.
