Mission / Command Employment / Operations: MONTEREY's primary mission is to provide Ballistic missile defense and point and area air defense. MONTEREY can also coordinate and execute operations in Anti-Submarine Warfare, Anti-Surface Warfare, Maritime Interdiction, Strike Warfare, and a variety of other warfare areas. MONTEREY has the capability to embark two SH-60 Seahawk helicopters. The crew trains underway primarily off the coast of Virginia, but training operations have taken her up and down the East Coast, to the Caribbean, and North Atlantic. When deployed, MONTEREY typically operates in COMSIXTHFLT, COMFIFTHFLT, or SOUTHCOM Area of Responsibility. MONTEREY began the year in a CNO Availability at BAE Shipyards for various installs and upgrades. Throughout the year MONTEREY made preparations to independently deploy to the FIFTH fleet AOR as well as for a March 2013 materiel inspection by the Board of Inspection and Survey.

2012 NARRATIVE

USS MONTEREY (CG-61) began the year 2012 at pier 4 in BAE Systems, Norfolk, Virginia while going through a Selective Restricted Availability (SRA). Many of MONTEREY's systems received Hardware and software upgrades. MONTEREY received the SPS-73 surface search radar, taking the place of the SPS-64 and SPS-55 radars which were removed during the SRA.

On January 23rd MONTEREY entered the basic phase of training. This training cycle was part of the CNSL training pilot program.

In February, MONTEREY continued ship's force work and Shipyard work.

In March as ship's force work and Shipyard worked continued, the chain of command held the E-4, E-5 and E-6 exams.

In April MONTEREY left BAE and conducted a dead stick shift to Naval Base Norfolk to complete the SRA. MONTEREY made preparations to get underway to conduct Sea Trials, that included preparations for conducting a Fast Cruise, Dock Trials and an Engineering Light Of assessment. Contractor Sea Trials commenced on the 30th and continued into the beginning of May.

The month of May began with numerous Sea Trial events to include an Anchor drop test, full power (max speed) run and all guns PACFIRE. MONTEREY leadership and some technicians attended CYBERFORCE training at Afloat Training Group. Toward the end of the month was the Aviation Flight Deck Certification, the Command Physical Readiness Test and the 270 day prior to INSULV demonstrations and practice.

June started off on a great note with a Frocking Ceremony for MONTEREY sailors selected for advancement. MONTEREY conducted a second round of Sea Trials for Type Commander - Surfaces Forces Atlantic. During this underway aviation was at the forefront of training. Day and night qualification was completed thus re-certifying MONTEREY's flight deck for flight operations.

MONTEREY spent the majority of July underway. During the first week the ship conducted 240 days prior to INSURV checks. The following week, MONTEREY was underway for the Damage Control and Engineering mission area training events with ATG. Also during this underway period, a "Tow be towed" evolution was conducted with MTY towing USS SAN JACINTO (CG-56) and vice versa. A Replenishment at Sea with USNS Leroy Grumman and a precision anchorage proficiency demonstration were completed. The middle of July was spent in Yorktown for an Ammunition Onload. July concluded with MONTEREY underway for the Navigation and Seamanship certification events with ATG. During this underway, MONTEREY was also towed by USS MAHAN (DDG-72) for one of their certification events.

The majority of August was spent in-port for a Continuing Maintenance Availability period (CMAV), in addition the Naval Safety center conducted a safety survey. Toward the end of the month was MONTEREY'S 3M Certification event. MONTEREY ended the month by conducting a Commissioning Ceremony for ET1 , followed by a promotion ceremony for LCDR and LT

The 1st week in September, while underway, MONTEREY conducted an all guns FIREX in support of INSURV rehearsal. Following the return

to home port, a Distinguished visitor tour for The Honorable Mr. Vilsack, Secretary of Agriculture, ADM Harvey, Commander Fleet Forces Command, and RADM Thomas, Commander Surface Forces Atlantic occurred. Throughout the month, the E-4, E-5 and E-6 exams were administered. Toward the end of the month officers and key watch standers participated in Independent Deployers Academic training at Dam Neck. 5 of MONTEREY's first Class Petty Officers selected for advancement were promoted to the rank of Chief Petty Officer during a traditional Chief frocking ceremony. On September 28th, September concluded with an underway en-route to the AUTIC range and Savannah, Georgia. On Sunday the 30th MONTEREY conducted a burial at sea for SM3 George Bacon, USNR, AN Donald Brennaman, USN, BM2 Michael Crispino, USN, AMS2 Henry Kutlik JR., USN, CDR Richard Tinney, USN, RET PH3 Fredderic Miller, USNR, BM2 George Soresina, USN, SGT Robert Rappolt, USA, FA Lawrence Saxon, USN RM3 James Noble, USN and his wife Nina Noble, and Julia Schultz wife of ATI Shultz who was previously buried at sea.

The month of October began with MONTEREY underway for testing in AUTEC, followed by a liberty port visit in Savannah, Georgia. Upon arrival in Savannah, MONTEREY was received by the Navy League and held a reception onboard for the Navy League. Following her return to homeport, MONTEREY remained in port for a short week before returning to sea for NSFS qualifications in the VACAPES OPAREA. During this underway, MONTEREY also observed Hispanic Heritage Month with a cake cutting ceremony and special dinner. The month of October was closed out with Tropical Storm Sandy. Initially ordered to sortie with the rest of the fleet, MONTEREY was then ordered to remain in port due to expected weather conditions the ship would experience out to sea. The crew was given an extra day of liberty to account for potential damage from the flooding due to the storm and to ensure the crew's safety as they made their way back to the ship.

November was marked by a prolonged CMAV. The month began with the MI-150 assessment, in which MONTEREY had various inspectors from SURFLANT and other agencies onboard to assess her readiness for the March 2013 INSURV. Upon her return to port, MONTEREY remained pier side for 36 days, allowing numerous critical repair jobs to be completed throughout the ship. The crew observed Thanksgiving on the mess decks for the duty section, sailors and their families. The following week, CDR Myers was relieved as Executive Officer by CDR Dugan.

December arrived with the crew looking forward to the upcoming Christmas Stand-Down. Each leave period consisted of 10 days, starting on the 17th of December. At the beginning of the month, Captain Kiss, LCDR (Operations Officer) and LT (Air Defense Officer) flew to Bahrain to meet with Fifth Fleet representatives and discuss MONTEREY's coming deployment. Upon their return, MONTEREY was visited by RADM Thomas (SURFLANT), who visited the ship to discuss preparations for INSURV in March 2013 and the corrections made following the ship's MI-150 assessment in early November. Christmas Day was observed on the mess decks of the USS ANZIO for duty section, sailors and their families due to ongoing work in MONTEREY's galley. A grilled lunch was also prepared on the flight deck for the crew by the duty section khaki leadership.
