The following items bear further discussion:

During this period USS MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL conducted a 2.5 month independent submarine ASW operation. This operation was a complete and unparalleled success. Although security constraints preclude further description of this mission, the ship established the ASW yard stick by which future mission will be measured. The successes of this mission have been briefed to Commander, Submarine Force, U. S. Atlantic Fleet, Commander in Chief, Atlantic Fleet and will be presented in Washington

D. C. to various Pentagon officials.

O4 - 25 AUG: RANGE EX-85 was an operation designed to determine the ability of submarines at sea to utilize various

intelligence sources including organic sources to conduct over the horizon targeting (OTH-T). This was the first exercise of this complexity to be attempted. The exercise was completed satisfactorily with the ship

receiving accolades for its professionalism.

26 - 28 AUG: The ship conducted a previously unannounced Operational Reactor Safeguards Examination. The examination was completed successfully with a overall performance grade of average; the first 688 class submarine to attain a grade of better than below average in these surprise

inspections.

28 OCT - 22 NOV: During this period, the ship conducted two port calls of note in conjunction with prospective Commanding Officer operations. Although both were at Port Everglades, Fl they were important in that they enabled the ship to conduct its first formal dependents cruise with the ship

conduct its first formal dependents cruise with the ship submerging and demonstrating its capabilities to all embarked. Additionally, the ship, crew and families were filmed and interviewed by KSTP television, Minneapolis-Saint Paul, Minnesota. The film was then televised as a mini-series along with the nightly news. This

strengthened the ties between USS MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL

and its namesake cities.
