2. James H. Martin, Acting Sailing Master USN, entered the Chesapeake Bay flotilla on 5 July 1814 and was discharged 15 April, 1815. Commodore Joshua Barney in a 29 August 1814 letter to Secretary of the Navy William Jones states Sailing Master was wounded in action on 24 August 1814 at Bladensburg MD.

3. Jonathan Graves, Corporal USMC enlisted 5 Aug 1800

4. Samuel Miller, 1775 -1855 Captain USMC. Miller was promoted to first lieutenant on 7 March 1809 and captain on 18 June 1814. He was brevetted a major for his service at the Battle of Bladensburg on 24 August 1814.

5. William Gregory, Private USMC enlisted 25 Sept. 1812.

6. Possibly Aisha Osborn, Drum Major USMC Enlisted Aug. 1804
