Part 1. Command Composition and Organization

A. MISSION: To provide Anti-Submarine Warfare (USW), Anti-Surface Warfare (SUW), Strike Warfare, and support Naval Special Warfare (NSW) for the U.S. Submarine Force. USS PHILADELPHIA is equipped to carry MK-48 ADCAP torpedoes and all variants of Tomahawk cruise missiles. In 1998, PHILADELPHIA was altered and is now a Dry Deck Shelter (DDS) platform capable of carrying Special Operations Forces and providing Deep Submergence Rescue Vehicle (DSRV) mother ship support.

C. NARRATIVE:

The PHILADELPHIA began the year underway, returning from a seven-month Central Command/Mediterranean Deployment in support of the Global War on Terrorism. Prior to returning the ship made a brief stop for personnel and performed an Operational Reactor Safeguards Examination. After a five-week respite in Groton for post-deployment stand-down and maintenance preps, the PHILADELPHIA returned to sea, transiting to Port Canaveral, FL, to complete further training and qualifications at sea. After spending three days of liberty in Port Canaveral, FL, PHILADELPHIA began a dependents' Tiger Cruise on the transit back to Groton, CT on 15 March. The ship got underway again for a Basic Submarine Assessment, on which she scored a solid Average. The next three weeks were spent in port conducting dry-dock preparations, followed by a one-week underway completing training, qualifications, and performing three burials-at-sea.

Upon return to port, at the end of a vigorous schedule, the PHILADELPHIA began an extensive upkeep period including a dry docking in Groton, CT. This upkeep included the installation of significant upgrades to Fire Control and the Reactor Plant Control Panel and a Dry Deck Shelter cross-fit, much of this three-month period was spent conducting maintenance and in-port training.

Upon completion of the dry dock period, the PHILADELPHIA returned to sea for local training, and to conduct a VIP cruise for the Undersecretary of Defense for Policy, making a brief stop in Port Canaveral, FL, before returning to Groton for a five week maintenance and training period, which included a Combat System Readiness Review. Following a three-day retest period at sea, the PHILADELPHIA returned to Groton for two additional weeks of in-port maintenance and training.

On 4 October PHILADELPHIA got underway, picked up Seal Delivery
Vehicle Team Two Task Unit Bravo in Mayport, FL, and conducted
Special Warfare Training. PHILADELPHIA then transited back to
Groton, CT while performing at-sea training. After a brief oneweek replenishment period in Groton, the PHILADELPHIA got
underway for further training and conducted an Operational
Reactor Safeguards Examination. Upon return to port, the
PHILADELPHIA began Preparations for Overseas Movement, Phase 1
(POM 1), and had a Supply Management Inspection, on which she
scored an average. PHILADELPHIA and her crew finished the year
with a well-earned stand down period of leave and liberty.
