1. Purpose. The purpose of this publication is to provide statistical information concerning the Naval Aeronautical Organization (NAO). It is primarily concerned with the current base loading of the aeronautical shore activities of the naval establishment. The NAO is published

semi-annually and contains information corrected to 1 January and 1 July of each year.

2. Cancellation. OPNAVNOTICE C5400 Ser 511/C1078 of 18 March 1974 is cancelled by this notice and will be destroyed by burning. No report of destruction is necessary.

3. Corrections Addressees responsible for the information in various sections of this publication are requested to notify the Chief of Naval Operations (Op-511) of any errors or omissions. In particular, commanding officers of each station are requested to review the command/support relationships and base loading figures pertaining to the station. A revised edition of that portion, reflecting the 1 January 1975 situation, should be forwarded to the Chief of Naval Operations by 1 December 1974.

5. Cancellation. This notice will be cancelled upon receipt of the next edition of the Naval Aeronautical Organization.



SUBMISSION OF THE 1 JANUARY 1975 UPDATES TO THIS DOCUMENT WILL CONFORM TO THE FORMAT OF THE EXAMPLE STATION LISTING SET FORTH BELOW.

NOTE 1/ Where a subordinate unit and its parent unit are listed aboard the same station, the figure for number of personnel of the parent unit will include those of its subordinates. The figures for the subordinate unit will be enclosed in parenthesis.

NOTE 2/ In any category, if an activity conducts student training, under that category state the average number of students by type (officer/enlisted) and service (USN/R or USMC/R).

#### DEFINITION OF TERMS AND AIDS TO UNDERSTANDING THIS BOOK

The planned Naval Aviation Shore Establishment, including Marine activities, for 1 July 1974 is reflected in the assigned missions of individual activities. These missions are promulgated and revised by the OPNAV Notice 5450 series. As directed by OPNAV Instruction 5450.171, it is the responsibility of Echelon 2 Commanders to promulgate functions and tasks for each activity under their command in support of the assigned mission. NAVAIR Instruction series 5451. contains a list of approved tasks for each activity under Naval Air Systems Command. Permanent duty stations of Naval units are contained in the effective edition of OPNAV Instruction 3111.14.

#### AIRCRAFT ON BOARD STATIONS

Operating allowances, and inventory by unit and model are published monthly in OPNAV NOTICE 03110 (Blue Book). Base aircraft data contained in this Notice reflect an on board (including home base deployed) count as of the date of the covering letter (1 January or 1 July). On board estimates are submitted by air stations and facilities a month or two in advance. Detailed accounting of aircraft in storage or undergoing rework at O&R facilities can be obtained from the Blue Book.

#### NAVY MANPOWER ALLOCATION

Tables on pages 6-12 of this publication include a Fiscal 1975 summary of the personnel allocations for aviation activities as of 1 July 1974. Personnel figures shown for the individual stations and activities reflect an estimated on board count of as 1 July 1974. Estimates are prepared within a month or two of the 1 July date.

Personnel data for USNR/USMCR squadrons/units represent numbers allowed in drill pay status. Active duty personnel (TARS and USN) associated with Reserve activities are shown separately.

#### COMMAND OVER SHORE ACTIVITIES

The exercise of command over a shore (field) activity has as its primary purpose the provision of effective support to the forces of the United States Navy and of the United States Marine Corps. It encompasses over-all authority, direction, control and coordination necessary to carry out the assigned mission, and responsibility for the operating efficiency of the activity. It includes authority and responsibility for mission planning, shore activity planning and workload planning. It also includes authority and responsibility for coordination the application of the various elements of support. Mission and facilities planning for shore (field) activities shall be accomplished with the guidance and assistance of commands, bureaus and offices assigned support responsibilities, and with the technical advice of other commands, bureaus and offices. Administrative and technical guidance shall include:

- a. The establishment of standards and procedures for specialized administrative or technical functions;
  - b. Professional and technical advice, guidance, and assistance;
  - c. Performance of specialized administrative or technical functions as a service.

Supervision by Staff Assistants over assigned shore (field) activities encompasses the same degree of authority and responsibility as command. (General Order 19, 20 October 1964.)

DEFINITION OF TERMS AND AIDS TO UNDERSTANDING THIS BOOK (Continued)

#### TECHNICAL SUPPORT TO COMMANDS AND ACTIVITIES

Technical support is a term denoting the responsibility of various systems commands, bureaus and offices within the Navy to provide resources to a command or activity of the Navy or Marine Corps to enable it to carry out its mission. It includes administrative, personnel and material support, guidance and assistance in and evaluation of such matters as organization, procedures, budgeting, accounting, staffing and the utilization of personnel funds, material and facilities. In addition, technical support includes the responsibility to assist command in evaluating the operating efficiency of activities. (General Order 19, 20 October 1964)

#### TYPES OF NAVAL AIR STATIONS

#### NAVAL AIR STATION

An independent activity that provides aircraft operating, maintenance, training and personnel facilities in accordance with organizational requirements.

#### NAVAL STATION

A shore activity capable of performing general functions, usually in direct support of the operating forces.

#### MARINE CORPS AIR STATION


An independent aviation activity developed to provide permanent facilities for a war strength Marine Air craft Wing and station forces, less the units deployed at subordinate Marine Corps Air Facilities and any Marine Corps Auxiliary Landing Field. A Marine Corps Air Station possesses facilities for maintenance work beyond the scope of the capabilities of the dependent fields. It acts as the supply stock point as designated for the subordinate airfields and air facilities to be supported and budgets and manages the funds for maintenance and operations for all assigned subordinate airfields and is under the command of the appropriate Commander, Marine Corps Air Bases.

#### NAVAL AIR FACILITY

An activity established to meet some special requirement of naval aviation. It may or may not be administratively dependent on a parent (air or nonair) activity, in accordance with organizational requirements.

#### AUXILIARY LANDING FIELD

An airfield having limited facilities, additional to the landing area in operation. It is designated as such by the Chief of Naval Operations to provide an airfield which can serve as: a staging base for gunnery, ordnance, or other training exercises; a mirror or other landing practice site; or emergency or "Bingo" field in support of off-shore carrier operations, and/or a base, with limited support, for assigned aircraft or units. The facilities and/or services may include any or all of the following as appropriate to usage and/or user requirements: air traffic control, communications, fire and crash rescue services, personnel berthing and messing, refueling and rearming equipment, ready issue stowage, line operations, line maintenance, high usage line maintenance spare parts and limited support of assigned aircraft or units. An ALF is not a separately established activity but is under the cognizance of a nearby parent air station from which personnel, materiel and funds for its support are allocated. The parent air station may maintain a caretaker detachment and/or service unit at the ALF for day-to-day operations.



#### DEFINITION OF TERMS AND AIDS TO UNDERSTANDING THIS BOOK (Continued)

#### OUTLYING FIELD (HELICOPTER OUTLYING FIELD (H) OLF)

An air field having no established facilities in operation except a landing area. It is designated as such by the Chief of Naval Operations to provide a landing area on which aircraft based elsewhere can conduct landing practice or other exercises. An OLF is not a separately established activity but is under the cognizance of a nearby parent air station from which personnel, materiel and funds for its support are allocated. No personnel are permanently based at an OLF. However, required air traffic control and/or crash rescue personnel, or others appropriate to support the operations to be conducted, along with mobile facilities as required to supplement existing facilities, may be located at the OLF either on a "duration of the operation" or a "normal operating hours" basis.

#### ACTIVE

<u>Development.</u> A non-operating condition during the construction or preparation period of an <u>activity.</u>

Fully Operational. Adequate personnel and facilities to support the assigned mission and planned operations.

<u>Maintenance</u>. Minimum personnel and facilities to support emergency or intermittent operations and maintenance of equipment in an operating or preserved condition. Fully operational status can be achieved by addition of personnel.

Partial Maintenance. Minimum personnel for security, fire protection and maintenance. Minimum facilities and utilities essential for occasional use, when required by operating forces, are maintained in an operable or preserved condition. Additional personnel and equipment necessary during such use are to be provided by the operating units.

#### INACTIVE

Mobilization. This designation is utilized solely to identify real property of an non-operating shore (field) activity retained for mobilization purposes. The major claimant who establishes the requirement for the "Mobilization" designation is responsible for physical security, fire protection and static maintenance (timely correction of defects conducive to accelerated deterioration).

Excess. This designation is utilized solely to identify real property of a shore (field) activity being processed as excess to the needs of the Navy. The major claimant to whom the "Excess" shore (field) activity was assigned when active is responsible for physical security, fire protection and static maintenance until final disposal of the real property, in accordance with applicable directives.

# f. Naval Air Maintenance Training

This type of training is offered by NAMTRAGRU (Naval Air Maintenance Training Group) through 51 NAMTRADETS (Naval Air Maintenance Training Detachments) at 25 locations throughout the continental USA. The objective is to provide efficient and effective onsite training to the maximum number of fleet and air training command personnel at a minimum cost. Training is provided in the specific skills required to support 23 aircraft weapon systems operated by the fleet and air training commands. Courses of instruction are provided in all aspects of organizational and intermediate maintenance necessary to maintain each weapon system, their sub-systems, components and associated support equipment. 



II. Special Board of Flight Surgeons. Convene, as required, a Special Board of Flight Surgeons to provide for examination of Naval aviation personnel requiring specialized study.

III. Financial and Fiscal Support. Provide complete financial and fiscal support to the component activities of the Center including financial planning and property and cost accounting and reporting.

#### NAVAL HOSPITAL

Location: Naval Aerospace and Regional Medical Center, NAS Pensacola, Florida

Mission: To provide general clinical and hospitalization services for active duty Navy and Marine Corps personnel, active duty members of the other armed services, dependents of active duty personnel, and other authorized persons as outlined in current directives. To participate as an integral element of the Naval Regional Health Care System. To cooperate with military and civil authorities in matters pertaining to health, sanitation, local disasters, and other emergencies.

#### NAVAL AEROSPACE MEDICAL INSTITUTE

Location: Naval Aerospace and Regional Medical Center, Pensacola, Florida

Mission: To conduct training of aviation medical personnel in aerospace medicine, aerospace psychology, aerospace physiology, hearing conservation and allied fields; to support the Naval Air Training Command in the selection, indoctrination and training of non-medical aviation personnel; to assist in the definition of future areas of research as related to proposed weapon systems; to assist in the implementation of research results; to provide professional and consultation services in aerospace medicine, hearing conservation and human factors to the aviation community; and to provide administrative support to the Naval Aerospace Medical Research Laboratory.

Program: I. Training. The training program consists of training medical officers in aerospace medicine, qualifying them for designation as Naval Flight Surgeon; providing training in aerospace physiology for Medical Service Corps officers for designation as Aerospace Physiologists; providing training in aerospace experimental psychology for Medical Service Corps officers for designation as Aerospace Experimental Psychologist; conducting a residency program for preparation of applications for eligibility for certification in Aerospace Medicine by the

American Board of Preventive Medicine; providing post-graduate instruction in aerospace medicine; training enlisted personnel as technical assistants for flight surgeons, qualifying them for the designation of Aerospace Medicine Technician; training enlisted personnel as technical assistants for aerospace physiologists, qualifying them for designation as Aerospace Physiology Technician; training enlisted personnel as technical assistants to medical officers, qualifying them for designation as Audiometric Technician; training corpsmen in aviation physical standards and physical examination, qualifying them for aviation recruiting duty; and supporting the Naval Air Training Command in the physiological indoctrination and instruction of non-medical aviation personnel in high altitude, night vision, emergency escape procedures, and other related fields.

Program: II. Professional Services. The Naval Aerospace Medical Institute provides examining facilities to determine the physical and psychological fitness of personnel for admission to and retention in the Naval Aviation Training program, and for determining the physical fitness for flying of other military personnel who require a complete physical examination and reporting on Standard Form 88 as directed by the Commanding Officer, Naval Aerospace and Regional Medical Center; provides professional and clerical assistance necessary to process cases referred to the Special Board of Flight Surgeons convened by the Commanding Officer of the Naval Aerospace and Regional Medical Center; provides the Naval Air Training Command and other Commands with professional and clerical assistance to evaluate the performance of aviation personnel. Maintains a medical data bank on all naval flight personnel for clinical research purposes and for aircrew morbidity studies; and maintains liaison with operational and other type commands for the purpose of defining research problems, and to assist in the implementation of medical and human factors research results.

Program: III. Hearing Conservation. The Naval Aerospace Medical Institute assists the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery in planning, directing and coordinating a comprehensive program of hearing conservation for all Navy and Marine Corps activities. Conducts training courses in hearing conservation program concepts for flight surgeons, aerospace physiologists, and industrial hygienists, and in audiometric techniques and audiometer maintenance and calibration for Navy audiometric technicians. Manages a program of repair and calibration of audiometric equipment for all naval activities. Evaluates equipment for the Navy's Hearing Conservation program and advises the Field Branch, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery of its findings. Provides technical consultation to the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery and CNM Commands. Conducts laboratory and field studies to obtain a variety of data essential to the implementation and maintenance of effective Navy-wide hearing conservation program procedures. Recommends auditory standards for naval aviation personnel.

# NAVAL AEROSPACE MEDICAL RESEARCH LABORATORY

Location: Naval Aerospace Medical Institute, Pensacola, Florida

(Naval Aerospace Medical Research Laboratory Detachment is located at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration Michoud Assembly Facility,

New Orleans, Louisiana)

Mission: Conduct research, development, test and evaluation in aerospace medicine and related scientific areas applicable to aerospace systems.

Program: I. Research. Naval Aerospace Medical Research Laboratory research investigators are concerned with flight personnel and center around (1) their psychological aptitude and professional fitness in flying, (2) their physical fitness, and (3) their tolerances for flight stresses. Investigations in the last named area deal chiefly with impact acceleration, motion sickness, disorientation, noise, changes in ambient pressure, non-ionizing radiation, psychoacoustics, and angular and linear acceleration. The research laboratory is staffed with military and civilian scientific personnel, and is equipped to conduct research studies in the following areas: aviation medicine, cardiology, acoustical sciences, vestibular physiology, bioengineering, physiological optics, biophysics, aviation personnel standards, training and reevaluation of aviation personnel, human factors engineering, performance assessment, and biomedical studies using animals.

II. Special Projects. The Naval Aerospace Medical Research Laboratory cooperates with other Departments, Offices, Commands, Bureaus, and Agencies such as the Army, the Air Force, the Department of Transportation, Office of Naval Research, Naval Material Command, Naval Electronics Systems Command, Naval Air Systems Command and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

1. Attack Carrier Air Wing (CVW)

To conduct and coordinate offensive air operations, including attacks on air, and surface, targets afloat and ashore which threaten control of the sea, and to conduct sustained air operations in support of other forces.

2. Carrier Air Wing (CVW)

To conduct and coordinate offensive and defensive air operations, including attacks on air, surface, and subsurface targets afloat and ashore which threaten control of the sea, and to conduct sustained air operations, including ASW, in support of other forces.

3. Patrol Wing (PATWING)

To conduct and coordinate offensive and defensive air anti-submarine operations in designated ocean areas of the world.

4. Attack Carrier Air Wing Reserve (CVWR)

To provide an equipped, trained, and oriented Reserve attack carrier air wing which will be available for rapid deployment in the event of mobilization.

5. Carrier ASW Air Group Reserve (CVSGR)

To provide an equipped, trained, and mission oriented Reserve carrier ASW air group which will be available for rapid deployment in the event of mobilization.

6. Reserve Patrol Wing (PATRESWING)

To provide equipped, trained and mission oriented Reserve antisubmarine squadrons which will be available for rapid deployment in the event of mobilization.

#### OTHER NAVY AIR WINGS/GROUPS

1. Light Attack Wing (LATWING)

To train and support combat light attack squadrons capable of conducting offensive air-to-surface operations with conventional and nuclear weapons.

2. Medium Attack Wing (MATWING)

To train and support combat medium attack squadrons capable of conducting offensive air-to-surface operations with conventional and nuclear weapons in all-weather conditions.

3. Fighter Wing (FITWING)

To conduct special oceanographic projects (MAGNET, ASWEPS and BIRDSEYE) and such other special CNO projects that may be assigned.

23. Training Squadron (VT)

To give basic and advanced fixed wing flight training and such other training as may be directed to assigned students of the Naval Air Training Command.

24. Helicopter Training Squadron (HT)

To give basic and advanced rotary wing flight training and such other training as may be directed to assigned students of the Naval Air Training Command.

- 25. Tactical Air Control Squadron (TACRON)
- a. Establish a Tactical Air Control Center or a Tactical Air Direction Center afloat for the control and coordination of tactical aircraft in amphibious operations.
- b. To train Tactical Air Units in the principles and procedures of Tactical Air Control in support of amphibious operations.
- \* Certain squadron(s) in this category are designated as replacement training squadrons. Their mission is to indoctrinate and train pilots, aircrewmen, and maintenance personnel in the current applicable aircraft in order to provide a maximum level of air combat readiness.

## FLEET AVIATION SPECIALIZED OPERATIONAL TRAINING GROUP

- a. To familiarize, indoctrinate and refresh designated fleet personnel (including personnel destined for fleet assignments) in the specialized operational and tactical employment of weapon systems and equipments.

- a. Support Air Test and Evaluation Squadron FOUR in missile evaluations as directed. Insure that a fleet environment is provided for missiles and associated equipment under evaluation.
- b. Render Missile Training, and technical support to ships and squadrons as may be assigned.

#### **AVIATION COMMANDS**

1. Commander Carrier Group

Immediate operational commander of an attack division consisting of one or more aircraft carriers and associated aircraft and supporting escorts. Directs the employment of assigned ships and aircraft in offensive and defensive operations to maintain control of the sea and provide support to other friendly forces.

2. Commander Naval Air Reserve Force (COMNAVAIRESFOR)

To administer the Naval Air Reserve Force so as to maintain the assigned personnel and aircraft in a state of training, readiness and availability which will permit immediate response and rapid employment by the active forces in the event of partial or full mobilization.

#### **AVIATION SHIPS**

1. Multipurpose Carrier (CV)

To support and operate aircraft to engage in attacks on targets at sea and ashore which threaten our control of the sea and to engage in sustained operations in support of other forces.

2. Attack Carrier (CVA) and (CVA(N))

To support and operate aircraft to engage in attacks on targets afloat and ashore which threaten our control of the sea and to engage in sustained operations in support of other forces.

3. Aircraft Repair Ship - Aircraft (ARVA)

To provide logistic support and repair facilities to aviation units operating at unequipped air bases.



# MARINE AVIATION UNITS

1. Marine Aircraft Wing (MAW)

Conduct air operations in support of the Fleet Marine Forces to include anti-air warfare, offensive air support, assault support, aerial reconnaissance, control of aircraft and missiles, and as a collateral function, to participate, in the execution of such other Navy functions as the fleet commanders direct.

2. Marine Wing Headquarters Squadron (MWHS)

To provide command, administrative, and supply support, and camp facilities for a Marine Wing HQs and certain elements of the Marine Air Control Group.

3. Marine Wing Support Group (MWSG)

To provide administration logistics and services in support of the Marine Aircraft Wing.

4. Marine Air Control Group (MACG)

Provide, operate and maintain the air control system of the Marine Aircraft Wing.

5. Marine Aircraft Group (MAG VF/VA)

Conduct anti-air warfare and offensive air support operations in support of Fleet Marine Forces from advanced bases, expeditionary airfields and aircraft carriers. Conduct such other air operations as may be directed.

6. Marine Aircraft Group (MAG VH)

Provide helicopter and observation support for helicopterborne operations in support of the Fleet Marine Forces and such other air operations as may be directed.

7. Marine Combat Crew Readiness Training Group (MCCRTG) Provide specialized tactical and technical training for pilots and aircrewmen in airborne weapons and weapon systems for the conduct of offensive air support and anti-air warfare operations in support of the Fleet Marine Forces. Provide training in weapons selection, delivery, loading, courier and handling of all air delivered stockpiled nuclear, biological, chemical and conventional air-to-surface and air-to-air munitions. Provide aviation technical training for aviation technical personnel. Conduct such other training and air operations as may be directed by higher authority.

8. Marine Helicopter Training Squadron (HMT)

Provide helicopter training for selected air crews and maintenance personnel in support of Fleet Marine Forces and such other air operations as may be directed by higher authority.


9. Marine Composite Reconnaissance Squadron (VMCJ)

Conduct aerial multisensor imagery reconnaissance, airborne active and passive electronic and communications countermeasures and airborne electronic reconnaissance in support of Fleet Marine Force operations.

10. Marine Aerial Refueler Transport
Squadron (VMGR)

Provide assault air transport of personnel, equipment and supplies and provide aerial refueling service in support of Fleet Marine Forces and conduct such other air operations as may be directed.



# MARINE AVIATION UNITS (Continued)

11. Marine Fighter/Attack Squadrons (VMFA)

Intercept and destroy enemy aircraft under allweather conditions, attack and destroy surface targets and conduct such other air operations as may be directed.

12. Marine Attack Squadrons (VMA)

Attack and destroy surface targets; escort helicopters and conduct such other air operations as may be directed.

13. Marine Attack Squadrons (VMA(AW))

Attack and destory surface targets under all weather conditions. Escort helicopters and conduct such other air operations as may be directed.

14. Marine Fighter Attack Training Squadron (VMFAT)

Conduct combat capable jet intercept fighter/ attack training for selected Naval Aviators and Naval Flight Officers with emphasis upon training for all-weather operations. Provide aviation technical training for designated aviation technical personnel as directed. Conduct such other training as may be required in support of the Fleet Marine Forces.

15. Marine Attack Training Squadron (VMAT)

Conduct jet attack training for selected pilots with emphasis upon weapons delivery in destruction of ground targets. Provide aviation technical training for designated aviation technical personnel as directed. Conduct such other training as may be required in support of the Fleet Marine Forces.

16. Marine All-Weather Attack
Training Squadron (VMAT(AW))

Conduct jet attack training for selected pilots and aircrewmen with emphasis upon the attack and destruction of surface targets under all-weather conditions. Provide aviation technical training for aviation technical personnel as directed. Conduct such other training as may be required in support of the Fleet Marine Forces.

17. Marine Helicopter Attack Squadron (HMA)

Provide close-in fire support during aerial and ground escort operations during the ship-to-shore movement and within an objective area.

18. Marine Light Helicopter Squadrron (HML)

Provide utility combat helicopter support to the Landing Force in the ship-to-shore movement and in subsequent operations ashore.

Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron (HMM)

Provide helicopter transport of personnel, supplies and equipment for the landing force during ship-to-shore movement and within an objective area.

20. Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron (HMH)

Provide helicopter transport of supplies, equipment, and personnel for the landing force during ship-to-shore movement and within an objective area.



# MARINE AVIATION UNITS (Continued)

21. Marine Observation Squadron (VMO)

Conduct visual aerial reconnaissance and observation and such other air operations as may be directed.

22. Marine Air Support Squadron (MASS)

Provide facilities for the control of aircraft operating in close or direct support of Fleet Marine Force operations.

23. Marine Air Control Squadron (MACS/MTDS)

Provide air surveillance and control of aircraft and surface-to-air missiles for anti-air warfare in support of the Fleet Marine Forces.

24. Marine Air Base Squadron (MABS)

Provide air base facilities and services (except airfield construction) for the Marine Aircraft Group or supplement the air base facilities and services, provided by a station or facility, when based thereon.

25. Wing Equipment and Repair Squadron (WERS)

To provide motor transport and engineer support for the Marine Aircraft Wing.

 Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron (H&MS) (MWSG)

To provide personnel administration and Wing level Marine Corps supply support for all Wing units, and provide administrative and logistic support for organic units, and to maintain and operate the Wing Flight Section.

27. Headquarters & Maintenance Squadron (H&MS)

Perform logistical and administrative support for units attached to the Marine Aircraft Group.

28. Headquarters & Headquarters Squadron (H&HS) (MACG)

Perform administrative and logistical functions for the Marine Air Control Group.

29. Light Anti-Aircraft Missile Battalion (LAAM)

Provide surface-to-air missile defense of assigned areas of operation and vital zones therein, against hostile low and medium altitude air attacks.

30. Marine Wing Communications Squadron (MWCS)

Provide command and administrative communications for a Marine Wing Headquarters.

31. Marine Aviation Detachment (MAD)


Provide administrative support for assigned Marine Corps personnel and perform such other tasks and functions as directed by the Commandant of the Marine Corps.

32. Marine Helicopter Squadron ONE (HMX)

Provide helicopter support to the Marine Corps Schools for development of helicopter tactics, techniques and equipment for the landing force operations and student demonstrations and indoctrination as directed, provide special helicopter lift support as required by the Secretary of Defense.









33. Marine Air Tactical Control Unit (MATCU)

Direct and control air traffic, including take-offs and landings, within a Traffic Control Area or Zone around SATS or other expeditionary airfields under all-weather conditions.

34. Marine Aviation Training Support Group (MATSG)

Provide administrative support for assigned Marine Corps personnel, and perform such other tasks and functions as directed by the CMC.





#### NAVAL WEATHER SERVICE COMMAND

# 1. Fleet Numerical Weather Central (Command - COMNAVWEASERV) (Support - OMN & OPN, COMNAVWEASERV - RDT&E, NAVAIRSYSCOM)

<u>Mission:</u> To provide, on an operational basis, numerical meteorological and oceanographic products peculiar to the needs of the Department of the Navy; and to develop and test numerical techniques in meteorology and oceanography applicable to Naval Weather Service Command analytical and forecasting problems.

The Fleet Numerical Weather Central (FLENUMWEACEN), Monterey is the master computer center and hub of the Navy Environmental Data Network (NEDN). The NEDN includes high-speed data links connecting computers at various Fleet Weather Centrals (FLEWEACEN's), selected Fleet Weather Facilities (FLEWEAFAC's) and Naval Weather Service Facilities (NAVWEASERV-FAC's). It is linked with the data collection networks of the U.S. Air Force and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and provides world coverage.

# 2. Fleet Weather Central (Command and Support - COMNAVWEASERV)

Mission: To provide within areas of responsibility as assigned by the Commander, Naval Weather Service Command, detailed meteorological and related services to the Department of the Navy and oceanographic forecasts to the Armed Forces of the Department of Defense.

Fleet Weather Centrals, under Commanding Officers, are assigned geographic areas of responsibility in which they perform the functions of data collection, centralized computer processing and analysis, and dissimination of analyses, forecasts, warnings, and ship routing information. Fleet Weather Centrals have concurrent responsibility to appropriate Fleet Commanders in Chief who exercise authoritative control over product output of the Centrals to meet requirements of the operating forces. Commanding Officers are ordered ADDU to the Commanders in Chief for this purpose.

# 3. Fleet Weather Facilities (Command and Support - COMNAVWEASERV)

Mission: To provide within local and/or functional areas of responsibilities assigned by the Commander, Naval Weather Service Command detailed meteorological and related services to the Department of the Navy; and to assist the Fleet Weather Centrals in the accomplishment of their missions as directed.

Fleet Weather Facilities assist the Fleet Weather Centrals in the performance of their assigned functions. In addition they are assigned specialized tasks such as Anti-Submarine Warfare Environmental Prediction Service (ASWEPS) support, surf and swell forecasting; and ice reconnaissance coordination and forecasting.

# 4. Naval Weather Service Facilities (Command and Support - COMNAVWEASERV)

Mission: To provide within functional areas of responsibility as assigned by Commander, Naval Weather Service Command, detailed meteorological and related services to the Department of the Navy; and to perform such other functions or tasks as may be directed by the Commander, Naval Weather Service Command.

Naval Weather Service Facilities perform basically the same duties as a Fleet Weather Facility but, have the additional function of command and support of assigned Naval Weather Service Environmental Detachments (NWSED's) and Naval Weather Service Detachments (NWSD's).

#### NAVAL WEATHER SERVICE COMMAND

5. Naval Weather Service Environmental Detachment (Command and Support - Fleet Weather Centrals/Facilities/Naval Weather Service Facilities)

Mission: To provide, as directed and within local/functional areas of responsibility, meteorological and oceanographic services to military activities, staffs, units, and to all transients at host stations.

Naval Weather Service Environmental Detachments (NWSED's), under Officers in Charge, are established by the Commander, Naval Weather Service Command as subordinate units of Fleet Weather Centrals/Facilities/Naval Weather Service Facilities. They normally are located at Naval Stations and Naval Air Stations to provide environmental support to units and activities within the immediate geographic areas. Officers in Charge are ordered to ADDU to appropriate local commanders.

The NWSED Asheville is located at the National Climatological Center (NCC), Asheville. North Carolina. Its unique mission is to manage Navy Climatological efforts at the NCC, the coordination of those efforts with the Air Force and NOAA in utilizing the joint computer facility and data files at that location, the quality control of Navy meteorological records, and the routine forwarding of reports of observational discrepancies to the activities concerned for training purposes.

6. Naval Weather Service Detachment (Command and Support - Fleet Weather Centrals/ Facilities/Naval Weather Service Facilities)

Mission: To provide, as directed, specialized services to support the missions of the Naval Weather Service Command.

7. Environmental Prediction Research Facility (Command and Support - NAVAIRSYSCOM)

Mission: Conduct research and development directed towards providing effective local, regional and global environmental analysis and prediction techniques; and provide planning, modeling and evaluation services for the Naval Weather modification program.
