

COMMAND HISTORY THROUGH 1987

COMMAND HISTORY THROUGH 1987

USS NASHVILLE is the third ship of the United States Navy to be named after the capitol of Tennessee.

The first USS NASHVILLE (PG-7) was a gunboat commissioned at Norfolk, Virginia, in 1897. She played a crucial role in the Spanish-American War, as well as being involved in the Phillipine Insurrection, the Boxer Rebellion, and World War I.

The second USS NASHVILLE (CL-43) was a light cruiser, commissioned in 1938. She had a proud heritage under her belt, earning ten battle stars in World War II. NASHVILLE survived the war despite considerable battle damage, and was removed from the Navy list in 1959.

USS NASHVILLE (LPD-13) was built by Lockheed Shipbuilding and Construction Company, Seattle, Washington. She was commissioned at the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard, Bremerton, Washington, on February 14, 1970.

NASHVILLE's various assignments have included four Caribbean Amphibious Ready Groups, seven Mediterranean Amphibious Ready Groups, a Mine Countermeasures Task Group, and numerous training assignments with the Fleet Marine Force Atlantic.

Throughout her history, NASHVILLE has demonstrated the seamanship and airmanship necessary to transport, land and support embarked landing forces when required, plus the ability to perform those assignments not normally a part of her amphibious missions.

In June of 1976, NASHVILLE visited New York City to participate in OPSAIL '76. There, she acted as host to President Jimmy Carter and the Secretary of the Navy for the review of all ships.

In June of 1980, NASHVILLE deployed with Amphibious Squadron TWO, to the Mediterranean and Indian Ocean as a unit of MARG 2-80. This highly successful deployment resulted in NASHVILLE receiving her first Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation and the Expeditionary Force Medal.

In May of 1981, NASHVILLE led a Mine Countermeasures Task Group which deployed to the North Atlantic and the Mediterranean. In this change of roles, NASHVILLE demonstrated the versatility of an LPD in a concentrated air/surface Mine Countermeasures command and support role. This unique operation earned NASHVILLE her second Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation.

In April of 1982, NASHVILLE provided support for the Presidential visit to Barbados. From May to November of 1982, during a Mediterranean deployment, NASHVILLE again demonstrated her flexibility, evacuating non-combatants from 23 different countries who had been trapped by the fighting in Lebanon. NASHVILLE then supported the Marines as part of

the Multi-National Peacekeeping Force in Beirut. These actions earned NASHVILLE the Humanitarian Service Medal and the Navy Unit Commendation.

In February of 1983, NASHVILLE embarked upon CARIB OPS '83, representing the United States Navy to six Caribbean nations, and serving as the Flagship for CINCLANTFLT and COMNAVSURFLANT. In this role, she hosted numerous dignitaries, as well as more than sixteen thousand citizens of the lands she visited.

In August of 1983, NASHVILLE commenced an extensive eight-month overhaul providing NASHVILLE with a new state-of-the-art communications suite, renovation of the main propulsion plant and an extensive renovation of crew and troop berthing.

In January of 1985, NASHVILLE deployed with Amphibious Squadron Eight to the Mediterranean as a unit of MARG 1-85. During her deployment, NASHVILLE demonstrated her flexibility by being assigned contingency operations off the coast of Lebanon.

In February of 1986, NASHVILLE departed for New Orleans, Louisiana to act as support ship for various NROTC Units during the Mardi Gras festival. This was yet another example of her ability to meet the ever changing mission of an amphibious ship.

In April of 1986, NASHVILLE deployed to the Caribbean Sea for Ocean Venture '86. With embarked Marines, she performed various amphibious operations off the coast of Puerto Rico.

In June of 1986, NASHVILLE departed for New York City to act as the Flagship for Rear Admiral Young during the International Naval Review during the Centennial Celebration of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor.

In August of 1986, NASHVILLE deployed to the North Atlantic for NATO exercise Northern Wedding '86, demonstrating her ability to perform amphibious operations off the coasts of Norway and Germany.

In November of 1986, after the completion of an eighteen month battle efficiency competitive cycle, NASHVILLE was awarded the Battle Efficiency 'E' as the best ship of the class in Amphibious Squadron Twelve. She also received departmental excellence awards for amphibious warfare, communications, electronic warfare and damage control.

In January of 1987, NASHVILLE was awarded the prestigious COMPHIBGRU TWO "Top Gator" Award for being the best ship of her category. She then deployed for six months with Amphibious Squadron Four as a unit of MARG 2-87.

While in the Mediterranean, NASHVILLE performed contingency operations off the coast of Lebanon and conducted joint amphibious exercises with French, Italian, Portugese, and Tunisian Navies. Port visits included Naples, Italy, Villefranche and Toulon, France, Barcelona, Spain, and Lisbon, Portugal.

In December 1987, NASHVILLE commenced a four-month yard period and drydock at Metro Machine shipyards, Norfolk, Virginia. With a proud heritage and the professionalism and dedication of the crew, the USS NASHVILLE stands ready to serve.
