

USS MOUNT WHITNEY (LCC/JCC 20)
COMMAND HISTORY NARRATIVE

Calendar year 2002 was a busy one for USS MOUNT WHITNEY (LCC/JCC 20). After closing out 2001 with a shipyard availability period at NORSHIPCO Shipyard, the ship jumped into the new year with both feet. On February 9, MOUNT WHITNEY set sail for the North Atlantic region to participate in the highly successful Exercise "Strong Resolve 2002," one of the largest NATO exercises in recent memory. More than 30 ships from 13 NATO countries and 12 Partnership for Peace (PfP) nations participated in the exercise.

During the ship's two-month journey to the North Atlantic region, MOUNT WHITNEY Sailors got the opportunity to enjoy liberty in six different nations: Germany, Poland, Denmark, The Netherlands, Ireland, and Portugal.

In June, MOUNT WHITNEY's Engineering Department set the Atlantic Fleet standard for technical expertise and watchstanding proficiency as the ship achieved the highest scoring engineering certification in 2002. Inspectors from the Afloat Training Group (ATG) went over its systems with a fine-toothed comb and determined that the command ship met and exceeded the requirements for engineering readiness. The ship was the first in the Atlantic Fleet to perform the Initial Assessment (IA) underway, and passed each of the 28 evolutions of the Underway Demonstration (UD), for an overall score of Outstanding.

After a successful Final Evaluation Period (FEP) in July, MOUNT WHITNEY's crew received a well-deserved respite as the ship spent the majority of August in its Norfolk, Va., homeport. In September, the ship underwent a successful Maintenance and Material Management (3M) Assist Visit. Not long after the inspection, the ship's crew learned that MOUNT WHITNEY's operational tempo would soon increase to new heights.

MOUNT WHITNEY was scheduled to begin 2003 as it had ended 2001 - with a shipyard availability. However, when America upped the ante in the war on terrorism, the ship received the short-notice call to support a multi-service staff during a six-month deployment to the Horn of Africa region.

Prior to the deployment, COMMANDER, SECOND FLEET disembarked the ship in order for COMBINED TASK FORCE-HORN OF AFRICA (CJTF-HOA) to embark. MOUNT WHITNEY departed Norfolk on November 12 to participate in OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM and the ongoing global war on terrorism. On November 13, CJTF-HOA embarked the ship to support this deployment.
