HISTORY OF THE 81ST N.C.B.

The 81st N.C.B. was commissioned on February 13, 1943 at Camp Peary, Williamsburg, Va., under the command of Commander William P. Greenawalt, (CMC) USNR. The Battalion was transferred from Camp Peary to NCTC Davisville, R.I.. The first section of the Battalion left A.B.D. for England on 20 August 1945 and the second section on 4 September 1945. While in England, the Battalion was engaged on construction work as listed below.

Milford Haven, Pembroke, Walec - Construction of 900 men hut camp and 200 bed hospital unit, and improvement of water-front facilities. Work done by 350 men in 4 months.

Ponarth, Olamorgan, Walec - Construction of hut camp for 170 men including the renovation of 11 residences, improvement of water-front facilities, and the construction of a 50 bed hospital unit. Work done by 300 men in two and one half months.

Eowey, Cornwall, England - Construction of USNAATSB, a 1000 man hut camp, a 500 man hut camp, a 150 bed hospital unit, shops and other facilities. Work done by 125 men in 4 months.

Falmouth, Comwall, England - Completion of USNAAB, involving erection of two 750 men hut camp, a 1000 man tent city, renovation of St. Michael's hospital, and miscellaneous structures. Work done by 100 men in 5 months.

St. Nawes, Cornwall, England - Construction of USNAATSB, involving erection of 264 man camp and the renovation of 12 hotels. Work done by 30 men in 5 months.

Bicester, Oxfordshire, England - Construction of radio receiving and transmitting facilities. 47 steel towers were erected in the first 26 days. Work done by 30 men in two and one half months.

Salcombe, Devon, England - Construction of USNAAB, involving a 1200 man camp. Work done by 100 men in 4 months.

Bandridge Park, Dartmouth, Devon, England - Completion of USNAAB, involving an 800 man hut camp, renovation of hotels and construction of a 95'x175' hangar store house. Work done by 220 men in 3 months.

Newton Abbott, Heathfield, Devon, England - Construction of a temporary tent camp. Job completed by 29th CB. Work done by 70 men in one month.

Plymouth, Devon, England - Construction of additional naval facilities including 60 - 20x48 huts, two 40x100 and two 95x195 hangars. Work done by 130 men in a month and a half.

London, England - Construction of St. Christopher's School to a U.S. Naval Dispensary. Work done by 50 men in one month.

This battalion participated in the invasion of Normandy arriving with rhino barges and tugs at Utah Beachhead. On D-Day, June 6, 1944 some barges succeeded in unloading their cargo on that day. One barge suffered a direct hit from a German bomber resulting in 12 casualties. Marvin A. Krull, Slc, subsequently died of wounds. Barge crews were subject to intermittent shell fire and frequent strafing but no further casualties were suffered. It was estimated that from D-Day until D-7, 12,000 vehicles or 36% of all vehicles landed were brought ashore on rhinos. The battalion participated in salvage work made necessary by the havoc wrought by the storm of June 19th. Operation of Rhino barges and their repair was conducted from D-Day until about October 7, 1944.

On D plus 4, a headquarters construction group arrived at Utah Beach and commenced construction of a bivouac area adequate for 1500 men. A headquarters operations group arrived at Omaha Beach on D-3 and joined the headquarters construction group in their activities. A1000 man camp was erected and winterized, and alterations were made on the Chateau de Prunay in Paris.

Until July 21, a pontoon assembly detachment remained at Falmouth for the purpose of assembling and fitting out rhino barges and tugs.

Upon completion of work in the E.T.O., the Battalion returned to the United States, the first section arriving in the states on 20 October 1944 and the second section on 4 November 1944. After rehabilitation leave, the Battalion reassembled at NCTC Davisville and was reorganized to fit the new complement for a pontoon battalion. On 1 January 1945, Commander L.C. Coxe, (CEC) USN relieved Commander W.P. Greenawalt as Officer-in-Charge. On 22 January 1945, the battalion embarked on the APA 102 (U.S.S. Riverside) at A.B.D. Davisville. The trip to Hawaii took 25 days which included a one-day stop in Balboa, C.Z..

In Hawaii intensive training was given all hands for the part the battalion was to play in the invasion of Okinawa. Men were assigned to the pontoon yard operated by the 302nd N.C.B. for training in the assembly and operation of barges. Intensive instruction in rifle range, sanitation, barge operation in surf, gas defense, A.A. fire, bivouac and all day hike under full pack, scramble net, first aid, signaling and many other subjects were given. Outfitting of the Battalion was also completed in Hawaii. On 28 March, the Battalion embarked on the APA 191 (U.S.S. Pondora) for Okinawa. Enroute to Okinawa, a seven day stop was made at Eniwetok and a six day stop at Ulithi. Assault landings from LCVP's and LCH's were practiced at these places and recreation parties were sent ashore whenever possible. On 22 April, the advance on Okinawa was started and the Battalion arrived at Okinawa on 26 April. Disembarkment was delayed until 3 May when the Battalion landed on Awase peninsula in Buckner Bay (Nakagusuku Wan). The battalion made camp on Awase and sent a detachment on 10 May to relieve the 70th and 128th

Battalions on the west coast of Okinawa. An additional detail of one officer and 35 men was sent to operate barges at Io Shim. From 10 May to 11 June, the 81st Battalion operated all barges on Okinawa as well as constructing barges, repair facilities, camps etc. On 11 June the 28th Battalion relieved the 81st of all work on the west coast of Okinawa. Operations on the east coast (Buckner Bay) expanded rapidly. In July, the battalion brought ashore 78,000 weight tens of cargo and were commended by Cinevac via Joint Freight Handling Facilities for their part in getting cargo ashore. One officer and seven men on a 4x12 barge were towed 40 miles behind a fleet tug to assist in the invasion of Aguni Shima. The battalion also constructed a 400 man camp for the Joint Freight Handling Facilities. On 3 August, the Battalion reported to ComPhibsPac, for operational control and the 5th N.C. Brigade for administrative control. On 8 August, 771 men and 40 officers left Okinawa on the U.S.B. Niagara for Guam to stage for the invasion of Japan. This detachment arrived in Guam on 15 August 1945, the day hostilities with Japan ceased. In Guam, the Battalion worked on construction jobs for AdComPhibePac and also in the pontoon yard. The remainder of the battalion in Okinawa was brought to Guam and on 10 October, 1945 in compliance with ConServPac's directives, the 81st Battalion was inactivated.

INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE BATTALION IN THE PACIFIC

- 1. The trip from Panama to Pearl to Okinawa and back required 67 days aboard ship of which 53 days were at sea harbor.
 - 2. A total of 99 officers have attached to the Battalion during its existence.
- 3. The battalion was shelled while aboard ship anchored off Okinawa, was just missed by a Kamikaze plane, was aboard ship anchored next to two ships that were hit by suicide boats (one ship sunk) went through 103 recorded air alerts; its barge crews narrowly escaped suicide planes and friendly fire, yet not one man was killed or died from any cause whatever during the entire Pacific Campaign.
- 4. The average age of the men in the battalion was 24 1/2 years, the oldest 50 years, the youngest 17 years.
 - 5. The bulk of men were easterners with 57.3% coming from the Northeast section of the country.
 - 6. The Battalion was formed from men of every state and Canada except Nevada and Utah.
- 7. The average man of the Battalion was born on or about Nov. 15, 1920 in the neighborhood of New York City and was now rated a third class petty officer.
- 8. The Battalion was noted for its camp on Awase and for good food. Army and Marines came from 10 miles away to attend movies at the "Globetrotter" Theater at Camp Awase.
- In addition to barges, the repair barges, known as floating palaces, repaired LCM's, LCVP's,
 Picket Boats, LCT's and LSM's.
- 10. The 81st softball team made history in Pearl, Eniwetok and Okinawa, never losing a game at the two former places.

11. One barge was alongside a liberty ship when it was struck by a suicide plane. Three weeks later the same barge was alongside an LST when it was struck by another suicide plane. The barge crew continued right along with their work, but kept an anxious eye on the sky.

 Camp Peary at Williamsburg, Virginia.

 - 3 Jun. 1943 The 81st Battalion was transferred to the Naval Advance Base Depot at Davisville, R.I.
 - 5 July 1943 The Battalion was split into two sections.
- 19 Aug. 1943 The 1st section consisting of 16 officers and 516 men departed from the Naval Advance Base Depot at Davisyille.
- 20 Aug, 1943 The Lot section left the United States.
- 26 Aug, 1943 The 1st section arrived at Rosneath, Scotland.
- 4 Sept. 1943 The 2nd section, consisting of 16 officers and 523 men, departed from the Naval Advance Base Depot at Davisville.
- 5 Sept 1943 The 2nd section departed from the United States.
- 23 Sept 1943 The 2nd section arrived at Rosneath, Scotland.
- 5 Oct, 1943 The later sections were reunited under orders of the Commander in Chief of the 13th Naval Construction Regiment. This was confirmed by orders of the Bureau of Personnel which were dated 20 November, 1943.
 - Oct, 1943 During this month the Battalion operated at Rosneath which was its headquarters, Milford Haven and Penarth, Wales, as well as Fowey, England.
 - Nov. 1943 The Battalion continued to operate at Rosneath, Milford Haven, Penarth and Fowey and began operations at Bicester, Falmouth, Salcombe, St. Mawes, and Dartmouth.

Dec. 1943 Headquarters was moved to Penarth and the Battalion continued to operate at Milford Haven, Fowey,

Bicester, Falmouth, Salcombe, St. Mawes, and Dartmouth.

Jan, 1944 The Battalion continued to operate at Penarth, which remained its headquarters and also Milford Haven,
Fowey, Bicester, Falmouth, Salcombe, St. Mawes, and
Dartmouth.

Battalion headquarters was moved to Dartmouth and the 81st continued to operate at Penarth, Milford Haven, Fowey, Falmouth, Salcombe, and St. Mawes.

Mar. 1944 The Battalion, with headquarters at Dartmouth continued to operate at Dartmouth, Penarth, Milford Haven, Fowey, Falmouth, Salcombe, and St. Mawes and began operations in Newton Abbot and Plymouth.

Apr. 1944 The Battalion operated at Penarth, Milford Haven,
Fowey, Falmouth, Salcombe, St. Mawes, Dartmouth,
Newton Abbot, Plymouth and London. Headquarters was
moved to Falmouth. During this month the detachments

- 17 Oct 1944 The second echelon consisting of 12 officers and 539 men departed from France.
- 18 Octa 1944 The second echelon arrived at Teignmouth, Devon.
- 19 Octx 1944 The first echelon left the United Kingdom enroute to the United States.
- 27 Octy 1944 The second echelon left the United Kingdom for the United States.
- 28 Oct 1944 The first echelon arrived in the United States.
- 29. Cct, 1944 The first echelon arrived at the Naval Construction Training Center at Davisville, Rhode Island.
- 9 Nov. 1944 The second echelon arrived in the United States.
- 10 Nov. 1944 The second echelon arrived at the Naval Construction Training Center at Davisville.

SECOND TOUR OF DUTY

- 22 Jan. 1945 The 81st Battalion left the Naval Construction Training Center for an overseas assignment.
- 30 Jan, 1945 The Battalion passed through the Panama Canal.
- 15 Feb. 1945 The Battalion arrived at Pearl Harbor.
- 17 Mar. 1945 A detachment of 3 officers and 68 men arrived at Guam.

- 28 Mar, 1945 The Battalion boarded a ship enroute to Okinawa.
- The ship containing the 81st Battalion dropped anchor at Eniwetok where the battalion was given practice in assault landings and recreational parties were formed.
- 11 Apr. 1945 The Battalion left Eniwetok.
- 15 Apr. 1945 The Battalion arrived at Ulithi where they were given recreational leaves and more practice in assault landings.
- 26 Apr. 1945 The Battalion's ship dropped anchor off Hagushi Beach, Okinawa.
 - 2 May 1945 The Battalion departed from Hagushi Beach.
 - 2 May 1945 The 81st Battalion arrived off Nakagusuki Wan, Okinawa.
 - 3 May 1945 The Battalion disembarked and set up camp on Awase Peninsula, Okinawa.
 - May 1945 The Battalion operated at Hagushi Beach, Kuba Saki and Nakagusuki Wan with headquarters on the Awase Peninsula.
- 17 May 1945 One officer and 35 enlisted men arrived at Ie Shima.
- 8 June 1945 A detachment of 1 officer and 7 men left Hagushi for Aguni Shima.
 - Jung 1945 The Battalion operated at Kuba Saki, Nakagusuki Wan, Ie Shima, and Aguni Shima. During the month the detachment at Hagushi Beach was relieved.
- 14 June 1945 Two hundred and fifty two men were returned from Hagushi Beach after having been relieved by the 28th Naval Construction Battalion.

- 1 July 1945 All 42 year old men, of whom there were 18, were transferred to the U.S. for release to inactive duty.
- 30 July 1945 Detachment "A", with Lieut. W.P.Larsen in command of 70 men arrived at Camp Awase from Guam.
 - 3 Aug. 1945 The Battalion reported for duty to the Commander of Amphibious Forces in the Pacific for operational control and to the 36th Naval Construction Regiment which had administrative control.
 - 4 Aug. 1945 The detail of one officer and 35 men returned to Camp

 Awase from Ie Shima where they had been serving.
 - 8 Aug 1945 Detachment "A" of the 81st Naval Construction Battalion with Comdr. Coxe in command of 40 officers and 771 men departed for Guam on the <u>USS Niagara</u>. The remaining men, under the command of Lieut. Larsen moved from Camp Awase to Baten Ko.
- 15 Aug. 1945 Hostilities with Japan cease. Detachment "A" arrived at Guam and was encamped with the 70th and the 128th Naval Construction Battalions.
- 22 Aug. 1945 Nineteen men who were eligible for release to inactive duty were sent home from Okinawa.
 - Aug. 1945 Detachment "A" worked on Guam in the Amphibious Forces

 Pontoon Assembly Yard and on the Advance Commander

 Amphibious Forces in the Pacific, Marianas Camp Area.

 The Okinawa contingent was at work constructing a camp

 at Baten Ko.

8 Sept. 1945 Condr Coxe and Condr Childs fly from Guam to Okinawa.

The Okinawa detachment of 254 men and four officers left for Guam aboard 8 Landing Ships, Men leaving one officer and seven men in Okinawa.

15 Septe 1945 Commanders Coxe and Childs return to Guam by air.

19 Sept. 1945 After a very rough trip the Okinawa detachment arrived in Guam.

The remainder of the Okinawa contingent, one officer and seven men, left for Guam aboard and APH.

The 81st Battalion is reunited as the officer and seven men arrived at Guam from Okinawa.

A party was given by the 81st Battalion for all hands of the 81st, 70th and the 128th Naval Construction Battalions and the personnel of the 36th Naval Construction Regiment.

The Battalion continued to work in the Amphibious Forces Pontoon Assembly Yard and the Advance Commader Amphibious Forces in the Pacific Marianas Camp Area. The latter job was discontinued and the Battalion began work on the Advance Commander Amphibious Forces in the Pacific Administrative Area.

Farewell ceremonies, which featured addresses by Comdr. Coxe and Chaplain Farrel, were held at the Tropicana Theatre.

By 5 October, 1945 all work in the Pontoon Assembly Yard and the Administrative Area was completed. Thiry nine men were transferred to other battalions and a total of twelve officers were either transferred for release to inactive duty or to other battalions.

10 Oct. 1945 The 81st Naval Construction Battalion was officially inactivated in compliance with the Commander of Service Forces in the Pacific letter 05466 dated 1 October 1945 and the 5th Naval Construction Brigade letter, serial number 011723 dated 10 October, 1945. All equipment and material was disposed of and personnel was either transferred for release to inactive duty or to other Sea Ree units. This Battalion had been designated to participate in the assault phases of A both of the operations, "Olympic" and "Coronet." The mineral of joya
