Subj: Naval Aeronautical Organization for Fiscal Year 1964 (Revised 1 January 1964),  
promulgation of (U)

1. Purpose. The Naval Aeronautical Organization (NAO) is the primary source of planning information on current base loading of the aeronautical shore activities of the Naval Establishment. It includes a detailed presentation of the various naval aviation programs appearing in the Basic Naval Establishment Plan (BNEP). The NAO is published semi-annually and contains information corrected to 1 January and 1 July of each year.

2. Cancellation of Previous Publication. OPNAV NOTICE P05400 Ser 01309P50 of 1 July 1963 is cancelled by this Notice and will be destroyed by burning. No report of destruction is necessary.

3. Review and Approval. This publication has been reviewed and approved in accordance with SECNAV INST 5600.16 of 2 November 1960.

4. Corrections. Addressees are requested to notify the Chief of Naval Operations (Op-501) of any errors or omissions. It is further requested that the Commanding Officer of each station review that portion of the base loading section pertaining to that station and forward a revised edition, reflecting the 1 July 1964 situation, to this office by 1 June 1964. If the data is unchanged, a report indicating no change should be submitted.

5. Classification and Downgrading. The security classification of this publication is automatically downgraded from Confidential to Unclassified on 1 January 1969. This action is in accordance with section 3, chapter 4 of OPNAV INST 5510.1B and OPNAV INST 5500.40B. Upon downgrading, this publication will be marked "FOR OFFICIAL USE ONLY."

6. Cancellation. This Notice will be cancelled upon receipt of the next issue of the Naval Aeronautical Organization and for record purposes on 1 September 1964.





The planned Naval Aviation Shore Establishment, including Marine Activities, for the Fiscal Year 1964 is reflected in the assigned missions of individual activities. These missions are based on the Basic Naval Establishment Plan for Fiscal Year 1964 and may be modified as revised SECNAV NOTICES are issued. Assigned tasks to accomplish the listed mission are promulgated by BUWEPS NOTICES (Series 5451) which supersede the OPNAV NOTICES for each activity. The "units/activities to be supported" by individual activities are designated by the Chief of Naval Operations and will be listed in the appropriate BUWEPS NOTICE 5451 and as shown herein. Permanent duty stations of Naval units are contained in the effective edition of OPNAV INSTRUCTION 3114.14.

NAVAL AIR BASES COMMAND

Under the Commandant of a Naval District, comprises, in general, Naval and Marine Corps aviation shore activities which furnish facilities for the operation of aircraft. There are exceptions however. Marine Corps aviation activities in the Fifth and Eleventh Naval Districts generally fall under Marine Corps Air Bases Command, Eastern or Western area as appropriate. Training (including NART) stations are under the military command of the Chief of one of the various Air Training Commands.

NAVAL AIR STATION

An independent activity that provides aircraft operating, maintenance, training, and personnel facilities in accordance with organizational requirements.

NAVAL AUXILIARY AIR STATION

An air installation that offers facilities similar to those provided by an air station and assists a parent air station in accordance with organizational requirements.

NAVAL STATION

A shore activity capable of performing general functions, usually in direct support of the operating forces.

MARINE CORPS AIR STATION


An independent aviation activity developed to provide permanent facilities for a war strength Marine Aircraft Wing and station forces, less the units deployed at subordinate Marine Corps Air Facilities and any Marine Corps Auxiliary Landing Field. A Marine Corps Air Station possesses facilities for maintenance work beyond the scope of the capabilities of the dependent fields. It acts as the supply stock point as designated for the subordinate airfields and air facilities to be supported and budgets and manages the funds for maintenance and operations for all assigned subordinate airfields and is under the military command of the appropriate Commander, Naval Air Bases, or Commander, Marine Corps Air Bases.

NAVAL AIR FACILITY

An activity established to meet some special requirement of naval aviation. It may or may not be administratively dependent on a parent (air or nonair) activity, in accordance with organizational requirements.

AUXILIARY LANDING FIELD

An airfield having limited facilities, additional to the landing area in operation. It is designated as such by the Chief of Naval Operations to provide an airfield which can serve as: a staging base for gunnery, ordnance, or other training exercises; a mirror or other landing practice site; an emergency or "Bingo" field in support of off-shore carrier operations, and/or a base, with limited support, for assigned aircraft or units. The facilities and/or services may include any or all of the following as appropriate to usage and/or user requirements: air traffic control, communications, fire and crash rescue services, personnel berthing and messing, refueling and rearming equipment, ready issue stowage, line operations, line maintenance, high usage line maintenance spare parts and limited support of assigned aircraft or units. An ALF is not a separately established activity but is under the cognizance of a nearby parent air station from which personnel, materiel and funds for its support are allocated. The parent air station may maintain a caretaker detachment and/or service unit at the ALF for day-to-day operations.



MAJOR CONTINENTAL AND EXTRA-CONTINENTAL AVIATION SHORE ACTIVITIES

OUTLYING FIELD (HELICOPTER OUTLYING FIELD (H)OLF)

An airfield having no established facilities in operation except a landing area. It is designated as such by the Chief of Naval Operations to provide a landing area on which aircraft based elsewhere can conduct landing practice or other exercises. An OLF is not a separately established activity but is under the cognizance of a nearby parent air station from which personnel, materiel and funds for its support are allocated. No personnel are permanently based at an OLF. However, required air traffic control and/or crash rescue personnel, or others appropriate to support the operations to be conducted, along with mobile facilities as required to supplement existing facilities, may be located at the OLF either on a "duration of the operation" or a "normal operating hours" basis.

STATUS

DEVELOPMENT

A non-operating condition during the construction or preparation period of an activity, requiring sufficient personnel to plan and implement an organization adequate to place in service all facilities needed to support initial operations. The Chief of Naval Operations or the Commandant of the Marine Corps, or the bureau or office, when assigned management control, shall collaborate with the Bureau of Yards and Docks, in assigning the administrative responsibility of the officer in command or in charge during the transition to an "Active" status.

ACTIVE

Fully Operational. An operating condition requiring facilities and personnel adequate to support planned operations and to maintain equipment in an operating condition.

Maintenance. An operating condition requiring minimum facilities and personnel to support emergency and intermittent operations, and to maintain equipment in an operating or preserved condition such that, by addition of personnel, "Fully Operational" status will result.

Partial Maintenance. A condition less than "Maintenance," requiring minimum personnel for security and fire protection and for the maintenance in operable or preserved condition of those minimum facilities and utilities essential to permit occasional use by operating units when and if required. The additional supporting personnel and equipment required during such periods of use will be provided by the operating units concerned.


INACTIVE

Mobilization. A non-operating condition requiring physical protection of the property, personnel necessary for fire protection and periodic inspections by local representatives, to insure that defects which would lead to accelerated deterioration are promptly corrected in accordance with accepted practices for economical static maintenance. This designation will be used solely to identify real property which is being retained for mobilization purposes.

Excess. Same as Inactive-Mobilization, except that this designation will be used solely to identify real property which is being processed as excess to the needs of the Navy.

O&R CLASSIFICATION

- Class A      Facilities are required for complete overhaul, repair, modification and test of aircraft, aircraft engines and all classes of aeronautical material.
- Class B      Facilities are required for complete overhaul, repair, modification and test of aircraft engines and accessories, but only for essential repairs to aircraft. Aircraft will not be overhauled in these departments. Instrument overhaul facilities will be provided only when directed by BUWEPS.
- Class C      Facilities are required for Maintenance only of aircraft and aircraft engines.
- Class D      Facilities as required for operation only of aircraft.



## MAJOR CONTINENTAL AND EXTRA-CONTINENTAL AVIATION SHORE ACTIVITIES

AIRCRAFT

Aircraft assigned to activities are planned assignments, and will reflect normal types and numbers of aircraft based on a given activity. Aircraft and unit deployments can be determined from OPNAV NOTICE P03110 (Blue Book). Aircraft assigned to O&R facilities and BUWEPS aircraft storage pools are omitted and can be found in the Blue Book.

PERSONNEL

Tables at the beginning of this publication include a fiscal 1964 summary of the personnel allocations for aviation activities as of 31 December 1963. Personnel figures shown for the individual stations and activities reflect an estimated on board count as of 1 January 1964. Estimates are prepared within a month or two of the 1 January date.

Figures for the number of personnel in a subordinate unit are enclosed in parentheses in those cases where the parent activity is also listed aboard the station and the figures for the parent activity include the personnel in the subordinate unit.

Personnel data for USNR/USMCR squadrons/units represent numbers allowed in drill pay status. Active duty personnel (TARS and USN) associated with Reserve activities are shown separately.

MANAGEMENT CONTROL

The exercise of executive authority and responsibility for the performance of the mission, tasks, and work of shore activities. This responsibility includes mission planning, shore activity development and work load planning, internal organization and procedures, budgeting, accounting, staffing, and the utilization of personnel, funds, materials and facilities. Management control also includes responsibility for appropriate coordination and application of technical direction. (U. S. Navy Regulations 1948 Art. 0405)

MILITARY COMMAND

a. Objective, Responsibility, and Authority. Military command has as its objective the effective and efficient military operation and military administration of shore activities. Responsibility for, and authoritative direction over military operation and military administration are inherent in military command.

b. Military command is the exercise of authority and responsibility for shore activities for: (1) matters which are responsibilities of the Chief of Naval Operations, or as appropriate, the Commandant of the Marine Corps, such as operations, security, intelligence, discipline, naval communications and similar matters of naval operation and administration; (2) coordination of the efforts of shore activities as is necessary to insure that direct support and services are furnished to operating forces of the Navy and Marine Corps in a timely and effective manner; (3) continuous evaluation of the capabilities and readiness of requirements; and (4) matters related to the customs, traditions, and usage of the naval service. Military command also includes matters related to defense, and under conditions of emergency or disaster, when normal exercise of management control is impractical, shall include the power and duty to exercise authoritative direction as circumstances may require. The function of inspection and the responsibility for appropriate coordination are inherent in military command. (General Order 19, 21 May 1959)

NAVAL AIR TRAINING COMMAND

NAVAL AIR TRAINING COMMAND

Location: Headquarters, NAS Pensacola, Florida.

Mission: To conduct naval aviation training, other than that assigned to the Operating Forces by the Chief of Naval Operations, in order to produce Naval Aviators, Naval Aviation Officers and other trained aviation personnel for the Naval Establishment, and to maintain a trained Naval Air Reserve.

Program: I. Flight Training Program

The official Flight Training Program for fiscal year 1964 is 1,700 Naval Aviators, consisting of 1,160 Navy, 450 Marine Corps and 90 Foreign and Coast Guard. The course length is approximately 18 months duration including Pre-Flight School.

II. Naval Aviation Officer Training Program

The Naval Aviation Officer (NAO) Program is designed to provide training in aviation skills, other than the actual control of aircraft. The official FY 1964 Program establishes an output of 845 Naval Aviation Observers and 85 Marine Radar Intercept Operators. In addition, 150 Limited Duty Officers and 120 Air Intelligence AOC's will receive indoctrination training in the U. S. Naval School of Pre-Flight. The indoctrination course for LDO's is 8 weeks; for AI's the course is 16 weeks. Duration of basic and advanced training courses and planned academic hours is as follows:

NAVAL AIR BASIC TRAINING COMMAND

Location: Headquarters, NAS Pensacola, Florida.

Mission: To coordinate and direct all pre-flight training, basic flight training, ground training and helicopter training at such activities as are placed under the cognizance of the Chief of Naval Air Basic Training.

Program: Basic training for both the flight training and Naval Aviation Officer Training Program is conducted primarily in the Pensacola area utilizing NAS Pensacola, NAAS Saufley, NAAS Whiting and NAAS Meridian, Mississippi with appropriate outlying fields assigned. Advanced Student Training in multi-engine and helicopter aircraft, and post-graduate helicopter training is given as indicated below. Duration of the basic flight training course (including Pre-Flight) is approximately 48 weeks; the advanced student multi-engine course, 10 weeks; and the helicopter advanced and post-graduate course, 12 weeks. Flight hour accomplishment planned for courses is as follows:

Advanced flight training for helicopter pipeline students is conducted at NAAS Whiting Field (multi-engine) and ALF Ellyson (helicopters) under the purview of the Chief of Naval Air Basic Training. Post-Graduate flight training is conducted at ALF Ellyson to provide helicopter transition for fleet naval aviators who have not previously had helicopter training.

The USS LEXINGTON (CVS-16) assigned to the Naval Air Training Command is under the control of the Chief of Naval Air Basic Training for the purpose of conducting qualification of student aviators.

NAVAL AIR ADVANCED TRAINING COMMAND

Location: Headquarters, NAS Corpus Christi, Texas

Mission: To coordinate and direct all advanced and specialized flight and ground training and such other training as may be assigned at such activities as are placed under the cognizance of the Chief of Naval Air Advanced Training.

Program: The various advanced flight training specialties include CV(Jet), VA(Prop), ME(Prop), and Helicopter Training. Advanced flight training is conducted primarily in the Corpus Christi, Texas area at NAS Corpus Christi, NAAS Kingsville, NAAS Chase Field with one multi-engine training squadron at NAAS New Iberia, Louisiana. Advanced Helicopter training is conducted at ALF Ellyson, Pensacola, Florida under the purview of the Naval Air Basic Training Command. All of these courses are entered upon completion of Basic Flight Training. The average duration of the various courses in the Advanced Training Command is 20 weeks with pilot hour accomplishment as follows:

NAVAL AVIATION MEDICAL CENTER

Location: NAS Pensacola, Florida

Mission: The mission of the Naval Aviation Medical Center is to administer the Naval School of Aviation Medicine and the Naval Hospital by direction, coordination, and professional supervision concerning aviation medical training, clinical and hospitalization services, aviation medical research, and evaluation of aeromedical equipment.

NAVAL HOSPITAL

Location: NAS Pensacola, Florida.

Mission: I. The primary mission of a naval hospital is:

a. The care and treatment of sick and injured military personnel with the object of their expeditious return to duty.

b. The prompt disposition of those patients who require special treatment not satisfactorily available or who are found physically unfit for retention in the military service.

II. Secondary mission of the naval hospital includes:

a. The instruction of medical department personnel, including intern and resident training when authorized.

b. The care and treatment of non-military patients, when authorized.

c. Research in medicine, dentistry and related specialties when authorized.

d. Cooperation with military and civil authorities in matters pertaining to health and sanitation and in the event of local disasters or emergencies.

NAVAL AIR TRAINING COMMAND

SCHOOL OF AVIATION MEDICINE

Location: U. S. Naval Aviation Medical Center, NAS, Pensacola, Florida.

Mission: To conduct training of aviation medical personnel and research in aviation and space medicine, aviation psychology, and allied fields, to evaluate aeromedical equipment; to support the Naval Air Training Command in the selection, indoctrination, and instruction of non-medical aviation personnel; and to provide professional and consultation services in aviation medical matters as required.

Program: I. Training. The training program consists of training medical officers in aviation medicine, qualifying them for designation as Naval Flight Surgeon or Naval Aviation Medical Examiner; training enlisted personnel as technical assistants for flight surgeons, qualifying them for the designation of Aviation Medicine Technician; providing postgraduate instruction in aviation medicine; providing special courses in aviation physiology for Medical Service Corps officers for designation as Aviation Physiologist; supports the Naval Air Training Command in the psychological selection and physiological indoctrination and instruction of non-medical aviation personnel in high altitude, night vision, emergency escape procedures, and other related fields; conducting a residency program for preparation of applicants for eligibility for certification in Aviation Medicine by the American Board of Preventive Medicine; and conducting a course for Aviation Medicine Technicians in Advanced Low Pressure Chamber Technique.

II. Research. The School of Aviation Medicine conducts basic and applied research in aviation and space medicine and in allied fields of science. The research laboratories are staffed with scientific personnel (military and civilian), and are equipped for conducting research studies in the following program areas: Stress due to high intensity noise; stress due to acceleration and deceleration; stress due to high altitude and space travel; stress due to disorientation; standards for aviation and astronautic personnel; aviation safety, escape and rescue; training and re-evaluation of aviation personnel; psychophysiology, including sensations and illusions; and human engineering.

III. Evaluation of Aeromedical Equipment. The School of Aviation Medicine conducts evaluations and acceptance testing for a variety of acoustical instruments, audiometers, audiometric booths, ear muffs, and ear plugs, and the like on behalf of the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery and the Bureau of Naval Weapons. These include items developed to meet the special requirements for the Navy's Hearing Conservation Program. They also include such items as the acoustical accessories and installations in full pressure suit helmets, cockpits, etc., which contribute to the efficiency of communication and the safety of naval aviators. Similar evaluations are made on many items of oxygen equipment, training aids and survival equipment.

IV. Aviation Physical Examination. The U. S. Naval School of Aviation Medicine provides examining facilities to determine the physical fitness of personnel for admission to and retention in the Naval Aviation Training Program, and for determining the physical fitness for flying of other Naval Aviation personnel; performs physical examinations on such other military personnel who require a complete physical examination and reporting on Standard Form 88 as directed by the Commanding Officer, Naval Aviation Medical Center; provides professional and clerical assistance necessary to process cases referred to the Special Board of Flight Surgeons convened by the Commanding Officer of the Naval Aviation Medical Center.

V. Special Projects. The U. S. Naval School of Aviation Medicine cooperates with other Bureaus and agencies such as the Bureau of Naval Weapons and the National Aeronautics and Space Agency in carrying out assigned special projects.

Training Load:

I. Naval Flight Surgeons. The School of Aviation Medicine graduates an average of 130 Flight Surgeons each year. In addition to Naval Medical Officers, graduates include medical officers of the U. S. Army, civilian personnel of the Federal Aviation Agency and the National Aeronautics and Space Agency, and medical officers of friendly foreign countries.

II. Naval Aviation Medicine Technicians. The School of Aviation Medicine graduates an average of 75 Aviation Medicine Technicians each year.

III. Advanced Low Pressure Chamber Technicians. The School of Aviation Medicine graduates an average of 18 Low Pressure Chamber Technicians each year.

Location: NAS Memphis, Tennessee.

Mission: To coordinate and direct all Naval and Marine Corps technical and specialized aviation training and such other training as may be assigned at activities placed under the cognizance of the Chief of Naval Air Technical Training.

Program: I. By the above mission, the Chief of Naval Air Technical Training is assigned the responsibility for training those aviation personnel who are primarily concerned with the maintenance and control of naval aircraft. The training programs set forth below are in effect to fulfill that responsibility.

Training Load: Approximately 3,800 reserve pilots, 3,500 ground/staff officers and 18,600 enlisted personnel, will utilize these facilities during regularly scheduled drills and active duty for training. The drill programs of the Naval and Marine Air Reserve are divided into two groups in terms of the number of drills authorized annually in a pay status: the 48-drill and the 24-drill programs. In addition to the pay drill programs both the Naval and Marine Air Reserve programs include a limited number of non-pay drill units and personnel. All personnel attached to the drill pay and non-pay drill units are in the Selected Reserve, personnel may be ordered to active duty either in time of war, in time of national emergency declared by the Congress or proclaimed by the President, or when otherwise authorized by law.

a. The 48-drill pay program is composed of combat and combat support type squadrons and units. The squadrons are trained to conform in mission with their regular Navy and Marine counterparts. The squadrons attend 48 drills per year in addition to an annual 14 day active duty training period. In addition to the authorized 48-drill pay program, supplemental drills by type and numbers have been approved for FY 64 as follows:




