Mission / Command Employment / Operations: MONTEREY's primary mission is to provide ballistic missile defense. MONTEREY's secondary mission is to provide air defense to a Carrier Strike MONTEREY can also coordinate and execute operations in Anti-Submarine Warfare, Anti-Surface Warfare, Maritime Interdiction, Strike Warfare, and a variety of other warfare areas. MONTEREY has the capability to embark two SH-60 Seahawk helicopters. The crew trains underway primarily off the coast of Virginia, but training operations have taken her up and down the East Coast, Caribbean, and North Atlantic. When deployed, MONTEREY operates in COMSIXTHFLT, COMFIFTHFLT, or COMFOURTHFLT AORs. During 2011, MONTEREY became the first ship to deploy to the COMSIXTHFLT AOR as part of the European Phased Adaptive Approach (EPAA) for ballistic missile defense of our allies in Europe. After return from deployment in October, MONTEREY resided pierside for upkeep in Norfolk Naval Base. In November MONTEREY transited up the YORK River to off-load ammunition at YORKTOWN Naval Weapons Station. In the beginning of December MONTEREY transited to BAE Shipyard to commence a CNO Availability.

2011 NARRATIVE

USS MONTEREY (CG-61) began the year in port Norfolk, preparing for COMTUEX and deployment. The majority of the year was spent away from homeport, beginning with COMTUEX in January and February, followed by an eight month European Ballistic Missile Defense deployment in the SIXTHFLT AOR.

On January 20th after weapons load out at Yorktown Naval Weapons Depot, MONTEREY went to sea with USS GEORGE W. BUSH (CVN-77), USS ANZIO (CG-68), USS GETTYSBURG (CG-64) AND USS MITSCHER (DDG-57) for COMTUEX through February 10th. She pulled into Key West Florida on the 11th of February for 3 days of liberty. MONTEREY left Key West on Feb 14th to commence JTFEX through Feb 23rd.

In early March, MONTEREY began her eight month European Ballistic Missile defense deployment conducting the Trans-Atlantic voyage en-route Portsmouth England for a 2 day brief stop for fuel. Throughout the month, the chain of command also held the E-4, E-5 and E-6 exams.

Towards the end of the month, MONTEREY pulled into Aarhus, Denmark from the $20\text{-}24^{\text{th}}$ and then Antwerp, Belgium from the 27^{th} - April 2^{nd} .

On the second of April, MONTEREY pulled out of Antwerp, Belgium and conducted the southern transit toward Rota, Spain. MONTEREY departed Rota, Spain after a brief stop in port for fuel and then anchoring over night outside of the harbor and conducted the transit through the Straits of Gibraltar. The crew enjoyed liberty in Naples Italy from 9-12 April, followed by a port visit to Haifa Israel from 15-19 April.

In May, MONTEREY conducted Defense of Israel synthetic BMD training exercises off the coast of Israel. Additionally, MONTEREY participated in a PASSEX with the Greek Navy. Three Officers received their Surface warfare Officer qualifications. The Memorial Day and Battle of Midway remembrance ceremony brought the month to a close.

The majority of June was spent in the Black Sea, building and strengthening ties with Romania, Ukraine and Georgia.

MONTEREY transited the Dardanelles and Bosporus Straits on June 4th, and was met by the Russian Cruiser CAREN. The first port visit was in Constanta, Romania from 6-9 June. A large press conference discussing AEGIS ashore in Romania was held on 7 June, followed by a tour and reception onboard MONTEREY for Romanian dignitaries and Embassy personnel. A few days later the crew enjoyed a port visit to Odessa Ukraine from the 11th-15th. Planning meetings and the embarkation of Ukrainian and Georgian Officers took place for Operation SEA BREEZE 2011. Batumi, Georgia provided a grand welcome from 20-23 June with a

welcoming celebration on the pier and onboard MONTEREY including a performance by a local youth drumming band. MONTEREY departed the Black Sea on 25 June in accordance with the MONTREUX agreement conducting the southbound Bosporus and Dardanelles straits transits. MONTEREY closed out the month of June and entered July in port Souda Bay, Greece on the 28th for the 10 day mid deployment availability.

MONTEREY sailors celebrated July 4th in the picnic area behind the Argonaut center. Food and games were available to all. MONTEREY conducted an anchor drop test on 8 July during the outbound transit from Souda Bay. On 25 July, MONTEREY received confirmation that the Scheduled Trieste, Italy port visit was cancelled due to port loading. MONTEREY reversed track out of the Adriatic Sea en-route Augusta Bay, Italy for a shorter port visit from 27-29 July to intercept parts, mail and personnel.

August 1st began with a personnel transfer in the Koper, Slovenia Harbor (adjacent to the Trieste, Italy harbor). MONTEREY received two Albanian Officers and two Croatian Officers for a VBSS training exercise. Following the exercise, MONTEREY transited South and then East to participate in Exercise Atlantic Sentry. August 12-15 were spent in port Corfu, Greece at anchor. A reception was held onboard on the 12th for the governor of the Ionian Islands, the Mayor of Corfu and many other VIPs and Greek dignitaries. MONTEREY rounded out the month of August with a port visit to Kusadasi, Turkey and a PASSEX with the Turkish Navy. The highlight of Kusadasi by far was the tour of the ancient city of Ephesus. MONTEREY also commenced the INSURV preparation.

September began with the Navy-wide E-6 advancement exam and the promotion of the Executive Officer, the Combat Systems Officer, and the Supply Officer. Shortly after, MONTEREY pulled into the familiar port of Souda Bay, Greece for the 3rd time from the 3rd to the 7th. To date MONTEREY has spent approximately the same number of days in Greece as she has in homeport this year. Prior to getting underway from Souda Bay, Captain Kilby briefed the crew on MONTEREY's official deployment extension.

In October there was one SWSCO pinning and four SWO Pinnings. MONTEREY transferred two sailors from USS DONALD cook to Augusta Bay, Italy. Following the personnel transfer from 9-10 October, MONTEREY took shelter south of Sicily 12 NM off the coast from 9-12 foot seas that surrounded the Island of Sicily and extended for 100NM in every direction. From 12-15 October, MONTEREY sailors enjoyed liberty in Palma, Spain. The 17th-20Th was spent in Rota, Spain conducting turnover briefs and transferring material and some supplies to the USS THE SULLIVANS. On October 27th, MONTEREY in-chopped to Fleet Forces

Command. Utilizing advanced weather models and forecasting by an embarked Aerographer's Mate, MONTEREY successfully avoided two large weather systems by diverting south. The decision was made on 30 October to cancel the Tiger Cruise scheduled for 1 Nov due to weather concerns. MONTEREY closed to 150 NM off the coast of Florida to fly the Helicopter off and slipped between two very large weather systems producing waves in excess of 15 feet off the coast and upwards of 20 feet further out to sea.

On November 1st Captain Kilby was relieved by Captain Kiss. The change of command ceremony was held on the flight deck 10NM off the coast of Virginia while enroute to Norfolk. MONTEREY pulled into Norfolk, Virginia at 1130.

On 14 November, MONTEREY got underway for a short transit up to Yorktown for a post-deployment offload of weapons in preparation for the upcoming shipyard availability, returning to Norfolk on 19 November after a 24 hour I-365 Pre-INSURV Assessment and demonstration.

MONTEREY began December with a dead-stick transit to the BAE shippard where she commenced a CNO availability scheduled to run through April 2012. A promotion ceremony was held in the wardroom for the Ship's Navigator. On 8 December, MONTEREY hosted RADM Thomas onboard for the INSURV I-300 brief and short tour. Christmas Day was observed on the Barge and on the Dec 28th, MONTEREY commenced the 2nd Christmas Stand-Down period.

In 2011 MONTEREY traveled approximately 31,000 miles and enjoyed 18 port visits in 15 different ports.
