2. Calendar Year 2000 was highlighted by the ship's participation in the sixth International Naval review held July 2-9 in New York Harbor. MOUNT WHITNEY hosted a Fourth of July reception for over 900 guests including Chief of Naval Operations, ADM Jay Johnson, Senator John Warner (R-VA), the Honorable Rudolph Gulianni, Mayer of New York, and more than 25 other flag officers. In addition, the Joint Command Ship provided superb Command and Control, Communications, Computer and Intelligence (C4I) support to Commander, SECOND Fleet during two highly successful Joint Task Force exercises. The second exercise, UNIFIED SPIRIT, included participation by vessels from four NATO nations and was one of the largest joint exercises in history. Both in support of SECOND Fleet and in providing a host platform for well-received receptions and events in support of the overall mission of the U.S. Navy, MOUNT WHITNEY excelled in every respect. Engineering had two new installations: Coffin Turbo Main Feed Pumps (May) and Electronic Automatic Boiler Controls (August). Also, the ship received her second consecutive Navy "E" ribbon for the CY2000 Battle Efficiency competitive cycle.
