- i. Mission: Composition: Polaris Material Office Pacific (PMOPAC) was authorized by OPNAVINST 4000.5E on 1 March 1964 and formally commissioned on 16 April 1964. Effective June 1994, the titles of PMOPAC and its detachments located in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, Travis Air Force Base, California, and San Diego, California, were changed to Submarine Logistics Support Center (SUBLOGSUPPCEN) Bremerton, Washington and SUBLOGSUPPCEN DET respectively. Effective 14 March 2000, the titles of SUBLOGSUPPCEN and its detachments again were changed to Priority Material Office (PRIORITY MATOFF) Bremerton, Washington and PRIORITY MATOFF DET respectively. In March 2004, PMO gained two new detachments in Norfolk VA and Groton CT; in October 2004, gained one new detachment in Yokosuka Japan; in October 2005, gained one new detachment in Kings Bay GA; and in July 2009, gained three new detachments in Sigonella Italy, Manama Bahrain, and Marianas Guam. PMO is a command solely dedicated to expediting and tracking, cradle to grave, around the globe, all Issue Priority Group I requisitions for Pacific and Atlantic Fleet submarines, surface ships, Military Sealift Command units, Marine Expeditionary Units, and United States Coast Guard ships while maintaining accurate, real-time in-transit visibility to all customers and decision makers.
- j. Identify Assigned Mission: To perform assigned material control and supply support responsibilities in support of the TRIDENT operating forces assigned to Commander Submarine Forces, and act as the focal point for Issue Priority Group I requisitions in support of deployable Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard units.
- k. Headquarters and Detachments:
 - (1) Priority Material Office (PMO) Headquarters: Three officer billets, 27 enlisted billets, 31 civilian billets and 0 contractor billets are assigned and located at NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center (FLC) Puget Sound, Bremerton, WA.

2. Commander's Assessment. 2015 was a great year for PMO and business remained steady. PMO faced manning shortfalls on both the military and civilian sectors. 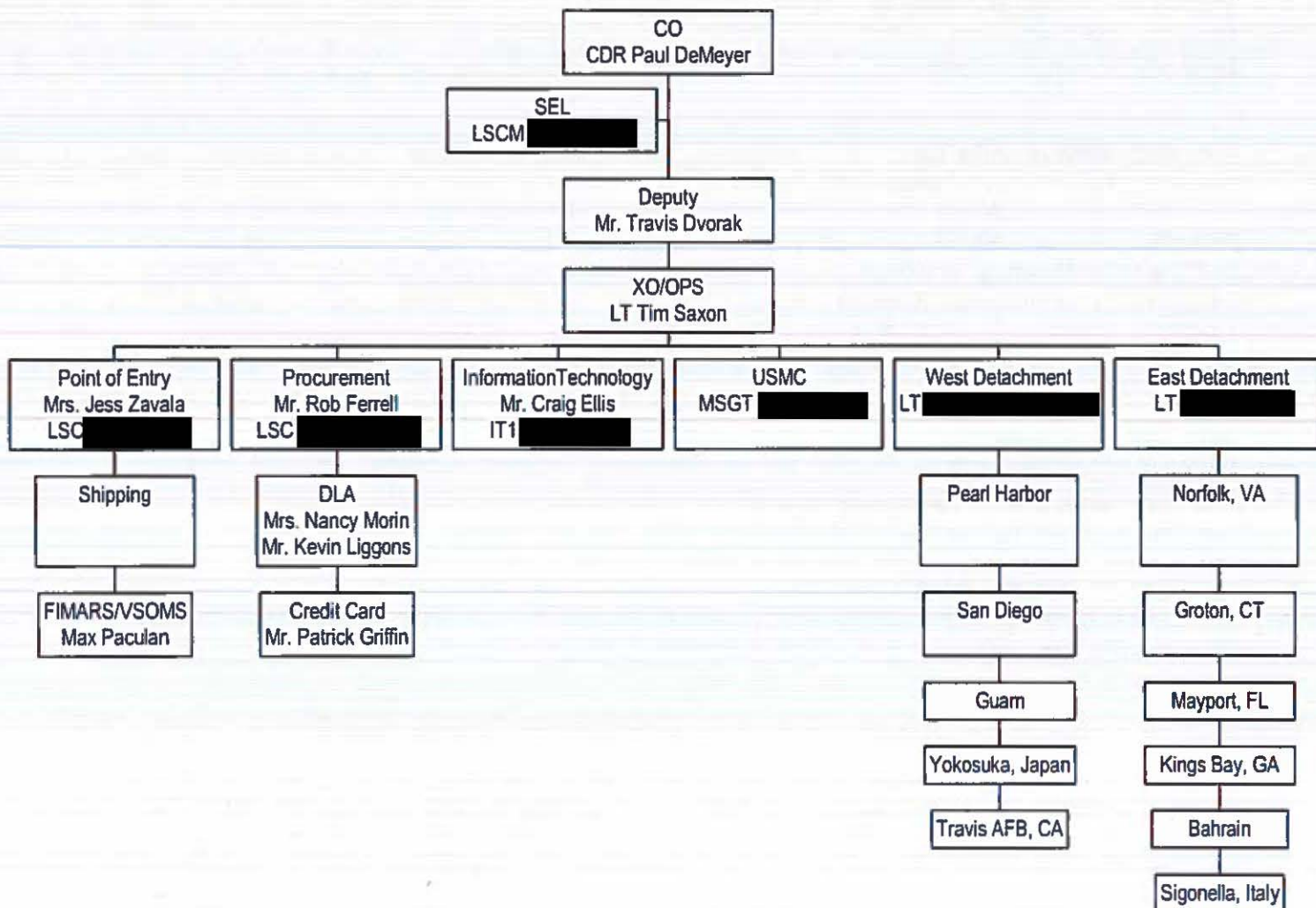

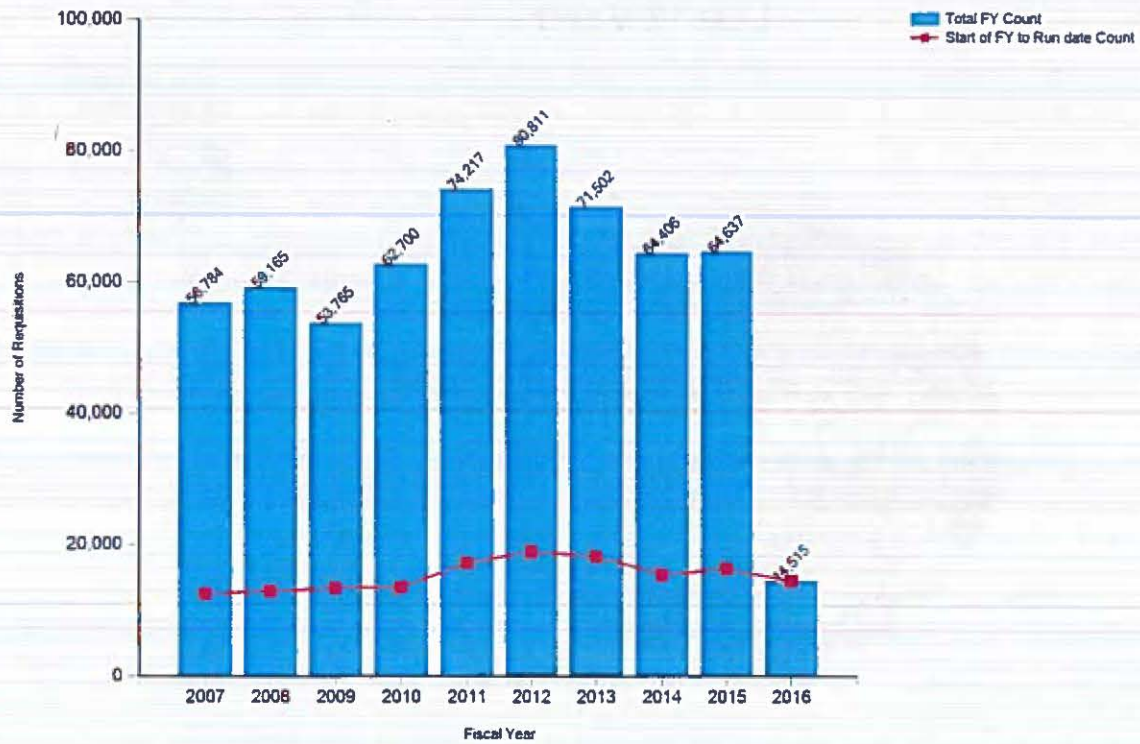

Priority Material Office Command History

The Priority Material Office (PMO) was initially commissioned Pacific Fleet Polaris Material Office (PMOPAC) on 16 April 1964. It has served since its inception under the operational control of Commander Submarine Force, U. S. Pacific Fleet (COMSUBPAC). PMOPAC and its Atlantic Fleet counterpart were charged with providing dedicated logistics support to the Fleet Ballistic Missile (FBM) submarine force.

In its FBM logistics support role, PMOPAC used a combination of military and civilian air transport services and a converted World War II era Victory ship (USS FURMAN) to ensure success for 2,000 FBM refits conducted by the submarine tender in Guam. This guaranteed that the units of Submarine Squadron Fifteen were Ready For Sea. Additionally, PMOPAC verified and updated the repair parts inventory of those FBM submarines being overhauled on the West Coast of the United States.

PMOPAC successfully supported the Pacific Fleet's strategic deterrent force during its transition from the original Polaris missile through the Poseidon missile upgrade to the advent of the TRIDENT system. With the retirement of the Polaris/Poseidon submarines and the decommissioning of Submarine Squadron Fifteen in Guam, PMOPAC assisted with the conversion of USS PROTEUS (AS-19) from its role as an FBM submarine tender to a fast attack submarine (SSN) tender. PMOPAC also assisted in the decommissioning process of the retiring FBM submarines.

In 1982, PMOPAC began expediting critical repair parts for the entire Pacific Fleet submarine force, afloat and ashore. In 1994, PMOPAC was renamed Submarine Logistics Support Center to better reflect the changing mission. In this expanded role, SUBLOGSUPPCEN developed the Integrated Submarine Information System (ISIS), which provides current and historical information on every Issue Priority Group One requisition that is processed. ISIS has become the standard expediting database for both the Pacific and Atlantic Fleets, and is installed at key logistical points around the globe, both afloat and ashore.

In 1997, a successful relational expediting prototype was conducted wherein SUBLOGSUPPCEN expedited all critical requirements for surface combatants in the USS CONSTELLATION Battle Group. The prototype was so successful that on 1 December 1997, SUBLOGSUPPCEN began expediting for 32 deployed and forward deployed surface ships in the Pacific Fleet. On 26 January 1998, the remaining 61 surface ships in the Pacific Fleet were added to SUBLOGSUPPCEN's customer base. In May 1998 SUBLOGSUPPCEN also assumed responsibility for expediting for Pacific Fleet Military Sealift Command ships. In April 2000, the command name was changed to Priority Material Office to better reflect its expanded mission. In 2005, PMO consolidated with the Atlantic Fleet Logistic Support Center (AFLSC), merging East and West Coast expediting functions under PMO.

In 2006, the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (OPNAV) and Headquarters, Marine Corps (HQMC) institutionalized the use of PMO to expedite material for deployed Marine Air-Ground Task Forces (MAGTFs) as part of the "Common Expediting Organization" initiative under the umbrella of the Naval Logistics Integration (NLI) program. In 2007, OPNAV and Coast Guard Headquarters (CGHQ) formalized a similar "Material Expediting" initiative for PMO to expedite for Coast Guard units under the Navy - Coast Guard Logistics Integration (N-CGLI) program.
