Biographical Note

Chester William Nimitz was born in Fredericksburg, Texas, on 24 February 1885, son of Chester Bernhard and Anna (Henke) Nimitz. He attended Tivy High School, Kerrville, Texas, before his appointment to the U.S. Naval Academy from the Twelfth Congressional District of Texas in 1901. After graduation (with distinction, seventh in a class of 114) in January 1905, he joined USS *Ohio* at San Francisco, California, and cruised in her to the Far East where she became flagship of the Asiatic Fleet. In September 1906 he was transferred to USS *Baltimore*, and on 31 January 1907 after the two years at sea, then required by law, he was commissioned an Ensign.

Remaining on Asiatic Station in 1907, he successively commanded USS *Panay* and USS *Devatur*, and served in USS *Denver*. He returned to the United States in USS *Ranger* in December 1908 and reported in January 1909 for instruction in the First Submarine Flotilla. In May of that year he was given command of the Flotilla, with additional duty in command of USS *Plunger* (later renamed USS *A-1*). He was transferred to command of USS *Snapper* when that submarine was commissioned on 2 February 1910, and on 18 November 1910 assumed command of USS *Narwhal*. In the latter command he had additional duty from 10 October 1911, as Commander Third Submarine Division, Atlantic Torpedo Fleet.

He was ordered in November 1911 to the Navy Yard, Boston, Massachusetts to assist in fitting out USS *Skipjack* and assumed command of that submarine, renamed USS *E-1*, at her commissioning on 14 February 1912. On 20 March 1912 he rescued W.J. Walsh, Fireman, second class, USN, from drowning. A strong tide was running and Walsh, who could not swim, was being rapidly carried away from his ship. When picked up, both men were exhausted. For his heroic service, Admiral Nimitz, then a Lieutenant, was awarded the Silver Life Saving Medal by the Treasury Department.

After serving from May 1912 to March 1913 as Commander, Atlantic Submarine Flotilla, he was ordered to duty in connection with the building of Diesel engines in the tanker USS *Maumee*, under construction at the New London Ship and Engine Building Company, Groton, Connecticut. He had detached duty in the summer of 1913 to study engines at the Diesel Engine plants in Nuremberg, Germany, and Ghent, Belgium. Returning to the New York Navy Yard, where *Maumee* was completed, he had duty as her Executive Officer and Engineer from her commissioning on 23 October 1916, until 4 August 1917.

After he was detached—the United States was then at war with Germany—he reported on 10 August 1917 for duty as Aide to the Commander Submarine Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet. On 6 February 1918 he was appointed Chief of Staff and was awarded a Letter of Commendation by the Secretary of the Navy.

On 16 September 1918, just before the Armistice, he reported for duty in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, Navy Department, Washington, D.C., and on 25 October, was given additional duty as Senior Member, Board of Submarine Design. From May 1919 until June 1920 he served as Executive Officer of USS *South Carolina*. When detached, he had orders to command USS *Chicago*, with additional duty in command of Submarine Division 14, based at Pearl Harbor, T.H. Returning to the United States on board USS *Argonne*, in the summer of 1922, he completed instruction at the Naval War College, Newport, Rhode Island, in June 1923, then had duty as Aide and Assistant Chief

of Staff to Commander Battle Fleet, and later to the Commander in Chief, U.S. Fleet (Admiral S.S. Robison).

In August 1926 he was ordered to the University of California, where he installed and taught in one of the first Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps Units established in a university. In June 1929 he was ordered to command Submarine Division 20 (redesignated Submarine Division 12, 1 April 1931). In June 1931 he was transferred to command of USS *Rigel* and the destroyers out of commission at the Destroyer Base, San Diego, California. In October 1933 he assumed command of USS *Augusta* and cruised in her to the Far East, where in December she relieved USS *Houston* as flagship of the Asiatic Fleet.

Detached from command of *Augusta* in April 1935, he returned home to serve for three years as Assistant Chief of the Bureau of Navigation. He was then designated Commander, Cruiser Division 2, Battle Force, and in September 1938 was transferred to command of Battleship Division One, Battle Force. He remained in command until May 1939, and on 15 June of that year, was appointed Chief of the Bureau of Navigation, for a term of four years. Before the term was completed however, the United States was at war, and on 31 December 1941, became Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet, with the rank of Admiral. On 3 April 1942 he assumed the title of Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet and Commander in Chief, Pacific Ocean Areas. He was presented the Distinguished Service Medal by the President, awarded in the name of Congress.

By Act of Congress, approved 14 December 1944, the grade of Fleet Admiral of the United States Navy—the highest grade in the Navy—was established for certain officers of the Active List, and the next day the President of the United States nominated and, with the advice and consent of the Senate, appointed Admiral Nimitz to that rank. He accepted the appointment and took the Oath of Office on 19 December 1944.

On 1 September 1945 (Washington, D.C. time), Fleet Admiral Nimitz was one of the signers for the United States when Japan formerly signed the surrender terms aboard the battleship USS *Missouri* in Tokyo Bay.

On 5 October 1945, which had been officially designated as “Nimitz Day” in Washington, D.C., Admiral Nimitz was personally presented a Gold Star in lieu of the third Distinguished Service Medal by the President of the United States.

On 26 November 1945 his nomination to be Chief of Naval Operations, for a term of two years was confirmed by the Senate. He had hauled down his flag at Pearl Harbor, T.H., where he had hoisted it in December 1941 on board the submarine USS *Grayling*, in a harbor littered with wreckage of American warships, and on 15 December 1945 relieved Fleet Admiral Ernest J. King, USN, as Chief of Naval Operations. He was awarded the Gold Star in lieu of a fourth Distinguished Service Medal.

On 15 December 1947, he was detached as Chief of Naval Operations and ordered to San Francisco, California, for duty as directed by the Secretary of the Navy. On 1 January 1948, he reported as Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Navy in the Western Sea Frontier, and served in an advisory capacity, assisting in other matters pertaining to the Navy when called upon.

On 23 March 1949, the Secretary of State announced the nomination by the United Nations Secretary General, of Fleet Admiral Nimitz as Plebiscite Administrator for Kashmir, India and Pakistan having both previously agreed to the plebiscite. When it appeared that the plebiscite mission would be postponed indefinitely, however, Admiral Nimitz asked to be relieved, agreeing that if the two disputing states would come to terms he would again take up his duties. He accepted, alternately, an assignment as roving "good-will ambassador" of the United Nations, and from over a hundred speakers' platforms explained the major issues confronting the world organization. In addition to these duties, having remained on continuous active duty in the Navy, he was available for frequent consultation by leading defense figures.

On 23 January 1951, Admiral Nimitz was appointed Chairman of a nine-man Commission on Internal Security and Individual Rights, established by President Truman to consider how best to protect the United States from subversion without endangering the freedoms of American citizens. The Commission was not established due to the failure of Congress, however, to pass appropriate legislation.

The Admiral took an active interest in community affairs, and did considerable service for the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra. For eight years he served as Regent for the University of California. In addition, he was active in restoring good will with Japan—the nation he did so much to defeat in the War—by helping raise funds for the restoration of the battleship MIKASA, Admiral Togo's flagship at Tsushima in 1905, and by helping recover ceremonial swords and other items of sentimental value to the Japanese in the possession of ex-servicemen.

He died at his residence, Naval Quarters, Yerba Buena Island, San Francisco, California, on 20 February 1966. He was survived by his wife, the former Catherine Vance Freeman of Wollaston, Massachusetts; a son, Rear Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, Jr., USN, Retired; and three daughters, Catherine Vance (wife of Captain James T. Lay, USN, Retired); Anna Elizabeth (Nancy) Nimitz and Mary Manson Nimitz.

Scope and Content Note

The Papers of Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz consist of official and personal correspondence, orders, photographs, sound recordings, informational booklets, and other mementos collected by Fleet Admiral Nimitz during his forty-six years of service.

The collection is organized in sixteen series.

Series I consists of a series of binders containing a diary of events from Nimitz's service as Commander in Chief Pacific, and including key dispatches received or originated by his headquarters. Included also are Combined Chiefs of Staff books reprinted in chronological order. Although he was not a member of this body or present at its meetings, Nimitz collected these books during his tenure as Chief of Naval Operations in 1945-1947. This series is arranged chronologically.

Series II contains correspondence of an official and personal nature. The correspondence is mostly incoming, as very little of his outgoing correspondence was saved. The overall arrangement is chronological with each of the following subseries: A (1932-1945), B (1946-50), C (1951-1956), D (1957-1958), E (1959-1961), and F (1962-1966) separated into alphabetical folders, however not all of these individual folders are alphabetized. Subseries G is the 1957-1966 incoming and outgoing correspondence of Fleet Admiral Nimitz and is arranged chronologically by year. The last subseries H consists of address cards used in correspondence. His correspondence with Rear Admiral Ernest M. Eller, the Director of Naval History, is in Subseries F and contains information about his career and his papers being donated to Naval Historical Center. Additional correspondence is in Series XIII.

Series III consists of topical files containing correspondence and documents relating to various subjects. Many of the folders were gathered during Nimitz's tenure as Chief of Naval Operations. This series is arranged alphabetically by subject.

Series IV is a collection of speeches, press releases, and statements by Admiral Nimitz plus a few from other individuals that Admiral Nimitz saved which are in Subseries D. Subseries A. is FADM Nimitz's Speech File mostly from 1941 to . Some Press Releases were included in the speech file by Nimitz. Copies of his Press Releases are in Subseries C. All of the Subseries are arranged chronologically.

Series V documents Admiral Nimitz's activities as the United Nations Administrator for a proposed plebiscite between India and Pakistan. Included are incoming correspondence, United Nations publications, newspaper clippings, and an appointment book maintained by Nimitz for part of 1950. This series is arranged chronologically.

Series VI concerns Admiral Nimitz's birthdays, especially his Nimitz's 75th birthday which is Subseries A. Contained are cards, programs for the numerous celebrations, Congressional records, and congratulations from various nations. There is one oversize box in this series containing certificates relating to his birthday. The subseries are arranged alphabetically.

Series VII contains records from Nimitz's service as Chairman of the Presidential Commission on Internal Security and Individual Rights from January through October 1951. Included in this series are official correspondence, press releases, newspaper clippings, and background material on the Federal Employees Loyalty Program. The series is arranged chronologically.

Series VIII consists of newspaper clippings relating to Nimitz. There are also some photographs relating to the clippings. This series is arranged chronologically, and includes one oversize box.

Miscellaneous publications include articles written by Admiral Nimitz or relating to him in are contained in Series IX. There are also photographs pertaining to the publications and a number of books published by the Navy Department. This series is arranged alphabetically by title.

Series X contains materials from Admiral Nimitz's Navy career and his death. miscellaneous and unidentified materials. The series is arranged alphabetically.

Series XI contains photographs of events and people of interest to Admiral Nimitz. This series is arranged alphabetically by subject.

Sound recordings collected by Admiral Nimitz are in Series XII. Included are recordings of parades and television and radio shows. A number of films are also present in this series. These materials are arranged chronologically.

Included in Series XIII are personal and official files and correspondence. There are orders, appointments, commendations, and both official and family correspondence. This series is arranged chronologically with the correspondence arranged alphabetically.

Series XIV contains correspondence and material collected after the death of Admiral Nimitz. There are documents concerning his funeral, including a eulogy, photographs, and various memorial publications. Included as well are Mrs. Nimitz's diaries beginning in 1931 and ending in 1945.

Series XV contains material donated by Professor E.B. Potter. His correspondence with Admirals Nimitz, William Halsey, Arleigh Burke, Thomas Kinkaid, Raymond Spruance, and Ernest Eller concerning the book *Sea Power* can be found in this series. There are also magazine articles, brochures, and newspaper clippings concerning Admiral Nimitz as well as interviews and correspondence of a personal nature between family and relatives.
