FOREWORD

The records described in this Checklist were accumulated during the preparation of Samuel Eliot Morison's 15-volume History of United States Naval Operations in World War II (Boston: Little Brown and Co., 1946-1962).

Early in 1942, Professor Morison, then a member of the faculty of Harvard University, proposed to President Roosevelt and Secretary of the Navy Knox that such a history be undertaken. On 5 May 1942, Morison was commissioned a Lieutenant Commander in the U. S. Naval Reserve, and assigned to undertake the project. He continued on active duty until September 1946, achieving a rank of Captain, USNR. On 1 August 1951, he was transferred to the Honorary Retired List of the Naval Reserve and promoted to the rank of rear admiral.

While on active duty, Admiral Morison was provided a staff of naval assistants as well as office facilities in the Office of Naval Records and Library and the Office of Naval History, two of the predecessor organizations of the current Naval History Division. Following his release from active

duty, Morison continued to undertake this history under a contractual arrangement with the Navy Department. One of the terms of this contract called for the Naval History Division to continue to provide office space and a supporting staff to the author. When the last volume of the Morison history was published in 1962, that organization was disestablished.

The records accumulated by Admiral Morison and his staff include files relating to the administration of the project, and a much larger group of official and unofficial documentation that was used as source material in writing the history. Some of the preliminary drafts of the author, and a number of charts and maps used for reference purposes, also are included.
