I. Command Composition and Organization:

USS MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL's primary mission is to hunt down and destroy enemy surface ships and submarines. With the advent of the Tomahawk cruise missile, the ship is capable of tactical strike against land-based targets. Secondary missions include: coastal surveillance and Special Forces insertion.

III. Narrative

The USS MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL (SSN 708) spent the first six months of 2002 in the Mediterranean Sea as a forward deployed asset in support of the Global War on Terrorism. As an instrumental intelligence-gathering platform, the ship provided valuable information during Operation Enduring Freedom.

During the Mediterranean deployment, the ship represented the United States during foreign port visits at Toulon, France; Aksaz, Turkey; LaMaddelena, Italy and Souda Bay, Crete. Furthermore, the ship embarked the U.S. Ambassador to the Holy See—The Honorable Jim Nicholson during transit from Naples, Italy to LaMaddelena, Italy.

During an April stop in LaMaddelena, the ship held a Change-of-Command Ceremony-- passing the torch from CDR Ferrer to CDR Ratte.

While transiting back to the United States, MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL successfully completed an Operation Reactor Safeguards Examination (ORSE).

During the month of July, the ship returned to homeport Norfolk, Virginia for a well-deserved post-deployment stand down. Then, the ship participated in a brief maintenance upkeep before spending the month of August at sea for refresher training.

The month of September was a month-long maintenance upkeep. Then, the ship spent the majority of October and November at sea for tactical training. To end the underway period, the ship completed a Tactical Readiness Evaluation (TRE).

Following maintenance and training in port during December, MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL enjoyed a traditional Holiday stand-down.
