NARRATIVE

The start of 1991 found WASP preparing for her maiden deployment. January was spent conducting local operations off the Virginia coast. Each day at sea meant an increase in crew teamwork and combat readiness in engineering, flight deck, fire control and well deck operations.

Additionally, January saw two major change of command ceremonies conducted onboard WASP. VADM Reason relieved VADM Donnell as Commander Naval Surface Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet and ADM Miller relieved ADM Carter as Commander in Chief, Atlantic Fleet.

In February and March, WASP completed four significant predeployment events. Limited Team Training (LTT), conducted by a group from GMTO, worked for two and one half weeks to improve the ship's ability to fight and repair damage in a wartime environment. After LTT, COMNAVSURFLANT came onboard to inspect combat systems management, training and maintenance. The two day CSA (combat systems assessment) culminated in four perfect detect to engage exercises utilizing the ship's NATO sea sparrow missile and Close-in-weapons defenses. Amphibious Refresher Training, conducted by Group Two training personnel, was a week of intensive well deck operations in the Lynnhaven anchorages. In mid March, WASP successfully completed Type Command's Amphibious Training (TCAT). This was the first time WASP operated with other elements of MARG 2-91 under the control of Amphibious Squadron Four. The exercise took the ship to Onslow Bay, North Carolina to conduct basic ship to shore operations using LCM-8s, LCACs and helicopters.

In April, WASP successfully completed a COMNAVSURFLANT Supply Management Inspection, a significant "Battle Efficiency Award" milestone. Also, WASP hosted several tours and dinner functions, ranging from project "IDENTA-KID" to the American Helicopter Society and the crew of the HMS INVINCIBLE.

The last major pre-deployment training exercise was conducted in late April and early May. Blue/Green water workups again saw WASP operating off the coast of Onlsow Bay with the other afloat commands of MARG 2-91. The major difference between this exercise and any previous ones was the inclusion of the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit, both ground and air forces, in the training. For three weeks, WASP worked with the Marines to improve planning, logistics movement and tactics. The exercise concluded with the combined staffs of the 26th MEU and PHIBRON FOUR earning the tactical designation of "Special Operations Capable" and ready for deployment.

WASP spent most of May moored to pier 12 NOB Norfolk, Va.

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Final repairs to the ship's five large cargo elevators were completed by personnel from the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard. Repair parts, ammunition, consummable goods and food came aboard in large quantities. Personnel took leave to be with their families or went TAD to complete required maintenance and operator courses necessary for the ship to achieve maximum combat readiness.

WASP participated in the midshipmen summer training program (LANTRAMID 1-91) during early June. The program was designed to provide "hands on" training for college and Academy students seeking a commission in the Navy or Marine Corps.

On 20 June 1991, WASP departed Norfolk on its maiden deployment to the Mediterranean Sea. After a brief stop in Morehead City, North Carolina to pick up the 26th MEU, WASP conducted a high speed transit of the North Atlantic, passing through the Straits of Gilbraltar on the 1st of July.

WASP participated in a traditional, American 4th of July celebration with the U.S. Ambassador to Rome and several Italian military and political dignitaries. Almost 150 civilians boarded WASP to tour the ship, eat hot dogs and observe Harrier and LCAC operations. After the celebration, the crew spent time on liberty in Rome. WASP was the first American warship to visit Rome since World War II.

Next came WASP's brief involvement in Operation Provide Comfort, a United Nations relief effort for the Kurds in northern Iraq. In addition to Operation Provide Comfort, WASP spent the time anchored in Iskendrun, Turkey conducting a turnover with MARG 1-91.

The last part of July found WASP in Haifa, Israel for a three week maintenance period. During that time, CAPT Charles R. Saffell, Jr. relieved CAPT Robert R. Hanke as Commanding Officer.

August found WASP conducting routine operations throughout the Mediterranean. Several advanced training exercises were completed in WASP's bid for COMNAVSURFLANT's Battle "E" award. Additionally, WASP participated in the bilateral Tunisian Amphibious Exercise. Conducted at Cap Serrat, the 26th MEU spent five days operating with the Tunisian ground and air forces. The teamwork between the two countries promoted military readiness and tactics and enhanced politcal stability.

The next port of call for WASP was Palma de Mallorca, Spain. For the next nine days, the crew enjoyed the hospitality, beaches and nightclubs of the various towns along the island's resort coast. The ship hosted tours for several hundred native Mallorcans and tourists daily. The most notable included visits by the father of the current King of Spain and the ex-King and Queen of Greece.

In early September, WASP served as the host ship for the Component Commanders Conference. The senior military officers for the Army, Navy and Air Force in Europe, along with their wives spent a day at sea to observe the warfare capabilities of WASP.

While in Toulon, France, WASP served as the platform for the US/French Navy Quarterly Staff planning conference. Once the conference was completed, ADM Reason (COMNAVSURFLANT) hosted a reception for ADM Trippier (CECMED) and approximately 300 prominent citizens of Toulon.

The next major at-sea exercise that WASP participated in was Display Determination 91(DD-91). Warships from France, United Kingdom, Turkey, Italy, Spain and the United States spent three weeks in the Aegean Sea conducting AAW, ASW, ASUW and amphibious exercises. DD91 culminated in an opposed landing against Turkish forces on the beaches at Saros Bay.

After DD91, WASP spent five days in Rhodes, Greece to relax before participating in the sea control exercise, Operation Hammerlock. Hammerlock provided the Navy with an initial assessment of the feasibility of the LHD functioning as the centerpiece and flag ship for a sea control battle group (SCBG) against a limited threat. Using WASP's advanced combat data system, warfare commanders successfully monitored the tactical and strategic theater of operations. Multiple coordinated attacks utilizing both surface and air assets were conducted around the clock against afloat and shore targets. WASP's performance throughout the exercise established the LHD platform as a viable option to the carrier in sea control.

The Southern Region Strategy Conference completed the month of October. Several senior NATO commanders spent two days onboard WASP conducting a series of briefs for future NATO operations. Besides work, the senior officers and their wives enjoyed the accommodations, tours and demonstrations conducted by WASP crewmembers.

After a relaxing port visit to Valencia, Spain, WASP participated in another bilateral training exercise with the Spanish Legion called BETACOM 2-91. The ten day operation was conducted while at anchor at Almeria, Spain.

WASP spent Thanksgiving in Barcelona, Spain before transiting to Rota to clean the vehicles and equipment of the 26th MEU.

On 7 December, WASP outchopped from the Mediterranean and started the long transit across the Atlantic to Morehead City. Half way across, WASP joined up with MARG 1-92 and conducted an open ocean turnover with the relieving units. Finally the first deployment was almost over. After the marines of the 26th MEU debarked at Morehead City, WASP brought onboard several hundred male and female WASP dependents and conducted its first Tiger cruise up the coast to Norfolk. At 0807 on the 20th of December 1991, WASP's maiden deployment to the Mediterranean officially ended when the ship moored to pier 12.

The year ended as it began in Norfolk, Virginia.

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
