Aviation World's Fair Coming

The Aviation World's Fair is scheduled for 7-27 April 2003 in Newport News, Va. In conjunction with the U.S. Centennial of Flight Commission, the event promotes the 100th anniversary of controlled powered flight—the birth of the aerospace industry—and commemorates the historic first flight by the Wright brothers at Kitty Hawk, N.C., in 1903.

The fair will open with 5 days of professional/trade activity, followed by 16 days of public celebration. It includes national pavilions where countries from around the world will exhibit their aviation achievements and future goals; thematic exhibits focusing on the functional areas of the aviation industry; and specialized displays in which groups, associations and clubs will celebrate their involvement in aviation. Dozens of aircraft will be parked on the ground, while others fly overhead. Plans include saluting women in aviation, ballooning, business aviation, ultralites, NASA, military and commercial aviation, the National Aviation Hall of Fame, and many more.

The instruction governing insignia approval, OPNAVINST 5030.4F, has been updated and is posted on the CNO's Navy Directives website at <http://neds.nebt.daps.mil/directives/table20.html>.

Mail to the Washington, D.C., area is significantly delayed, and irradiation often results in damage to hard copies of photographs and floppy disks. Therefore, requests will be accepted via email at aviationhistory@nhc.navy.mil.

Electronic submissions must include:

- Cover letter requesting approval of the insignia, forwarded through the appropriate chain of command
- Electronic version of the insignia (jpeg or tiff format, 300 dpi)
