COMMAND COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION

MISSION:

MONTEREY is designed to provide air, surface, undersea, and strike warfare support for the Navy in today's multi-threat environment. Utilizing the unique capabilities of the AEGIS Weapons System, the Vertical Launching System, LAMPS III helicopters, and data links to other ships and aircraft, MONTEREY can monitor the tactical situation and supervise the engagement of hostile forces for an entire battle group. She is also a capable platform from which to conduct Maratime Interdiction Operations. Additionally, MONTEREY is only the third US Navy ship fitted with SMARTSHIP technology. The Integrated Ship Control system provides continuous situational awareness on navigation, steering, propulsion, electrical, auxiliary, and damage control system status. It allows us to make the best tactical decisions based on timely and accurate information.

USS Monterey (CG-61) began the year 2002 in port Naval Station Norfolk during Christmas Holiday leave and stand-down in six duty sections. In the second month of the year, her Officers and Crew completed a five-day underway for training in preparation for the upcoming COMPTUEX/JTFEX, an aggressive Battlegroup Group Sail with all units from the George Washington Battlegroup, and completed predeployment weapons on load.

After nearly a month in port, MONTEREY got underway for a Composite Training Unit Exercise (COMPTUEX) and embarked Detachment One of Helicopter Anti-Submarine Light Forty Two, based in Mayport, Florida and commanded by LCDR Dana Gordon. COMPTUEX included several Underway Replenishments with USNS Supply and coordinated ASW, Strike, Gunnery, and AAW exercises. MONTEREY successfully engaged two supersonic VANDAL targets with two SM-2 missiles. COMPTUEX concluded with a short port visit to Naval Station Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico before getting underway for Joint Task Force Exercise (JTFEX).

Upon completion of a very successful JTFEX, MONTEREY returned to homeport for Pre-Overseas Movement (POM) leave and stand-down. During stand-down, on May $10^{\rm th}$, CAPT Glen Flanagan, USN relieved CAPT Bill Walsh, USN as Commanding Officer of USS Monterey (CG-61). The ceremony was attended, among others, by Commander George Washington Battlegroup (RADM Joe Sestak, USN), and several USS Monterey Alumni.

On 20 June, USS Monterey deployed with USS George Washington, USS Normandy, USS Laboon, and USS Mahan. After a ten-day trans-Atlantic Ocean voyage, George Washington Battlegroup transited through the Strait of Gibralter and changed operational control (CHOP) to Commander, Sixth Fleet.

Before transiting the Suez Canal and "chopping" to Fifth Fleet, the Officers and Crew of USS Monterey enjoyed liberty in three Mediterranean ports including La Maddalena and La Spezia, Italy and Aksas (Marmaris), Turkey.

After transiting through the Suez Canal, Red Sea, Strait of Bab el Mandeb, and Strait of Hormuz, MONTEREY made a short port call to Manama, Bahrain for an in-brief on Fifth Fleet Operations. Once on station in the Northern Arabian Gulf, MONTEREY embarked the Coalition Maritime Interdiction Operations Commander. During her seven-week stay in the Northern Arabian Gulf, MONTEREY worked with coalition ships from the United Kingdom, Australia, and Norway and conducted 131 boardings, including 32 in a single day.

After being relieved by the USS Mobile Bay, MONTEREY headed East, through the Strait of Hormuz and South to the Seychelles Islands for a port visit before transiting North through the Red Sea and "chopping" to Sixth Fleet.

While on MIO Patrol in the Eastern Mediterranean, MONTEREY conducted one Leadership Interdiction Operation boarding on motor vessel Tara. Additionally, MONTEREY participated in a joint forces MIO exercise (Purple Flex) and Dogu Akdinez, a NATO Naval exercise hosted by the Turkish Navy. Port visits to Aksas and Izmir, Turkey; Soudha Bay, Crete; Valetta, Malta; and Cartagena, Spain were made before passing West through the Strait of Gibraltar and returning to homeport on 20 December for some much needed leave and stand-down.
