FOR 1 JANUARY - 31 DECEMBER 1982

- 1 - USS OGDEN began 1982 moored at Pier 11, 32nd Street, NAVSTA, San Diego.
- 4 - 0731 Underway to anchorage #216 San Diego Harbor - ships present include USS BRISTOL COUNTY (LST-1189) at anchorage 217. 0900 Underway for SOCAL OPAREA.
1830 Underway for Anchorage #215. Anchored 1840.

Amphibious Refresher Training.

Synopsis: February 1-5 OGDEN held operations off Coronado Roads in SOCAL OPAREAS.

On February 8th, while moored at Pier 11 32nd Street, NAVSTA, OGDEN's Rescue and Assistance Team turned out at 0849 to help fight a fire on USS TUSCALOOSA (LST-1187). 0918 the fire was out and the OGDEN team secured.

5-28 - Moored Pier 11, 32 Street NAVSTA, San Diego.

MARCH

1-24 - Moored Pier 11, 32nd Street NAVSTA, San Diego.

Synopsis: After nearly two months of preparations, OGDEN was ready to participate in the 38-day RIMPAC Exercise in Hawaii. Rim-Pac is an acronym for Rim of the Pacific. Five nations that have Pacific Coast lines contributed over 29,000 Sailors and Marines to the exercise. The nations involved were Australia, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, and the United States. The exercise was the 8th in a series of exercises that originated in 1971.

- 24 - In accordance with FLIT OP Order 201-82 OGDEN got underway. The ship took on fuel at the Point Loma Fuel Annex that morning and performed a series of runs to calibrate the pitt sword in the afternoon.
- 25 - At sunrise OGDEN moored at the Seal Beach Ammo Pier for ammunition onload.
- 26 - After steaming in SOCAL OPAREAS overnight, OGDEN returned to San Diego the morning of March 26th and moored at Pier 6, 32nd Street NAVSTA, San Diego.
- 27 - Accompanied by USS PELELIU (LHA-5) OGDEN left 32nd Street NAVSTA, Pier 6 at 1330 the 27th bound for Hawaii to participate in RIMPAC 82. On the way out of San Diego Harbor, the ship's well deck was flooded to bring aboard LCU 1666 and units of BMU-1 and ACU-1.
- 31 - Flight Ops were conducted several days during the transit to Hawaii. On March 31st an AV-8 Harrier from FLOM Attack Squadron 513 made five landings on OGDEN's flight deck. The vertical short take off and landing (VSTOL) made the landings so OGDEN would remain qualified to land and support this type of aircraft.

APRIL

- 1 - Underway in Hawaiian waters enroute to Pearl Harbor, HI.
- 2 - OGDEN moored at Pier Kilo Six, NAVSTA, Pearl Harbor and began the onload of the men and equipment of MACS-2, 1st Marine Brigade. All total there were 261 Marines and 75 tons of support equipment brought aboard for the transit to the Island of Kahoolawe. On the evening of the 2nd OGDEN was underway for Kahoolawe.

- 3 - Deck and Air Departments began the offload at Smugglers Cove, Kahoolawe. Using helicopters and the embarked LCU, the offload was completed by Sunday afternoon, April 4th.
- 4 - OGDEN returned to Pier Kilo 6, NAVSTA, Pearl Harbor, HI late Sunday night.
- 5 - Onload process began again Monday morning, completed by 1800. 21 tons of equipment and 149 Marines from 1ST Marine Brigade were then taken to the main island of Hawaii.
- 6 - 0630 OGDEN anchored Kawaihae Bay, Hawaii for offload.
- 7 - Offload was completed the morning of April 7th. OGDEN then returned to Pearl Harbor, HI arriving at 1800 and began a liberty period which lasted from the 7th thru the 12th.
- 12 - Afternoon of April 12th OGDEN left Pearl Harbor, HI to rendezvous with USS MOBILE (LKA-115).
- 13 - RIMPAC 82, 13 APRIL - 22 APRIL
OGDEN and other ships involved in RIMPAC began amphibious assault rehearsals off the Island of Kauai. Rehearsals lasted from 0600-1500 and readied the assembled ships for the main assault of 19 April.
- 14-16 Formation steaming with ships participating in RIMPAC.
- 16 - OGDEN rendezvoused with the Carrier Task Group participating in RIMPAC. Other ships involved were USS PEORIA (LST-1183), USS BREWTON (FF-1186), USS WHIPPLE (FF-1082), USS MOBILE (LKA-115), USS NEW ORLEANS (LPH-11), USS TUSCALOOSA (LST-1187) and USS CLEVELAND (LPD-7).
- 17 - OGDEN took on fuel from USNS KIWISHIWI (TAO-146).
- 17-19 OGDEN and other ships of Task Group simulated an opposed transit to their initial objective, Kawaihae Bay on the Island of Hawaii.
- 19 - Special Sea and Anchor detail set 0500. 0630 1st assault wave hit the beach. Rest of day spent unloading Marines and equipment by landing craft and helicopter. Because of simulated wartime conditions OGDEN remained underway. At 1800 anchored off Kawaihae Bay.
- 20 - Day of rest for the crew. During lunch the crew participated in swim call. It lasted 90 minutes and at least half of the 416 man crew participated. Afternoon of April 20th a simulated chemical attack took place. The crew manned their battle stations to practice chemical warfare defense procedures. 2200 OGDEN departed for Kahoolawe Island.
- 21 - 0812 OGDEN anchored at Smugglers Cove, Kahoolawe Island and began backload of the Marines and equipment dropped off a month earlier. By noon the following day the 260 Marines of MACS-2, 1ST Marine Brigade and their equipment were loaded and secured aboard. 1830 OGDEN moored at Pier Kilo Six, NAVSTA Pearl Harbor, HI.
- 22 - After mooring overnight the offloading of embarked Marines began at 0800. By 1900 the offload was completed and all lines were cast off. OGDEN was underway for Lahaina, Maui.
- 24 - Arrived at anchorage Lahaina, Maui on the 24th. Liberty was enjoyed by the crew for two days.
- 26 - OGDEN weighed anchor and began the transit back to San Diego in company with USS NEW ORLEANS (LPH-11) and USS TUSCALOOSA (LST-1187).
- 26-3 - Formation steaming enroute to San Diego.

MAY

- 3 - OGDEN arrived in San Diego after a smooth transit. The ship moored at Pier 11 32nd Street Naval Station, at 1045 and a liberal liberty policy went in effect for the rest of the week.

- 8 - 1610 Flooding in compartment 4-40-5-L (brig). Cause: CHT overflow.
By 1842 Brig was dewatered.
- 3-31 - Moored 3-31 MAY, Pier 11, 32nd Street NAVSTA, San Diego.

- 1-15 - OGDEN remained moored at Pier 11, 32nd Street NAVSTA San Diego.
- 16 - Underway in accordance with CINCPACFLT OP Order 201 in the SOCIAL OPAREA.
