Mission / Command Employment / Operations: MONTEREY's primary mission is to provide air defense to the carrier. MONTEREY can also coordinate and execute operations in Anti-Submarine Warfare, Anti-Surface Warfare, Maritime for the fiction, Strike Warfare, and a variety of other warfare areas. For the crew trains underway primarily off the coast of Virginia, but training operations have taken her up and down the East Coast, Caribbean, and North Atlantic. When deployed, MONTEREY operates in COMSIXTHFLT, COMFIFTHFLT, or SOUTHCOM AOR. After deployment April, MONTEREY remained resided pierside for upkeep in Norfolk Naval Base. Late September, MONTEREY transited to BAE Shipyards for various installs and upgrades and commenced the CNO Availiabity.

ARRATIVE

USS MONTEREY (CG 61) began the year 2009 on deployment in C5F. MONTEREY welcomed in the New Year with a Replenishment at Sea with USNS Supply and then again the 8th of January. She continued to conduct C5F Operations in the vicinity of the Horn of Africa before transiting through the Straits of Hormuz in the middle of January. She pulled into Jebel-Ali, United Arab Emirates for five days of liberty and then pulled back out, headed back south through the Straits of Hormuz and conducted one last RAS with the USNS Supply before closing out the month of January.

In the beginning of February, MONTEREY continued to conduct C5F operations in the vicinity of the Horn of Africa. MONTEREY embarked a group of NFL players to share time and sign autographs for the crew. Two more Replenishments a second rere conducted and CTF 151 embarked for six days to close out the second of February.

In early March, MONTEREY continued to embark CTF 151 and conducted a Replenishment at Sea with the USNS PATUXTENT. Throughout the month, the chain of command also held the E-4, E-5 and E-6 exams. MONTEREY continued to transit to the Gulf of Oman area of operation and then transited up to through the Straits of Hormuz. Mid month, the crewed enjoyed a three day liberty port call to Jebel-Ali, United Arab Emirates. Upon completion of the Jebel-Ali port visit, MONTEREY transited south through the Straits of Hormuz and then conducted a Bab El Mandeb Straits Transit enroute to the Suez Canal. Towards the end of the month, MONTEREY transited through the Suez Canal and inchopped to Sixth Fleet. She conderate a Replenishment at Sea with the USNS Big Horn upon arrival to C6F.

On the first of April and EY pulled into Tarragona, Spain and embarked the Navy Family Service Members in the first point for return home. MONTEREY sailors enjoyed a short three day liberty port prior to commencing the crossing of the Atlantic Ocean enroute to Norfolk. MONTEREY departed Tarragona, Spain and made a transit through the Straits of Gibralter. Mid April, MONTEREY observed Easter Sunday and in-chopped to C2F. On 15 April 2009, MONTEREY pulled into Mayport, Florida to pick up family members in order execute a "tiger cruise" back to Norfolk. 18 April 2009, MONTEREY pulled into Norfolk, Virginia and immediately commenced a post-deployment stand-down period.

In May, MONTEREY **therefor**ed with its **therefore** deployment stand-down as the crew enjoyed a well-deserved rest. On the 18th, stand-down ended and the crew returned in full for work. Captain Bostock held two awards ceremonies as part of end of tour recognition and outstanding performances through deployment.

June started with the Strike Commander visiting MONTEREY to participate in a frocking ceremony for the new sailors advancing in various rates to petty officer. Captain Bostock again held another awards ceremony on the Flight Deck awarding outstanding performances throughout deployment. On June 22nd, MONTE**CONTEN** underway for transit up to Yorktown for a post-deployment offload of weapons in preparation for the upcoming shipyard availability. June 26th, MONTEREY

July 4th was celebrated on the MONTEREY and the quartermasters put on a tremendous display with the up and over detail of flags and pennants. July 10th, Commander Carrier Strike Group TWO held his change of command ceremony on the Flight Deck with a large attendance. CW02 **Command and ENS Commander Carrier** both earned their SWO pin throughout the month. Captain Bostock met with SURFLANT and Fleet Forces Command on separate occasions. Finally, the MONTEREY held a family picnic down at Harbor Park, where many families and friends attended.

August 1st started with MONTEREY inport Norfolk. MONTEREY deadsticked to pier 6, berth 2 in preparation for the BAE Shipyard availability. LTJG **Contractions** and ENS **Contractions** earned their SWO Pin throughout the month. Captain Bostock attended a Major Commander Commanders conference onboard and the Operations Officers worked with Afloat Training Group Atlantic to schedule the upcoming training cycle for 2010.

The first week of September began with the crew moving onboard the berthing barge provided when the ship undergoes its maintenance availability period. The E4, E5, and E6 exams were held throughout the month of September. LTjg

Captain Kilby rounded out the month with an awards ceremony on the Barge Rooftop.

MONTEREY continued the CNO Availability period; COMNAVSURFLANT came aboard the Barge on the 9th of November to present the CNO Safety Award and Captain Kilby held another awards ceremony. The participated in a shipwide safety Stand-Down and commenced Thanksgiving break on the 26th for a 96 hour liberty weekend.

On 10 December, CRUISER CLASSRON visited and toured the MONTEREY with Captain Kilby. Captain Kilby held an awards ceremony on the Barge top deck on December 14th and commenced the first Christmas Stand-Down period. On 16 December, the MONTEREY Leadership attended the 50% SRA production meeting and hosted NAVSEA 21 onboard for a tour of the ship. Christmas Day was observed on the Barge and on the 28th, MONTEREY commenced the 2nd Christmas Stand-Down period.
