4. Narrative:

a. The beginning of 1996 found USS MONTPELIER in the ship's homeport of Norfolk, Virginia after her busy maiden deployment to the Mediterranean Sea in 1995. An ambitious schedule of upkeeps, evaluations, workups, and certifications were in store for the ship in preparation for MONTPELIER's return to the Mediterranean in 1996. With this year of preparations came improvement in the ship's material condition, tactical proficiency, and operational readiness. Material improvements included installation of a new Local Area Computer network, and an enhanced electronic surveillance suite. MONTPELIER was preparing to once again deploy as part of the THEODORE ROOSEVELT Battle Group, which conducted two major deployment exercises in the fall (COMPTUEX and JTFEX).

b. All departments met the year's challenges with exceptional results. MONTPELIER'S Combat Systems Department successfully completed initial certification of the ship's mine warfare capabilities and the ship's first launch of an exercise HARPOON missile. The Supply Department earned an EXCELLENT evaluation during an intensive Logistics Readiness Evaluation, and MONTPELIER continued to receive recognition from the USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT Battle Group for extraordinary performance in Strike Warfare and Battle Group communications. In addition, the ship was presented the 1995 Golden Anchor award in January for the previous year's exceptional efforts in career development, and MONTPELIER'S Deck Division was awarded the Submarine Squadron SIX Deck 'D' for excellence in deck seamanship.

c. 1996 closed with MONTPELIER on deployment including opportunities to make port calls in Lisbon, Portugal; La Maddalena, Italy; and a Christmas stop in Gibraltar.
