

Subj: Naval Aeronautical Organization for Fiscal Year 1969; promulgation of

1. Purpose. The Naval Aeronautical Organization (NAO) is the primary source of planning information on current base loading of the aeronautical shore activities of the Naval Establishment. It includes a detailed presentation of the various naval aviation programs. The NAO is published semi-annually and contains information corrected to 1 January and 1 July of each year.
2. Cancellation of Previous Publication. OPNAV NOTICE 05400 Ser 01120P51 of 1 January 1968 is cancelled by this Notice and will be destroyed by burning. No report of destruction is necessary.
3. Review and Approval. This publication has been reviewed and approved in accordance with SECNAV Instruction 5600.16 of 2 November 1960.
4. Corrections. Addressees are requested to notify the Chief of Naval Operations (Op-511) of any errors or omissions. It is further requested that the Commanding Officer of each station review the portion of the base loading section pertaining to that station and forward a revised edition, reflecting the 1 January 1969 situation, to this office by 1 December 1968. If the data is unchanged, a report indicating no change should be submitted.
5. Report. Report Symbol OPNAV 5400-3 is assigned for this report.
6. Classification and Downgrading. The security classification of this publication is automatically downgraded from Confidential to Unclassified on 1 July 1980. This action is in accordance with paragraph 7.c.(3) of OPNAV Instruction 5500.40B. All of the above paragraphs are unclassified, and all of the content that follows is Confidential.
7. Cancellation. This Notice will be cancelled upon receipt of the next issue of the Naval Aeronautical Organization and for record purposes on 31 March 1969.

DEFINITION OF TERMS AND AIDS TO UNDERSTANDING THIS BOOK

The planned Naval Aviation Shore Establishment, including Marine Activities, for the Fiscal Year 1969 is reflected in the assigned missions of individual activities. These missions are promulgated and revised by SECNAV Notices. Assigned tasks to accomplish the listed mission are promulgated by NAVAIRSYSCOM Notices (Series 5451) which supersede the OPNAV Notices for each activity. The "units/activities to be supported" by individual activities are designated by the Chief of Naval Operations and will be listed in the appropriate NAVAIRSYSCOM NOTICE 5451 and as shown herein. Permanent duty stations of Naval units are contained in the effective edition of OPNAV INSTRUCTION 3111.14.

AIRCRAFT ON BOARD STATIONS

Operating allowances, inventory and planned operating assignments by unit and model are published monthly in OPNAV NOTICE 03110 (Blue Book). Base aircraft data contained in this Notice reflect an on board (including home base deployed) count as of the date of the covering letter (1 January or 1 July). On board estimates are submitted by air stations and facilities a month or two in advance. Detailed accounting of aircraft in storage or undergoing rework at O&R facilities can be obtained from the Blue Book.

PERSONNEL ALLOCATED TO ACTIVITIES

Tables on pages 4-7 of this publication include a Fiscal 1968 summary of the personnel allocations for aviation activities as of 30 June 1968. Personnel figures shown for the individual stations and activities reflect an estimated on board count as of 1 July 1968. Estimates are prepared within a month or two of the 1 July date.

FIGURES FOR THE NUMBER OF PERSONNEL IN A SUBORDINATE UNIT ARE ENCLOSED IN PARENTHESES IN THOSE CASES WHERE THE PARENT ACTIVITY IS ALSO LISTED ABOARD THE STATION AND THE FIGURES FOR THE PARENT ACTIVITY INCLUDE THE PERSONNEL IN THE SUBORDINATE UNIT.

Personnel data for USNR/USMCR squadrons/units represent numbers allowed in drill pay status. Active duty personnel (TARS and USN) associated with Reserve activities are shown separately.

COMMAND OVER SHORE ACTIVITIES

The exercise of command over a shore (field) activity has as its primary purpose the provision of effective support to the forces of the United States Navy and of the United States Marine Corps. It encompasses over-all authority, direction, control and coordination necessary to carry out the assigned mission, and responsibility for the operating efficiency of the activity. It includes authority and responsibility for mission planning, shore activity planning and workload planning. It also includes authority and responsibility for coordinating the application of the various elements of support. Mission and facilities planning for shore (field) activities shall be accomplished with the guidance and assistance of bureaus and offices assigned support responsibilities, and with the technical advice of other bureaus and offices. Administrative and technical guidance shall include:

- a. The establishment of standards and procedures for specialized administrative or technical functions;
- b. Professional and technical advice, guidance, and assistance;
- c. Performance of specialized administrative or technical functions as a service.

Supervision by Staff Assistants over assigned shore (field) activities encompasses the same degree of authority and responsibility as command. (General Order 19, 1 January 1965)

SUPPORT TO COMMANDS AND ACTIVITIES

Support is the collective term given to the responsibility assigned to an official of the Department of the Navy to provide resources to a command or activity of the Navy or Marine

Corps to enable it to carry out its mission. It includes administrative, personnel and material support, guidance and assistance in and evaluation of such matters as organization, procedures, budgeting, accounting, staffing and the utilization of personnel funds, material and facilities. In addition, support includes the responsibility to assist command in evaluating the operating efficiency of activities. A single official shall be charged with the primary support responsibility for each shore (field) activity. However, elements of material and other support may flow from an official not charged with the primary support responsibility. (General Order 19, 1 January 1965)

TYPES OF NAVAL AIR STATIONS

NAVAL AIR STATION

An independent activity that provides aircraft operating, maintenance, training, and personnel facilities in accordance with organizational requirements.

NAVAL AUXILIARY AIR STATION

An air installation that offers facilities similar to those provided by an air station and assists a parent air station in accordance with organizational requirements.

NAVAL STATION

A shore activity capable of performing general functions, usually in direct support of the operating forces.

MARINE CORPS AIR STATION

An independent aviation activity developed to provide permanent facilities for a war strength Marine Aircraft Wing and station forces, less the units deployed at subordinate Marine Corps Air Facilities and any Marine Corps Auxiliary Landing Field. A Marine Corps Air Station possesses facilities for maintenance work beyond the scope of the capabilities of the dependent fields. It acts as the supply stock point as designated for the subordinate airfields and air facilities to be supported and budgets and manages the funds for maintenance and operations for all assigned subordinate airfields and is under the command of the appropriate Commander, Marine Corps Air Bases.

NAVAL AIR FACILITY

An activity established to meet some special requirement of naval aviation. It may or may not be administratively dependent on a parent (air or nonair) activity, in accordance with organizational requirements.


AUXILIARY LANDING FIELD

An airfield having limited facilities, additional to the landing area in operation. It is designated as such by the Chief of Naval Operations to provide an airfield which can serve as: a staging base for gunnery, ordnance, or other training exercises; a mirror or other landing practice site; an emergency or "Bingo" field in support of off-shore carrier operations, and/or a base, with limited support, for assigned aircraft or units. The facilities and/or services may include any or all of the following as appropriate to usage and/or user requirements: air traffic control, communications, fire and crash rescue services, personnel berthing and messing, refueling and rearming equipment, ready issue stowage, line operations, line maintenance, high usage line maintenance spare parts and limited support of assigned aircraft or units. An ALF is not a separately established activity but is under the cognizance of a nearby parent air station from which personnel, materiel and funds for its support are allocated. The parent air station may maintain a caretaker detachment and/or service unit at the ALF for day-to-day operations.

OUTLYING FIELD (HELICOPTER OUTLYING FIELD (H) OLF)

An airfield having no established facilities in operation except a landing area. It is

designated as such by the Chief of Naval Operations to provide a landing area on which aircraft based elsewhere can conduct landing practice or other exercises. An OLF is not a separately established activity but is under the cognizance of a nearby parent air station from which personnel, materiel and funds for its support are allocated. No personnel are permanently based at an OLF. However, required air traffic control and/or crash rescue personnel, or others appropriate to support the operations to be conducted, along with mobile facilities as required to supplement existing facilities, may be located at the OLF either on a "duration of the operation" or a "normal operating hours" basis.

THE STATUS OF NAVAL AIR ACTIVITIES

DEVELOPMENT

A non-operating condition during the construction or preparation period of a station, requiring sufficient personnel to plan and implement an organization adequate to place in service all facilities needed to support initial operations. The member of the executive administration of the Department of the Navy assigned command shall collaborate with the Chief of Naval Material in assigning the administrative responsibility of the officer in command or in charge during the transition to an "Active" status.

ACTIVE

Fully Operational. An operating condition requiring facilities and personnel adequate to support planned operations and to maintain equipment in an operating condition.

Maintenance. An operating condition requiring minimum facilities and personnel to support emergency and intermittent operations, and to maintain equipment in an operating or preserved condition such that, by addition of personnel, "Fully Operational" status will result.

Partial Maintenance. A condition less than "Maintenance," requiring minimum personnel for security and fire protection and for the maintenance in operable or preserved condition of those minimum facilities and utilities essential to permit occasional use by operating units when and if required. The additional supporting personnel and equipment required during such periods of use will be provided by the operating units concerned.

INACTIVE

Mobilization. A non-operating condition requiring physical protection of the property, personnel necessary for fire protection and periodic inspections by local representatives, to insure that defects which would lead to accelerated deterioration are promptly corrected in accordance with accepted practices for economical static maintenance. This designation will be used solely to identify real property which is being retained for mobilization purposes.

Excess. Same as Inactive-Mobilization, except that this designation will be used solely to identify real property which is being processed as excess to the needs of the Navy.


O&R CLASSIFICATION

Class A Facilities are required for complete overhaul, repair, modification and test of aircraft, aircraft engines and all classes of aeronautical material.

Class B Facilities are required for complete overhaul, repair, modification and test of aircraft engines and accessories, but only for essential repairs to aircraft. Aircraft will not be overhauled in these departments. Instrument overhaul facilities will be provided only when directed by NAVAIRSYSCOM.

Class C Facilities are required for Maintenance only of aircraft and aircraft engines.

Class D Facilities are required for operation only of aircraft.

Training Load: Approximately 3,000 reserve pilots, 2,700 ground/Staff officers and 23,000 enlisted personnel, will utilize these facilities during regularly scheduled drills and active duty for training. The drill programs of the Naval and Marine Air Reserve are divided into two groups in terms of the number of drills authorized annually in a pay status: the 48-drill and the 24-drill programs. In addition to the pay drill programs both the Naval and Marine Air Reserve programs include a limited number of non-pay drill units and personnel. All personnel attached to the drill pay and non-pay drill units are in the Selected Reserve, personnel may be ordered to active duty either in time of war, in time of national emergency declared by the Congress or proclaimed by the President, or when otherwise authorized by law.

a. The 48-drill pay program is composed of combat and combat support, type squadrons and units. The squadrons are trained to conform in mission with their regular Navy and Marine counterparts. The squadrons attend 48 drills per year in addition to an annual 14 day active duty training period. In addition to the authorized 48-drill pay program, supplemental drills by type and numbers have been approved for FY as follows:

b. The 24-drill pay program is composed of Naval Air Systems Command Reserve Training Units and Marine Air Reserve Groups. These units train individuals to supplement the Naval Establishment upon mobilization. They attend 24 drills per year in addition to an annual 14 day active training period.

NAVAL AEROSPACE MEDICAL CENTER

Location: NAS Pensacola, Florida

Mission: To administer the Naval Hospital, Pensacola, and the Naval Aerospace Medical Institute by direction, coordination, and professional supervision concerning clinical and hospitalization services, aerospace medical training aerospace medicine research, and evaluation of aerospace medical equipment.

Program: I. Medical Supplies. Provide complete supply support to component commands of the Center and all other medical department activities in the greater Pensacola complex as designated for Cognizance "9L" material.

II. Special Board of Flight Surgeons. Convene, as required, a Special Board of Flight Surgeons to provide for examination of Naval Aerospace personnel requiring specialized study.

III. Financial and Fiscal Support. Provide complete financial and fiscal support to the component activities of the Center including financial planning and property and cost accounting and reporting.

NAVAL HOSPITAL

Location: Naval Aerospace Medical Center, NAS Pensacola, Florida

Mission: To provide general clinical and hospitalization services for active duty Navy and Marine Corps personnel, active duty members of the other armed services, dependents of active duty personnel, and other authorized persons as outlined in current directives. To cooperate with military and civilian authorities in matters pertaining to health, sanitation, local disasters, and other emergencies.

NAVAL AEROSPACE MEDICAL INSTITUTE

Location: Naval Aerospace Medical Center, Pensacola, Florida

Mission: To conduct training of Aerospace medical personnel and research in aviation and space medicine, aerospace psychology, and allied fields; to evaluate aeromedical equipment; to support the Naval Air Training Command in the selection, indoctrination, and instruction of nonmedical aviation personnel; and to provide professional and consultation services in aerospace medical matters as required.

Program: I. Training. The training program consists of training medical officers in aerospace medicine, qualifying them for designation as Naval Flight Surgeon or Naval Aviation Medical Examiner; training enlisted personnel as technical assistants for flight surgeons, qualifying them for the designation of Aerospace Medicine Technician; providing post-graduate instruction in aerospace medicine; providing training in aerospace physiology for Medical Service Corps officers for designation as Aerospace Physiologist; training enlisted personnel as technical assistants for aerospace physiologists, qualifying them for designation as Aerospace Physiology Technician; providing training in aerospace experimental psychology for Medical Service Corps officers for designation as Aerospace Experimental Psychologist; training enlisted personnel as technical assistants to medical officers, qualifying them for designation as Audiometric Technician; conducting a residency program for preparation of applications for eligibility for certification in Aerospace Medicine by the American Board of Preventive Medicine; and supporting the Naval Air Training Command in the psychological selection and physiological indoctrination and instruction of nonmedical aviation personnel in high altitude, night vision, emergency escape procedures, and other related fields.

II. Research. The Naval Aerospace Medical Institute conducts basic and applied research in aviation and space medicine and in the following scientific fields: cardiology, vestibular physiology, acoustics, audiology, biochemistry, bioengineering, biometrics, biophysics, psychology, and psychophysiology. The research laboratories are staffed with military and civilian scientific personnel, and are equipped to conduct research studies in the

following areas: Stress due to high intensity noise, stress due to acceleration and deceleration; stress due to high altitude and space travel; stress due to disorientation; standards for aviation and astronautic personnel; aviation safety and escape and rescue; training re-evaluation of aviation personnel; and human engineering.

III. Evaluation of Aeromedical Equipment. The Naval Aerospace Medical Institute conducts evaluations and acceptance testing for a variety of accoustical instruments, audiometers, audiometric booths, ear muffs, and ear plugs, and the like on behalf of the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery and the Naval Air Systems Command. These include items developed to meet the special requirements for the Navy's Hearing Conservation Program. They also include such items as the accoustical accessories and installations in full pressure suits, helmets, cockpits, etc., which contribute to the efficiency of communication and the safety of naval aviators. Similar evaluations are made on many items of oxygen equipment, training aids, and survival equipment.

IV. Physical Examination. The Naval Aerospace Medical Institute provides examining facilities to determine the physical fitness of personnel for admission to and retention in the Naval Aviation Training Program, and for determining the physical fitness for flying of other military personnel who require a complete physical examination and reporting on Standard Form 88 as directed by the Commanding Officer, Naval Aerospace Medical Center; provides professional and clerical assistance necessary to process cases referred to the Special Board of Flight Surgeons convened by the Commanding Officer of the Naval Aerospace Medical Center.

V. Special Projects. The Naval Aerospace Medical Institute cooperates with other Bureaus and agencies such as the Naval Air Systems Command and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration in carrying out assigned special projects.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES - CNO

The following Naval Aviation Activities are under the command of the Chief of Naval Operations and are not included elsewhere in this manual:

1. Naval Reconnaissance and Technical Support Center Washington, D. C.

Mission: Maintain and operate facilities to provide photographic and related sensor interpretation support to the Chief of Naval Operations; conduct research and development, and test and evaluation of photographic interpretation equipment, materials and techniques; provide intelligence production support to the operating forces of the Navy in areas that are in excess of force capabilities.

NAVAL AIR SYSTEMS COMMAND SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of Naval Aviation Activities under the command and support (exceptions noted) of the Naval Air Systems Command not included elsewhere in this manual. These activities will be maintained in operation during Fiscal Year 1969 to provide the scope and degree of services necessary to carry out current peacetime missions.

1. Naval Aerospace Recovery Facility El Centro, California

Mission: As the U. S. Navy portion of the Joint Parachute Test Facility of the Department of Defense, to conduct development, test, and evaluation of parachutes and related assemblies; human escape methods and systems; retardation and recovery systems and rescue, survival and personnel safety equipment; stabilization, retardation and recovery systems for lay-down type weapons, aircraft, missile, and capsule assemblies; special logistics aerial delivery methods, techniques and equipment.

2. Navy Motion Picture Office Hollywood, California

Mission: To maintain liaison with photographic activities and the motion picture industry in matters of interest to the Naval Air Systems Command, the Chief of Naval Operations, the U. S. Naval Photographic Center, and other offices and activities as required.

3. Naval Photographic Center Washington, D. C.

Mission: To serve as the photographic laboratory for, and provide specialized service to, the Department of the Navy and other authorized organizations.

4. Naval Air Mine Defense Development Unit Panama City, Florida

Disestablished - SECNAVNOTE 5450 ser 2052 of 25 Apr 1968.

- 26. Marine Wing Communications Squadron (MWCS) (MWHG) Provide command and administrative communications for a Marine Wing Headquarters.
- 27. Marine Training Squadron (VMT) Provide jet instrument, transitional and refresher training to selected pilots and such other training as may be required, in support of the Fleet Marine Forces.
- 28. Marine Aviation Detachment (MAD) Provide administrative support for assigned Marine Corps personnel and perform such other tasks and functions as directed by the Commandant of the Marine Corps.
- 29. Marine Helicopter Squadron One (HMX) Provide helicopter support to the Marine Corps Schools for development of helicopter tactics, techniques and equipment for the landing force operations and student demonstrations and indoctrination as directed, provide special helicopter lift support as required by the Secretary of Defense.
- 30. Marine Light Helicopter Squadron (HML) Provide helicopter Transport of supplies, equipment, and personnel for the landing force during ship-to-shore movement and within an objective area.

Commanding Officers are ordered ADDU to the Commanders in Chief for this purpose.

5. Naval Weather Service Environmental Detachment (Command - Fleet Weather Centrals/
Facilities) (Support - COMNAVWEASERVCOM)

Mission: To provide, as required and within designated local area of responsibility, meteorological and oceanographic services to military activities, staffs, units, and all transient at host stations.

Naval Weather Service Environmental Detachments (NWSED), under Officers in Charge are established by the Commander, Naval Weather Service Command as subordinate units of Fleet Weather Centrals/Facilities. They normally are located at Naval Stations and Naval Air Stations to provide environmental support to units and activities within the immediate geographic areas. NWSEs utilize the products of Fleet Weather Centrals/Facilities, and locally available data collections, to provide specifically oriented support services. Officers in Charge are ordered ADDU to appropriate local commanders.

The NWSED Asheville, assigned directly under the Commander, Naval Weather Service Command, is located at the National Weather Records Center (NWRC) Asheville, North Carolina. Its unique mission is to manage Navy climatological efforts at the NWRC, the coordination of those efforts with the Air Force and ESSA in utilizing the joint computer facility and data files at that location, the quality control of Navy meteorological records, and the routine forwarding of reports of observational discrepancies to the activities concerned for training purposes.

GROUND CONTROLLED APPROACH (GCA) AND RADAR AIR

TRAFFIC CONTROL CENTER (RATCC)

Ground Controlled Approach (GCA) - A mobile radar approach facility consisting of an air surveillance radar, precision approach radar, communication and other related components necessary to provide radar air traffic control services at the airfield to which assigned. The GCA facility is manned by air control and maintenance personnel and designated as a numerical unit for identification purposes. The functional responsibility of the GCA unit is the control of air traffic arriving and departing from the airfield and to assist pilots in their low approach for landing during weather conditions of low visibility and ceiling. At certain locations, the air traffic controller positions may be remoted into a central control room.

Radar Air Traffic Control Center (RATCC) - A radar approach facility consisting of a fixed air surveillance radar, a mobile precision approach radar, fixed communication equipment and other related components necessary to provide terminal air traffic control services at the airfield to which assigned. The RATCC is manned by air control and maintenance personnel, and although primarily a fixed installation, it is designated as a numerical unit for identification purposes. The mission of a RATCC is to provide, on a continuous basis, the safe, orderly, and expeditious movement of air traffic; within the facility's area of control, to and from operating areas, into and from the Federal Airways System, and to assist pilots in their low approach for landing during weather conditions of low visibility and ceiling. The air traffic controller positions are remoted into a central control room located normally in the operations building.
