- 2. <u>Mission</u>. To embark, deploy, and land elements of a Marine amphibious landing force in an assault by CH-46, CH-53, and UH-1 helicopters, LCU, and LCM-8 landing craft onto a hostile shore from the sea. SAIPAN serves as the flagship for Amphibious Ready Group (ARG) operations. Evacuation, disaster relief, and hospital ship duties are secondary missions of USS SAIPAN.
- 3. <u>Composition</u>. SAIPAN's crew is composed of 63 officers and 904 enlisted personnel. The administrative chain of command is via COMPHIBGRU TWO and COMNAVSURFLANT.
