3. <u>Narrative</u>. ROBERT G BRADLEY began the year 2004 moored in homeport, NS MAYPORT, Florida with a portion of the crew on Christmas leave. After the Crew returned RGB started an SRA, for much needed upkeep and modifications. During this time the Mk 13 missile launcher was removed. Following the SRA the RGB entered the training cycle beginning in earnest during the month of April.

The month of April proved busy for RGB and her crew, completing plane guard operation for USS KENNEDY on 17-18 April, BECCES/ENG with ATG, ENG LTT with DESRON-14 observing, ATFP-SF-2, MED-1, and DC-2/7/8. Additionally in April, RGB completed Initial Assessment preparations and TRNG-4/5.

During May, RGB officially began Basic Phase completing her Initial Assessment, CART II, and CDS-14 Group Sail. RGB also completed her Pre-AVCERT Tech Assist, CS TSTA I, EW-1, ENG-6, and VIS-1. Moreover, RGB completed ENG-3, DC-2/6/7/8, NAV-1, SEA-1, VBSS-1B, BGIE preparations, BGIE Exercise, ATFP-3, ENG-6, VIS-1, Air-1A and 1B.

June brought to completion RGB's successful Underway Demonstration. RGB also completed ENG-3, USW-1, CCC-1, VBSS-2A.

The training cycle continued through the summer with a brief break during July during which on July 9<sup>th</sup> Commander Edwin Lebron assumed command of RGB. Following a successful completion of FEP in August the RGB took advantage of some inport time for upkeep and repair.

October and November were busy months for ROBERT G BRADLEY. RGB sailed up to VACAPES to participate in a Group Sail with DESRON 28 and GEORGE WASHINGTON CARRIER STRIKE GROUP. Enroute to VACAPES, RGB completed Week One Work-ups with HSL 46 Det 6. Several exercises and much needed training were conducted to ensure the ship could conduct safe helicopter operations. Upon arrival in VACAPES RGB participated in: MIO Training with TSV-1 PREVAIL, Plane guard operations with USS GEORGE WASHINGTON, TWO UNREPS and numerous practice approaches with USNS JOHN LENTHALL, and USW operations with GWSTRGRU.

After the completion of the DESRON 28 Group Sail, RGB pulled into Norfolk, VA. Here the ship and crew were able to take advantage of training and maintenance opportunities not available in Mayport. Following the brief stay in Norfolk, RGB transited up the Chesapeake River to the United States Naval Academy. RGB was anchored off of Annapolis, MD for the United States Naval Academy's Homecoming weekend. The crew was able to attend the Homecoming game and enjoy many of the Homecoming Weekend festivities.

Upon departure from Annapolis RGB returned to VACAPES for a more training and another UNREP with USNS JOHN LENTHALL. RGB then made its way to Mobile, AL to participate in the Veterans Day celebrations. While in Mobile, RGB hosted a breakfast for local military and civilian leaders. The crew participated in the Veterans Day Parade and a COMREL project.

After leaving Mobile, RGB proceeded to the Atlantic Underwater Tracking and Evaluation Range, Andros Island, in the Bahamas. Here, RGB participated in SSC OPS working with US submarines training prospective commanding officers and developing torpedo countermeasures. RGB also tested new torpedo evasion techniques during this training and conducted two overthe-side exercise torpedo firings.

On 7 December, RGB hosted the Change of Command for DESRON FOURTEEN where Commodore Mark Klatt was relieved by Commodore David Robertson as Commander, Destroyer Squadron FOURTEEN.

Following a brief underway in the JAX OPAREA for CO's time, RGB holiday stand-down commenced.
